AT the Court at Weymouth, the 15th of September, 1795,

PRESENT, The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. 7HEREAS the Countries belonging to the United Provinces have, for fome Time paft, been, and still continue, in the Possession of the Armies of France, and under the immediate Influence and Direction of the Perfons who exercise the Powers of Government in France: And whereas divers injurious Proceedings have lately been had in the faid United Provinces, in Derogation of the Honour of His Majesty's Crown, and the just Rights of His Subjects ; and Ships of War, fitted out from the Ports of the faid United Provinces, have received Orders to take and destroy all British Vessels, and some British Vessels have been actually fo taken :--His Majelty, therefore, being determined to take fuch Measures as are necessary for vindicating the Honour of His Crown, and for procuring Reparation and Satisfaction, is pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that General Reprizals be granted against the Ships, Goods and Subjects of the United Provinces, fo that as well His Majefty's Fleet and Ships, as also all other Ships and Veffels that shall be commissionated by Letters of Marque or General Reprizals, or otherwife; by His Majefty's Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, shall and may lawfully feize all Ships,

Veffels and Goods belonging to the United Provinces, or their Subjects, or others inhabiting within any of the Territories of the aforefaid United Provinces, and bring the fame to Judgment in any of the Courts of Admiralty within His Majefty's Dominions : And to that End His Majefty's Advocate General, with the Advocate of the Admiralty, are forthwith to prepare the Draught of a Commission, and prefent the fame to His Majesty at this Board, authorizing the Commillioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral, or any Perfon or Perfons by them empowered and appointed, to iffus forth and grant Letters of Marque and Reprizal to any of His Majesty's Subjects, or others, whom the faid Commissioners shall deem fitly qualified in that Behalf, for the apprehending, feizing and taking the Ships, Veffels and Goods belonging to the United Provinces, and their Vaffals and Subjects, or any inhabiting within the Countries, Territories or Dominions of the aforefaid United Provinces; and that fuch Powers and Claufes be inferted in the faid Commiffion as have been ufual, and are according to former Precedents. And His Majesty's faid Advocate General, with the Advocate of the Admiralty, are also forthwith to prepare the Draught of a Commission, and present the fame to His Majelty at this Board, authorizing the faid Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral to will and require the High Court of Admiralty of Great Briand the Lieutenant and Judge of the faid Court, his Sarrogate



Surrogate or Surrogates, as also the feveral Cou of Admiralty within His Majesty's Dominions, to take Cognizance of, and judicially proceed upon .... and all Manner of Captures, Seizures, Prizes and Reprizals of all Ships and Goods that are or fhalt be taken, and to hear and determine the fame ; and, according to the Courfe of Admiraly, and the Laws of Nations, to adjudge and condemn all fuch Ships, Veffels and Goods as shall belong to the United Provinces, or their Vaffals and Subjects, or to any others inhabiting within any of the Countries, Territories and Dominions of the aforefaid United Provinces; and that fuch Powers and Claufes be inferted in the faid Commission as have been usual, and are according to former Precedents : And they are likewife to prepare, and lay before His Majefty at this Board, a Draught of fuch Instructions as may be proper to be fent to the Courts of Admiralty in His Majefty's Foreign Gevernments and Plantations, for their Guidance herein; as also another Draught of Instructions for fuch Ships as shall be commissionated for the Purpofes aforementioned.
