A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R.

THEREAS on the Night of the First of this instant Month of February, some Person unknown, in Company with a few other Persons, to the Number of Twelve or thereabouts, in a Part of Covent Garden, opposite Southampton Street, in Our City of Westminster, threw a Stone, Brick, or other hard Substance, which struck with great Violence one of Our Servants, then standing behind Our Carriage, in which We, together with Our Royal Confort, were then returning from the Theatre in Drury Lane: And whereas afterwards on the fame Night, whilst We were fo returning, some Person unknown threw with great Violence into Our faid Carriage a very sharp-edged and dangerous Flint Stone, as Our faid Carriage was passing along Pall Mall, in Our faid City of Westminster, and opposite to John Street, which Stone broke one of the Glasses of Our faid Carriage, and afterwards fell in Our faid Carriage; and the Acts aforefaid were done in Violation of the Public Peace, and to the actual Danger of the Royal Perfons of Us and Our Royal Confort, and are highly criminal and traiterous: We therefore, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby enjoin all Magistrates, and all other Our loving Subjects, to use their utmost Endeavours to discover and cause to be apprehended the Persons concerned in fuch traiterous Outrages, in order that

they may be dealt with according to Law. And We hereby promife, that any Person or Persons, concerned in the faid traiterous Outrages, other than fuch Person or Persons as actually committed the faid Acts of Violence, or either of them, by which the Royal Perfons of Us and Our Royal Confort were immediately endangered, who shall give Information, fo that any other or others of the Perfons concerned therein, or offending as aforefaid, may be apprehended and brought to Justice, shall receive a Reward of ONE THOUSAND POUNDS, to be paid on Conviction of every fuch Offender; which faid Sum of ONE THOUSAND POUNDS the Lords Commissioners of Our Treasury are hereby required and directed to pay accordingly: And We do further promife, that any Person or Persons concerned in fuch traiterous Outrages as aforefaid, other than fuch as actually committed the faid Acts of Violence, or either of them, who shall give Information, fo as that any other or others of the Persons concerned therein, or offending as aforefaid, shall be apprehended and brought to Justice, shall, upon Conviction of fuch Offender or Offenders, receive Our most gracious Pardon.

'The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Twentyeighth Year of the Reign of His present Majefly, intituled, "An Act for regulating the Trade " between the Subjects of His Majesty's Colonies " and Plantations in North America and in the " West India Islands, and the Countries belonging " to the United States of America, and between " His Majesty's faid Subjects and the Foreign Islands " in the West Indies," it is, amongst other Things, enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty in Council, by Order or Orders to be issued and published from Time to Time, to authorize, or by Warrant or Warrants, under His Sign Manual, to impower the Governor of Newfoundland for the Time being to authorize, in case of Necessity, the Importation into Newfoundland of Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, from any of the Territories belonging to the faid United States, for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the then enfuing Season only; provided always, that fuch Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, fo authorized to be imported into the Island of Newfoundland, shall not be imported except in conformity to fuch Rules, Regulations and Restrictions as shall be specified in such Order or Orders, Warrant or Warrants, respectively, and except by British Subjects and in British-built Ships owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law. And whereas it is expedient and necessary that Provision be made for fully supplying the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the enfuing Seafon, with Bread, Flour, Indian Corn and Live Stock; His Majesty doth thereupon, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order and declare, That, for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the ensuing Season only, Bread, Flour, Indian Corn and Live Stock be imported into the faid Island from any of the Territories belonging to the faid United States, by British Subjects, and in British-built Ships owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, and which shall, within the Space of Seven Months previous to the Time of fuch Importation, have cleared out from some Port in Great Britain, or some other Port of His Majesty's Dominions in Europe, for which Purpose a Licence fhall have been granted by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs in England or Scotland, or

AT the Court at St. James's, the 13th of Ja- | the Commissioners of His Majesty's Revenue in Ireland, or any other Person or Persons who may be duly authorized in that Kingdom respectively, in the Manner and Form herein after mentioned; which Licences shall continue and be in Force for Seven Calendar Months from the Day of the Date upon which they are respectively granted, and no longer; provided that no fuch Licence as aforefaid, granted after the Thirtieth Day of September, One Thousand Seven Hundred and Ninety-fix, shall be of any Force or Effect: And His Majesty is hereby further pleased to order, That the Master, or Person having the Charge or Command of any Ship or Vessel to whom such Licence shall be granted, shall, upon the Arrival of the faid Ship or Veffel at the Port, Harbour or Place in the Island of Newfoundland where he shall discharge such Bread, Flour, Indian Corn or Live Stock, deliver up the faid Licence to the Collector or other proper Officer of the Customs there, having first indorfed on the Back of fuch Licence the Marks, Numbers and Contents of each Package of Bread, Flour, or Indian Corn, and the Number of Live Stock, under the Penalty of the Forfeiture in the faid Act mentioned. And the Collector or other proper Officer of the Customs at Newfoundland is hereby enjoined and required to give a Certificate to the Master, or Person having the Charge or Command of such Ship or Vessel, of his having received the said Licence, so indorfed as before directed, and to transmit the same to the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs in England or Scotland, or to the Commissioners of His Majesty's Revenue in Ireland, respectively, by whom fuch Licence was granted.
