WE, your Majefty's moft dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Deputy Conful General, and Britifh Merchants refiding at Lifbon, have heard, with the greateft Concern, the late wicked Attempt againft your Majefty's Perfon; and we behold, with Horror and Exceration, fuch an Inftance of Depravity in attacking the Life of a Monarch whofe whole Reign has been diftinguifhed by his Benignity and Love of his Subjects. We participate, moft cordially, in the general Joy on your Majefty's providential Efcape; and we beg Leave to exprets our Senfe of the additional Luftre thrown on your Majefty's Character by the Magnanimity your Majefty difplayed on fuch an extraordinary and trying Occafion: We fhall not ceafe offering up your fervent Prayers to Almighty God to continue his Divine Protection to your Majefty, in whofe Safety the Happinefs of all Orders of your Majefty's Subjects is fo materially involved.
