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## Whitehall, February 2.

As feveral Arithcers and Manufallurers, Subjets of Great Britain, bave, from Time to Time, gone into Foreign Countries to exercise their Several Callings, contrary to the Laws of these Kingdoms, the following AbAraEs of AEs of Parliament of Their late Majeflies King George the First and Second and of His prefent Majefly, for preventing fuch Practices, are published, for the Information of all Persons who may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by Difobedience to them : And it will be observed, that fuch Penalties likewife extend to those who are any ways concerned or instrumental in the Sending or Enticing Artificers or Manufacturers out of thefe Kingdoms, or in the Exportation of the Tools and Instruments used by them, as well as to the Artificers or Manufacturers themselves.

## Statute 5 George I. Chap. 27.

IF any Perfon fhall contract with, entice, or folicit, any Artificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Atificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreign Countries out of the King's Dominions, and Ihall be convicted thereof, upon Indictment or Informa-tion in any of the Courts at Weftminfter, or at the Affizes or Quarter-Seffions, he shall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for the first Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Perfon having been once convicted shall offend again he shall be fined at the Discretion of the Court, and imprifoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid.

If any of the King's Subjects, being fuch Artificers, shall go into any Country out of His Majefty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the faid Trades to Foreigners; and if any of the King's Subjects in any fuch Foreign Country, exercifing any of the faid Trades, fhall not return into this Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambaffador, Minister or Conful of Great Britain, in the Country where fuch Artificers shall be, or by any Perion authorifed by fuch Ambaffador, &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from henceforth inhabit within this Realm ; fuch Perfons fhall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being an Executor or Administrator, or of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Defcent, De-vife or Purchafe, and fhall forfeit all Lands, Goods, &c. within this Kingdom, to His Majefty's Ufe, and shall be deemed Alien, and out of His Majelty's Protection.

Upon Complaint made, upon Oath, before any Juffice of Peace, that any Perfon is endeavouring to feduce any fuch Artificer, or that any fuch Artificer hath contracted or is preparing to go out of His Majefty's Dominions, for the Purpoles aforefaid, fuch Juffice may fend his Warrant to bring the Perfon complained of before him, or before fome other Juffice; and if it fhall appear by the Oath of one Witnefs, or by Confession, that he was guilty of any of the faid Offences, fuch Justice may bind

him to appear at the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions : And, if fuch Perfon shall refuse to give Security, the Justice may commit him to Goal till the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions, and until he shall be delivered by due Course of Law. And if any fuch Artificer shall be convicted, upon Indictment, of any fuch Promise, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas, for the Purpole aforefaid, he shall give fuch Security to the King not to depart out of His Majelty's Dominions, as fuch Court fhall think reafonable, and shall be imprisoned till Security given.

If any of the above Offences shall be committed in Scotland, the fame shall be profecuted in the Court of Jufficiary, or the Circuits there.

## Statute 23 George II. Chap. 13.

IF any Perfon shall contract with, or endeavour to feduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cotton or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer in any other of the Manufactures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland, into any Foreign Coun-try not within the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, and shall be convicted, upon Indictment or Information, in the King's Bench at Westminster, or by Indictment at the Assizes or General Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein fuch Offence shall be committed in England, or by Indictment in the Court of Jufficiary or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or by Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Dublin, if fuch Offence be committed in ireland ; the Perfon fo convicted shall, for every Artificer contracted with, or feduced, forfeit FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, and fhall fuffer Imprifonment in the Common Goal of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted, for Twelve Calendar Months, and until Forfeiture be paid : And in Cafe of a fublequent Offence of the fame Kind, the Perfons fo again offending shall forfeit, for every Person contracted with or seduced, ONE THOUSAND POUNDS, and thall fuffer Imprifonment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted, for Two Years, and until fuch Forfeiture be paid.

If any Perfon in Great Britain or Ireland fhall put on Board any Ship or Boat, not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to fome other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, any fuch Tools or Utenfils as are commonly ufed in, or proper for the Preparing, Working up or Finishing of the Woollen or Silk Manufactures or any Part of fuch Tools, he shall, for every Offence, forfeit all fuch Tools, or Parts thereof, put on Board, and TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered by Action of Debt, &c. in any Court of Record at Wettminiter, or in the Court of Seffion in Scotland, or at any of the Four Courts in Dublin respectively, wherein no Essoin, &c. thall be allowed.

It fhall be lawful for any Officer of the Cuftoms in Great Britain, or for any Officer of the Revenue in Ireland, to feize and fecure, in fome of His Majelly's Warehoufes, all fuch Tools or Utenfils prohibited to be exported, as fuch Officer shall find on Board
