

Whitehall, October 6, 1795.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that in the Night of the 3d, or early in the Morning of the 4th of August last the Custom-House at Shoreham in the County of Sussex, was feloniously broke open by some evil-disposed Person or Persons unknown, who rammaged the Desks of the Collector, and various other Officers belonging to the said Custom-House, and feloniously took and carried away out of the Desk of the said Collector the Sum of 40l.

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in this Felony and Robbery said, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one or more of the said Offenders, who shall discover his or their Accomplice or Accomplices, so that any one or more of them may be apprehended and convicted of the said Offence.
