PRESENT,

The KING's Moft Excellent Majefty in Council. 7 HEREAS it has been reprefented to His Majefty at this Board, that the malignant and epidemic Fever, of the Nature of the Plague, which fome Time fince prevailed in the City of New York, and in the Town of Norfolk in Virginia, within the United States of America, has fubfided, and that Health is perfectly reftored to the faid City of New York, and to the faid Town of Norfolk; and that the Communication between those Places and the City of Philadelphia is again opened; His Majelly, taking the fame into Confideration, and being defirous to remove all Reftraints upon Trade, fo far as may be confiftent with the Safety of His Subjects, is pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Quarantine laid by His Majefty's Order in Council bearing Date the 14th Day of October, 1795, upon all Ships, Veffels, Perfons, Goods and Merchandize arriving from the City of New York, and the Town of Norfolk in Virginia, in the United States of America, be taken off; and that all fuch Ships and Veffels be permitted to discharge their refpective Ladings, without unpacking, opening and airing, and without performing any Quarantine, as freely as they might have done in cafe fuch Order of the 14th Day of October, 1795, had not been made, any Thing in the faid Order contained to the

contrary notwithftanding ; provided that the Mafters or other Perfons having Charge of fuch Ships or Veffels respectively, do first make Oath before the Cuftom-Houfe Officer or Chief Magistrate at the Places refpectively, at which fuch refpective Ships or Veffels have arrived, or shall arrive, that their Crews are free from all Infection : And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treafury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General of the Ordnance, His Majefty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the Ifles of Jerfey, Guernfey, Alderney, Sark and Man, are to give the neceffary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

Sufety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition thould be continued for fome Time longer; His Majefly doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whofoever do at any Time, for the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid Twenty fifth Day of this inflant January, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, any Pig Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Malts, Yards, Bowfprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, or thip or lade any of the Articles above mentioned on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permission being first had and obtained from His Majefty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act, paffed in the Thirty-third Year of His Majelly's Reign, intituled, "An Act to ena-" ble His Majefty to reftrain the Exportation of Na-" val Stores, and more effectually to prevent the Ex-" portation of Salt Petre, Arms and Ammunition, " when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in " Council." WHEREAS by an Act paffed in the Twentyeighth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majefty, intituled, "An Act for regulating the Trade " between the Subjects of His Majefty's Colonies " and Plantations in North America and in the " Weft India Iflands, and the Countries belonging " to the United States of America, and between " His Majefty's faid Subjects and the Foreign Iflands " in the Weft Indies," it is, amongft other Things, enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for His Majefty in Council, by Order or Orders to be iffued and published from Time to Time, to authorize, or by Warrant or Warrants, under His Sign Manual, to impower the Governor of Newfoundland for the Time being to authorize, in cafe of Neceffity, the Importation into Newfoundland of Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, from apy of the Territories belonging to the faid United States, for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the then enfuing Seafon only; provided always, that fuch Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, fo authorized to be imported into the Island of Newfoundland, shall not be imported except in conformity to fuch Rules, Regulations and Reffrictions as shall be specified in fuch Order or Orders, Warrant or Warrants, respectively, and except by Britith

British Subjects and in British-built Ships owned by His Majefly's Subjects, and navigated according to Law. And whereas it is expedient and neceffary that Provision be made for fully supplying the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Illand of Newfoundland, for the enfuing Seafon, with Bread, Flour, Indian Corn and Live Stock ; His Majelty doth thereupon, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order and declare, That, for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the enfuing Seafon only, Bread, Flour, Indian Corn and Live Stock be imported into the faid Ifland from any of the Territories belonging to the faid United States, by British Subjects, and in British-built Ships owned by His Majefly's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, and which shall, within the Space of Seven Months previous to the Time of fuch Importation, have cleared out from fome Port in Great Britain, or some other Port of His Majefty's Dominions in Europe, for which Purpose a Licence shall have been granted by the Commissioners of His Majelty's Cultoms in England or Scotland, or the Commissioners of His Majefly's Revenue in Ireland, or any other Perfon or Perfons who may be duly authorized in that Kingdom respectively, in the Manner and Form herein after mentioned ; which Licences shall continue and be in Force for Seven Calendar Months from the Day of the Date upon which they are respectively granted, and no longer; provided that no fuch Licence as aforefaid, granted after the Thirtieth Day of September, One 'Thoufand Seven Hundred and Ninety-fix, shall be of any Force or Effect : And His Majefty is hereby further pleafed to order, That the Master, or Perfon having the Charge or Command of any Ship or Veffel to whom fuch Licence shall be granted, shall, upon the Arrival of the faid Ship or Veffel at the Port, Harbour or Place in the Island of Newfoundland where he shall discharge such Bread, Flour, Indian Corn or Live Stock, deliver up the faid Licence to the Collector or other proper Officer of the Cuftoms there, having first indorfed on the Back of fuch Licence the Marks, Numbers and Contents of each Package of Bread, Flour, or Indian Corn, and the Number of Live Stock, under the Penalty of the Forfeiture in the faid Act mentioned. And the Collector or other proper Officer of the Cuftoms at Newfoundland is hereby enjoined and required to give a Certificate to the Mafter, or Perfon having the Charge or Command of fuch Ship or Veffel, of his having received the faid Licence, fo indorfed as before directed, and to transmit the fame to the Commiffioners of His Majefty's Cuftoms in England or Scotland, or to the Commissioners of
