in Our City of Westminster, proceeded to commit certain daring and highly criminal Outrages, in grofs Violation of the Publick Peace, to the actual Danger of Our Royal Perfon, and to the Interruption of Our Passage to and from Our Parliament; We, therefore, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, in purfuance of an Address from Our Two Houfes of Parliament, do hereby enjoin all Magiftrates, and all other Our loving Subjects, to use their utmost Endeavours to discover and cause to be apprehended the Authors, Actors and Abettors concerned in fuch Outrages, in order that they may be dealt with according to Law : And We do hereby promife, That any Perfon or Perfons, other than those actually concerned in doing any Act by which Our Royal Person was immediately endangered, who shall give Information, so as that any of the Authors, Actors or Abettors concerned in fuch Outrages as aforefaid, may be apprehended and brought to Juffice, shall receive a Reward of ONE THOUSAND POUNDS, to be paid on Conviction of every fuch Offender; which faid Sum of ONE THOUSAND POUNDS the Lords Commiffioners of Our Treafury are hereby required and directed to pay accordingly. And We do further, promise, that any Person or Persons concerned in fuch Outrages as aforefaid, other than fuch as were actually concerned in any Act by which Our Royal Perion was immediately end ngered, who fhail give Information

Information, fo as that any of fuch Authors, Actors or Abettors as aforefaid shall be apprehended and brought to Justice, shall, upon Conviction of such Offender or Offenders, receive Our most gracious Pardon.

#### Westminster, October 29.

HIS Da, His Majefty came to the Houfe of Peers, and being in His Royal Robes, feated on the Throne with the ufual Solemnity, Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Ufher of the Black Rod, was fent with a Meffage from His Majefty to the Houfe of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the Houfe of Peers. The Commons being come thither accordingly, His Majefty was pleafed to make the following moft Gracious Speech :

#### My Lords, and Gentlemen,

**I**<sup>T</sup> is a great Satisfaction to Me to reflect, that, notwithflanding many Events unfavourable to the common Caufe, the Profpect refulting from the general Situation of Affairs has, in many important Refpects, been materially improved in the Courfe of the prefent Year.

In Italy, the threatened Invalion of the French has been prevented, and they have been driven back from a confiderable Part of the Line of Coaft which they had occupied: There is alfo Reafon to hope that the recent Operations of the Auftrian Army have checked the Progress which they had made on the Side of Germany, and frustrated the offensive Projects which they were purfuing in that Quarter.

The Succeffes which have attended their military Operations in other Parts of the Campaign, and the Advantages which they have derived from the Conclusion of separate Treaties with some of the Powers who were engaged in the War, are far from compenfating the Evils which they experience from its Continuance. The Destruction of their Commerce, the Diminution of their maritime Power, and the unparalleled Embarrafiment and Diffrefs of their internal Situation, have produced the Impression which was naturally to be expected; and a general Senfe appears to prevail throughout France, that the only Relief from the increasing Preffere of these Difficulties must arife from the Restoration of Peace, and the Establishment of some settled System of Government.

The Distraction and Anarchy, which have fo long prevailed in that Country, have led to a Crifis, of which it is as yet impossible to forefee the IsTae; but which muft, in all human Probability, produce Confequences highly important to the Intereffs of Europe. Should this Crifis terminate in any Order of Things compatible wit the Tranquillity of other Countries, and affording a reafonable Expectation of Security and Permanence in any Treaty which might be concluded, the Appearance of a Difpolition to negotiate for general Peace, on just and fuitable Terms, will not fail to be met, on My Part, with an earneft Defire to give it the fulleft and speedicst Effect. But I am perfuaded you will agree with Me, that nothing is fo likely to enfure and accelerate this defireable End, as to fhew that We are prepared for either Alternative, and are determined to profecute the War with the utmost Energy and Vigour, until We have the Means of concluding, in Conjunction with Our Allies, fuch a Peace as the Juffice of Our Caufe and the Situation of the Enemy may entitle Us to expect.

With this View I am continuing to make the greatest Exertions for maintaining and improving our Naval Superiority, and for carrying on active and vigorous Operations in the Weft Indies, in order to fecure and extend the Advantages which We have gained in that Quarter, and which are fo nearly connected with Our commercial Refources and maritime Strength.

I rely with full Confidence on the Continuance of your firm and zealous Support, on the uniform Bravery of My Fleets and Armies, and on the Fortitude, Perfeverance, and Publick Spirit of all Ranks of My People.

The Acts of Hostility committed by the United Provinces, under the Influence and Control of France, have obliged Me to treat them as in a State of War with this Country.

The Fleet which I have employed in the North Seas has received the most cordial and active Affistance from the Naval Force furnished by the Empress of Russia, and has been enabled effectually to check the Operations of the Enemy in that Quarter.

I have concluded Engagements of Defensive Alliance with the Two Imperial Courts; and the Ratifications of the Treaty of Commerce with the United States of America, which I announced to you laft Year, have now been exchanged.—I have directed Copies of these Treaties to be laid before you.

#### Gentlemen of the House of Commons,

It is Matter of deep Concern to Me, that the Exigencies of the Publick Service will require further Additions Additions to the heavy Burthens which have been unavoidably imposed on My People.—I trust that their Pressure will, in some Degree, be alleviated by the flourishing State of Our Commerce and Manufactures, and that Our Expences, though necessfarily great in their Amount, will, under the actual Cirquantances of the War, admit of considerable Diminution in Comparison with those of the present Year.

#### My Lords, and Gentlemen,

I have observed for some Time past, with the greatest Anxiety, the very high Price of Grain, and that Anxiety is increased by the Apprehension that the Produce of the Wheat Harvest in the present Year may not have been fuch as effectually to relieve My People from the Difficulties with which they have had to contend. The Spirit of Order and Submission to the Laws, which, with very few Exceptions, has manifested itself under this fevere Pressure, will, I am fure, be felt by you as an additional Incentive to apply yourfelves, with the utmost Diligence, to the Confideration of fuch Meafures as may tend to alleviate the prefent Diffrefs, and to prevent, as far as possible, the Renewal of of fimilar Embarrasiments in future. Nothing has been omitted on My Part that appeared likely to contribute to this End; and you may be affured of My hearty Concurrence in whatever Regulations the Wildom of Parliament may adopt, on a Subject fo peculiarly interesting to My People, whose Welfare will ever be the Object nearest My Heart.

#### Downing-Street, October 28.

The Ratifications of the Treaty of Amity, Commerce, and Navigation, between His Majefly and the United States of America, figned the 19th of November laft, were this Day exchanged by Lord Grenville, His Majefly's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, with William Allen Dias, Efq; Chargé d'Affaires from the United States.

#### Herfe-Guards, October 31.

A Difpatch, of which the following is an Extract, has been received by the Right Honorable Henry Dundas, one of His Majefty's Principal Secretaries of State, from Vice-Admiral the Honorable Sir G. K. Elphinftone, K. B. dated on Board His Majefty's Ship Monarch, Simon's Bay, Cape of Good Hope, August 18, 1795.

I HAD the Honor of informing you, in a former Difpatch, that the Dutch were entrenched in a ftrong Polition at Muyfenbergh, and well furnished with Cannon, having a fleep Mountain on their Right and the Sea on the Left, difficult of Approach on Account of shallow Water, with high Surf on the Shore, but which the absolute Necessity of the Post rendered it requisite that we should possels, and made it obvious to Major-General Craig and myfelf that it ought to be attempted.

For this Service I fecretly prepared a Gun-Boat, and armed the Launches of the Fleet with heavy Cannonades, landed Two Battalions of Seamen, about One Thousand, under the Command of Captaina Hardy of the Echo, and Spranger of the Rattlefnake, and ient Ships frequently around the Bay, to prevent Suspicion of an Attack, when any favourable Opportunity might offer.

On the 7th Inflant a light Breeze fprung up f. om the North-Weft, and at Twelve o'Clock the preconcerted Signal was made; when Major-General Craig, with his accultomed Readinefs and Activity, inflantly put the Forces on Shore in Motion, and, at the fame Moment, Commodore Blankert, equally zealous, in the America, with the Stately, Echo and Rattlefnake, got under Weigh, whilft the Gun-Boat and armed Launches preceded the March of the Troops about Five Hundred Yards, to prevent their being interrupted.

About One o'Clock the Ships, being abreaft of an advanced Poit of Two Guns, fired a few Shot, which induced those in Charge to depart; and, on approaching a fecond Post of One Gun and a Royal Mortar or Howitzer, the Effect was the fame. On proceeding off the Camp the Confusion was inflantly manifest, although the Distance from the Ships was greater than could have been wished, but the Shallowness prevented a nearer Approach.

The Echo led, commanded by Lieutenant Tod of the Monarch, and anchored in Two and a Half Fathoms, followed by the America, which anchored in Four and a Half, then the Stately and Rattlefnake, anchoring nearer, in Proportion to their leffer Draughts of Water, off the Enemy's Works, which began to fire, and the Fire was returned by the Sloops; but an Increase of Wind prevented the large Ships from acting until they had carried out heavy Anchors. This Duty was performed by the Commanders with. great Coolnels, much to their own Honour and their Country's Credit.

In a few Minutes after the Fire opened, which obliged the Dutch to abandon their Camp with the utmost Precipitation, taking with them only Two Field-Pieces, and at Four o'Clock the Major-General took Possessing March over heavy fandy Ground. To him I beg Leave to refer for the Particulars of what was taken therein, as the Sea ran fo high that no Person from the Ships or Gun Boats could venture to land.

In transmitting to you the Proceedings of the Fleet under my Command, I shall at all Times feel great Satisfaction in doing Justice to the Merits of the feveral Officers. To their Judgment and good Conduct in the present Instance is to be attirbuted the immediate Success which attended the Attempt; it is therefore my Duty to recommend to His Majesty's Notice Commodore Blankett, Captain Douglas, Lieutenant Tod of the Monarch, commanding the Echo, and Lieutenant Ramage, also of the Monarch, commanding the Rattlessake, and Mr. Chartes Adam, of the Monarch, Midthipman, who commanded the Gun-Boat. I am fensibly obliged to them, each individually, for their steady and correct Discharge of my Orders.

Service. The America had Two Men killed and Four wounded, and One Gun difabled, being ftruck by a Shot ; the Stately One Man wounded. Some Shots paffed through the Ships, but did not materially injure them.

I am fearful the Major-General will not be able to write by this Conveyance, a Genoefe Ship, which intends touching at St. Helena, as he is now at Muyfenberg.
