WHereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that on the Afternoon of Saturday the 7th Instant, as John Sykes, a Soldier in the 3d Battalion of the 1st Regiment of Foot Guards, was paffing through Thames-Street in the City of London to his Quarters in the Tower, he was, without any Provocation on his Part, wiolently affaulted by Three Men, who were unknown ot him, and stabbed in his Right Leg, and cut arcoss the Calf thereof with some sharp Instrument, of which said Stab and Cut he now lies dangerously maimed and wounded; and that upon his endeavouring to seize the Man by whom he believed he was so wounded and cut, the others again offaulted him, and rescued the Person whom he had Jo feized.

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the above daring and cruel Ast of Violence and Outrage, is hereby pleased te promise His most gracious Pardon to any one or more of the faid Offenders, (except the Person who actually gave the faid Stab and Cut,) who shall discover his or beir Accomplices, so that any one or more of them may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
