

CAUTION AGAINST EMBEZZLEMENT AND PERJURY.

THOMAS EDY, of Deptford, Pawnbroker and Rope-Dealer, having been tried at the Assizes for the County of Surry, and convicted of having in his Possession a Quantity of new Bolt and other Rope marked with the King's Mark, the Property of His Majesty, was sentenced to Three Months Imprisonment, and hard Labour in the House of Correction, and to be publicly whipped on Tower-Hill, for the Space of One Hundred Yards.

And Roger Prout, of Deptford, Dealer in Rope, having on the said Thomas Edy's being brought up to receive Sentence, delivered in an Affidavit in Mitigation of the Sentence of the Court, containing gross and corrupt Perjury, was tried on that Charge and sentenced to be imprisoned Three Months in the Goal of Newgate and to be transported for the Term of Seven Years.
