To both We and Our People may humble Ourselves before Almighty God, in order to obtain Pardon of Our Sins, and may, in the most devout and folemn Manner, fend up Our Prayers and Supplications to the Divine Majesty, for averting those heavy Judgments which Our manifold Sins and Provocations have most justly deserved, and imploring His Blessing and Affiftance on Our Arms, and for restoring and perpetuating Peace, Safety and Prosperity to Us and Our Kingdoms: And We do strictly charge and command, that the faid Publick Fast be reverently and devoutly observed by all Our loving Subjects in Scotland, as they tender the Favour of Almighty God, and would avoid His Wrath and Indignation. and upon Pain of fuch Punishment as We may justly inflict on all such as contemn and neglect the Performance of fo religious and necessary a Duty: Our Will is therefore, and We charge, that this Our Proclamation feen, ye forthwith pass to the Market Cross of Edinburgh, and all other Places needful, and there, in Our Name and Authority, make Publication hereof, that none pretend Ignorance: And Our Will and Pleasure is, That Our Solicitor do cause printed Copies hereof to be sent to the Sheriffs of the feveral Shires, Stewarts of Stewartries and Bailiffs of Regalities, and their Clerks, whom We ordain to fee the fame published: And We appoint them to fend Copies hereof to the feveral Parish Churches within their Bounds, that upon the Lord's Day immediately preceding the Day above mentioned the fame may be published and read from the the Pulpits immediately after Divine Service.

By the KING, A PROCLAMATION. GEORGE R.

WHEREAS on the Night of the First of this instant Month of February, some Person unknown, in Company with a few other Persons, to the Number of Twelve or thereabouts, in a Part of Covent Garden, opposite Southampton Street, in Our City of Westminster, threw a Stone, Brick, or other hard Substance, which struck with great Violence one of Our Servants, then standing behind Our Carriage, in which We, together with Our Royal Confort, were then returning from the Theatre in Drury Lane: And whereas afterwards on the same Night, whilst We were so returning, some Person unknown threw with great Violence into Our said Cartiage a very sharp-edged and dangerous Flint

Stone, as Our faid Carriage was passing along Pall Mall, in Our faid City of Westminster, and opposite to John Street, which Stone broke one of the Glaffes of Our faid Carriage, and afterwards fell in Our faid Carriage; and the Acts aforefaid were done in Violation of the Public Peace, and to the actual Danger of the Royal Persons of Us and Our Royal Confort, and are highly criminal and traiterous: We therefore, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby enjoin all Magistrates, and all other Our loving Subjects, to use their utmost Endeavours to discover and cause to be apprehended the Persons concerned in fuch traiterous Outrages, in order that they may be dealt with according to Law. And We hereby promife, that any Person or Persons, concerned in the faid traiterous Outrages, other than fuch Person or Persons as actually committed the faid Acts of Violence, or either of them, by which the Royal Persons of Us and Our Royal Confort were immediately endangered, who shall give Information, fo that any other or others of the Perfons concerned therein, or offending as aforefaid. may be apprehended and brought to Juffice, shall receive a Reward of ONE THOUSAND POUNDS, to be paid on Conviction of every fuch Offender; which faid Sum of ONE THOUSAND POUNDS the Lords Commissioners of Our Treasury are hereby required and directed to pay accordingly: And We do further promise, that any Person or Persons concerned in fuch traiterous Outrages as aforefaid, other than fuch as actually committed the faid Acts of Violence, or either of them, who shall give Information, fo as that any other or others of the Persons concerned therein, or offending as aforefaid, shall be apprehended and brought to Justice, shall, upon Conviction of fuch Offender or Offenders, receive Our most gracious Pardon.
