PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. 7 HEREAS it has been represented to His Majesty at this Board, that the malignant and epidemic Fever, of the Nature of the Plague, which fome Time fince prevailed in the City of New York, and in the Town of Norfolk in Virginia, within the United States of America, has fubfided, and that Health is perfectly restored to the faid City of New York, and to the faid Town of Norfolk; and that the Communication between those Places and the City of Philadelphia is again opened; His Majesty, taking the same into Consideration, and being defirous to remove all Restraints upon Trade, fo far as may be confistent with the Safety of His Subjects, is pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Quarantine laid by His Majesty's Order in Council bearing Date the 14th Day of October, 1795, upon all Ships, Vessels, Perions, Goods and Merchandize arriving from the City of New York, and the Town of Norfolk in Virginia, in the United States of America, be taken off; and that all fuch Ships and Vessels be permitted to discharge their respective Ladings, without unpacking, opening and airing, and without performing any Quarantine, as freely as they might have done in case such Order of the 14th Day of October, 1795, had not been made, any Thing in the faid Order contained to the

contrary notwithstanding; provided that the Masters or other Persons having Charge of such Ships or Vestels respectively, do first make Oath before the Custom-House Officer or Chief Magistrate at the Places respectively, at which such respective Ships or Vessels have arrived, or shall arrive, that their Crews are free from all Infection: And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treafury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General of the Ordnance; His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the Isles of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, Sark and Man, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

WHERE AS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Twenty-second of July last, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Twenty-fifth Day of this instant January: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety

Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition ! should be continued for some Time longer; His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Person or Persons whosoever do at any Time, for the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid Twenty fifth Day of this inflant January, prefune to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, or ship or lade any of the Articles above mentioned on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permission being first had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act, passed in the Thirty-third Year of His Majelly's Reign, intituled, "An Act to ena-" ble His Majesty to restrain the Exportation of Na-" val Stores, and more effectually to prevent the Exor portation of Salt-Petre, Arms and Ammunition, " when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in "Council." But it is, nevertheless, His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Majelly's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Veffels or Boats, in the Service of His Majesty, or employed or freighted by His Majesty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Vessel from taking or having on Board fuch Quantities of Naval Stores as may be necessary for the Use of fuch Ship or Veffel during the Course of her intended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being; nor to the Exportation of the faid feveral Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to-His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa; or to the Island of St. Helenz, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies; provided that, upon the Exportation of any of the faid Articles, for the Purposes of Trade, to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of fuch Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the

fame to the Places for which the, shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the same shall be made, and do give full and fufficient security by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the faid Articles to the Places for which they are fo entered Outwards, and for the Purposes specified, and none other; and fuch Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up, until Proof be made, to the Satisfaction of the faid Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commiffioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in such Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid Commissioners, shewing that the faid Articles have been duly landed at the Places for which they were entered Outwards. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Twentyeighth Year of the Reign of His present Majefly, intituled, "An A& for regulating the Trade " between the Subjects of His Majesty's Colonies " and Plantations in North America and in the " West India Islands, and the Countries belonging to the United States of America, and between " His Majesty's said Subjects and the Foreign Islands " in the West Indies," it is, amongst other Things, enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty in Council, by Order or Orders to be issued and published from Time to Time, to authorize, or by Warrant or Warrants, under His Sign Manual, to impower the Governor of Newfoundland for the Time being to authorize, in case of Necessity, the Importation into Newfoundland of Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, from any of the Territories belonging to the faid United States, for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the then ensuing Season only; provided always, that fuch Bread, Floor, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, fo authorized to be imported into the Island of Newfoundland, thall not be imported except in conformity to fuch Rules, Regulations and Reffrierions as shall be specified in such Order or Orders, Warrant or Warrants, resp dively, and except by British-

His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law. And whereas it is expedient and necessary that Provision be made for fully supplying the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the ensuing Season, with Bread, Flour, Indian Corn and Live Stock; His Majesty doth thereupon, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order and declare, That, for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the enfuing Season only, Bread, Flour, Indian Corn and Live Stock be imported into the faid Island from any of the Territories belonging to the faid United States, by British Subjects, and in British-built Ships owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, and which shall, within the Space of Seven Months previous to the Time of fuch Importation, have cleared out from fome Port in Great Britain, or some other Port of His Majesty's Dominions in Europe, for which Purpose a Licence thall have been granted by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Ctistoms in England or Scotland, or the Commissioners of His Majesty's Revenue in Ireland, or any other Person or Persons who may be duly authorized in that Kingdom respectively, in the Manner and Form herein after mentioned; which Licences shall continue and be in Force for Seven Calendar Months from the Day of the Date upon which they are respectively granted, and no longer; provided that no such Licence as aforefaid, granted after the Thirtieth Day of September, One Thousand Seven Hundred and Ninety-fix, shall be of any Force or Effect: And His Majesty is hereby further pleased to order, That the Master, or Person having the Charge or Command of any Ship or Vessel to whom such Licence shall be granted, shall, upon the Arrival of the faid Ship or Veffel at the Port, Harbour or Place in the Island of Newfoundland where he shall discharge such Bread, Flour, Indian Corn or Live Stock, deliver up the faid Licence to the Collector or other proper Officer of the Customs there, having first indorfed on the Back of fuch Licence the Marks, Numbers and Contents of each Package of Bread, Flour, or Indian Corn, and the Number of Live Stock, under the Penalty of the Forfeiture in the faid Act mentioned. And the Collector or other proper Officer of the Customs at Newfoundland is hereby enjoined and required to give a Certificate to the Master, or Person having the Charge or Command of such Ship or Veffel, of his having received the faid Licence, fo indorfed as before directed, and to transmit the fame to the Commissioners of His Majesty's Cuttoms in England or Scotland, or to the Commissioners of

Now be it known that the faid [Perfon's Name] hath Licence to lade on board the faid Ship [Ship's Name], at and from any Port or Place belonging to the United States of America, Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, the Produce of the faid United States, and no other Article whatfoever, and to carry the faid Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock to fome Port or Place in the Island of Newfoundland; and on the Arrival of the faid Ship at any Port, Harbour, or Place of Discharge in Newsoundland, the Master, or Person having the Charge or Command of the faid Ship, is required and enjoined to deliver up the faid Licence to the Collector or other proper Officer of His Majesty's Customs there, and to indorse on the Back thereof the Marks, Numbers, and Contents of each Package of Bread, Flour, or Indian Corn, and the Number of Live Stock, and shall thereupon receive a Certificate thereof from the faid Collector or other proper Officer of the Customs.
