THE following Address of the British Factory at Lisbon having been transmitted by the Honorable Robert Walpole, His Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary at that Court, to the Right Honorable Lord Grenville, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has been by him presented to the King; which Address His Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously.

To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty,

The humble Address of the Deputy Consul General and Factory of Lisbon.

Most Gracious Sovereign,

WE, your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Deputy Consul General, and British Merchants residing at Lisbon, have heard, with the greatest Concern, the late wicked Attempt against your Majesty's Person; and we behold, with Horror and Execration, such an Instance of Depravity in attacking the Life of a Monarch whose whole Reign has been distinguished by his Benignity and Love of his Subjects. We participate, most cordially, in the general Joy on your Majesty's providential Escape; and we beg Leave to express our Sense of the additional Lustre thrown on your Majesty's Character by the Magnanimity your Majesty displayed on such an extraordinary and trying Occasion: We shall not cease offering up your fervent Prayers to Almighty God to continue his Divine Protection to your Majesty, in whose Safety the Happiness of all Orders of your Majesty's Subjects is so materially involved.
