W HEREAS on the Twenty-ninth Day of this instant Month of October, divers Persons, ristously assumbled and stationed in different Places

certain during and highly criminal Outrages, in groß Violation of the Publick Peace, to the actual Danger of Our Royal Person, and to the Interruption of Our Passage to and from Our Parliaments We, therefore, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, in pursuance of an Address from Our Two Honfes of Parliament, do hereby enjoin all Magistrates, and all other Our loving Subjects, to use their utmost Endeavours to discover and cause to be apprehended the Authors, Actors and Abettors concorned in fuch Outrages, in order that they may be dealt with according to Law: And We do hereby promife, That any Person or Persons, other than those adjeally concerned in doing any Act by which Our Royal Person was immediately endangered, who shall give Information, so as that any of the Authors, Actors or Abettors concerned in fuch Outrages as aforcifaid, may be apprehended and brought to Justice, shall receive a Reward of ONE THOUSAND POUNDS, to be paid on Conviction of every such Offender; which faid Sum of ONE THOUSAND POUNDS the Lords Commissioners of Our Treasury are hereby required and directed to pay accordingly. And We do further promife, that any Person or Persons concerned in fuch Outrages as aforefaid, other than fuch as were actually concered in any Act by which Our Royal Person was immediately endangered, who shall give-Information



Information, so as that any of such Authors, Actors or Abertors as aforesaid shall be apprehended and brought to Justice, shall, upon Conviction of such Ossender or Ossenders, receive Our most gracious Parlon.

GEORGER.

THEREAS it hath been represented to Us, That, immediately before the Opening of the prefent Seffion of Parliament, a great Number of Persons were collected in Fieldsein the Neighbourhood of the Metropolis, by Advertisements and Hand-Bills, and that divers inflammatory Discourses were delivered to the Perfons to collected, and divers Proceedings were had, tending to create groundless Jealoufy and Difcontent, and to endanger the Publick Peace, and the Quiet and Safety of Our faithtul Subjects: And whereas it bath been also reprefented to Us, That divers feditions and treafonable Papers have been lately distributed, tending to excite evil-disposed Persons to Acts endangering Our Royal Person: And whereas such Proceedings have been followed, on the Day on which the prefent Session of Parliament commenced, by Acts of Tumult and Violence, and by daring and highly criminal Outrages, in direct Violation of the Publick Peace, to the immediate Danger of Our Royal Perfon, and to the Interruption of Our Passage to and From Our Parljament: And whereas great Uncasimefs and Auxiety bath been produced in the Minds of Our faithful Subjects, by Rumours and Apprehensions that seditions and unlawful Assemblies are intended to be held by evil-disposed Persons, and that fuch other criminal Practices as aforefaid are insended to be repeated: We, therefore, have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to enjoin and require, and We do hereby enjoin and require all Justices of the Peace, Sheriffs, Mayors, Bailliffs, Confiables, and all other Our loving Subjects throughout Our Kingdom, to use the utmost Diligence to discourage, prevent, and suppress all feditious and unlawful Affemblies: And We do specially enjoin and command all Our loving Subjects, who shall have Cause to suspect that any such Astemblies are intended to be held in any Part of Our Kingdom, to give the earliest Information thereof to

the Magistrates of the several Districts within which it shall be suspected that the same are intended to be held; and if fuch Affemblies shall, nevertheless, in any Cafe, be actually held, to be aiding and affifting, on being required thereto by the Civil Magistrate, in causing Persons delivering instammatory Discourses in such Assemblies, and other principal Actors therein, to be forthwith apprehended, in order that they may be dealt with according to Law. And We have also thought fit, by and with the Advice aforefaid, to enjoin and require, and We do hereby enjoin and require all Juffices of the Peace. Sheriffs, Mayors, Bailuffs, Constables, and all other Our loving Subjects throughout Our Kingdom, to be in like Manner aiding and affifting in bringing to Justice all Persons distributing such seditious and treasonable Papers as aforefaid.

The KING's Most Excellent Majetty in Council.

WHEREAS by His Majesty's Order in Council, bearing Date the Thirteenth of March, 1793. an Embargo was laid on all Ships or Veilels laden or to be laden in any of the Ports of Great Britain, with Salted Provisions of any Kind whatfoever, and alfo upon all Ships and Vestels laden or to be laden with Butter and Cheefe, Peafe, Beans, Rice, Hay. Straw, or Forage of any Kind whatfoever, and with Hides or Leather manufactured or unmanufactured; and it was ordered that the faid Embargo should continue and remain upon all fuch Ships and Veffels until further Order; but it was by the faid Order declared to be His Majesty's Pleasure, that the said Embargo should not extend (amongst other Things) to any Ships or Vessels, being British Ships and Vestels, navigated according to Law, which may be employed in carrying any of the faid Articles abovementioned to any Country in or out of Europe, in Amity with His Majefly: And whereas His Majefly judges it expedient to prohibit the carrying any fuch Articles of Provision as aforefuld to Countries in Amity with His Majesty, it is hereby ordered, that notwithstanding any Thing in the said Order of the Thisteenth of March, 1793, contained to the contrang, the faid Embargo shall, from and after the Publication of this Order in the London Gazette, extend to all Ships and Vellels whatfoever, laden or to be laden in any of the Ports of Great Britain with Salted Provisions of any Kind whatfoever, or with Batter, Cherfe, Hay, Straw or Porage of any Kind whatfoever, and which Ships or Vellels shall be employed in carrying any of the Articles abovementioned to any Country in or out of Europe, in Amity with His Majesty. And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appearain.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the 6th of May last, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pot-Ash or Pearl-Ash (except as in the faid Order is mentioned) will expire upon the 7th Day of this inflant November: And whereas it is judged expedient that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer; His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Person or Persons whatsoever do, at any Time, during the Space of Six Months from the 7th Day of this instant November, export, or attempt to export, transport, carry or convey, or lade or lay on Board of any Ship, Veffel or Boat, in order to be exported, transported, carried or conveyed out of this Kingdom, any Pot-Ash or Pearl-Ash, withdut Leave or Permission being first had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by 20 Act paffed in the Thirty-fourth Year of His Majesly's Reign, intituled, " An Act for indemnifying all Persons who have been concerned in adviging or carrying " into Execution an Order of the Lords Commif-" honers of His Majesty's Treasury respecting the 45 Exportation of Pot-Ashes or Pearl-Ashes; Int. " preventing Suits in consequence of the same; " for authorizing His Majelly to probibit the Ex-" portation or carrying Coastwife of Pot-Ashes or " Pearl Aftice, and for making further Provisions er relative thereto." But it is nevertheless His Majelty's Pleafare, that nothing herein contained thall extend, or be construed to extend, to prevent the Exportation of the faid Articles to Ireland, or to His Majolty's Islands of Gueraley, Jersey, Alderney, Sark or Man, or to His Majesty's Colonies or Planeations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majelly's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies; provided that, upon the Exportation of the faid Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark or Man, or to His Majefly's Colonies and Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majelty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helene, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of the faid Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the same to the Places for which they fliall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the fame shall be made, and do give full and fufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Cultoms, to carry the faid Articles to the Places for which they are so entered Optwards, and none other; and fugh Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made, to the Satisfaction of the faid Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commissioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in such Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid Commissioners, thewing that the faid Articles have been duly landed at the Places for which they were entered Outwards. And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britsin, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

W HEREAS His Majesty was graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Twenty-Exth Day of December, 1797, to promise and declare, that the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seamon, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, sit for His Majesty's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed to every such Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the Twenty-eighth Day of February then following, enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majesty's Ships or Vessels, or Ossicers employed on Shore for raising Men for the

Service of the Royal Navy : And whereas His | Majetly was also gracionsly pleased, by His said Proclamation, to declare, that all Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should so enter themselves as aforesaid, should receive the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, as His Majesty's Royal Bounty: And whereas His Majesty was also gracioully pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of the feid Month of February, 1793, to promife and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Scaman, fit to ferve on board His Majesty's Ships, should be paid to any Person who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who might conceal him or themselves, so that fuch Scaman or Scanien should be taken for His Majesty's Service, on or before the Thirtteth Day of April then next, by any of His Majesty's Sea Officers appointed to raife Men on Shore, or by the Captains or Commanders of any of His Majelly's Ships or Veffels in the Ports or on the Coatls of this Kingdom: And whereas the Time limited by the faid Proclamations for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward, hath been prolonged and extended to the Thirty first Day of this instant October; and it being judged expe dient for Highlajetty's Service that the faid Bounties and keward should be continued to be paid for fome Time longer; His Majetty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward be prolonged and extended, from the faid Thirty-fire Day of this inflant October to the Thirty-first Day of December next inclusive: Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly.
