When I fish made the Enemy's Force to be of ; fuch Linguitude as to leave no Hopes of faving the Convoy, I miperiod thom by Signal, and I believe many efc. ed; at least Fifuen Sait I am fure cia. For further Particulars I must refer their Lordinips to Capt .: Turner, the Bearer of these Disputches, who, wan Captain Haggert of the Lutine, I must bog Lawe to recommend to takir Lordinipa as very diferring Officers.

Had the Enemy come to close Action with the Bedford and myself, I am well affared every Effort would have been used by Captain Montgomery, his Officers and Ship's Company, and more fully fo from the handforne Support he gave me while the Firing continued, for His Majesty's Service and our

muta I Support.

My Onicers and Ship's Company behaved with that Coolnel's that generally attends British Scamen in fuch Cases, and I am fare would have fought the Snip to the 1ast Moment, had the Enemy come up. I flatter myssif every Thing was done, first to save the Convoy, and afterwards His Majesty's Ships; and I hope and trust my Conduct in this unfortunate Badaefs will meet His Majesty's and their Lordships Approbation.
