THIS Day the Lords being met, a Message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by Mr. Quarme, the Yeoman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of His Majesty's Commission for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of this Honourable House in the House of Peers, to bear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to*

An Act for enabling His Majesty to raise the Sum of Two Millions Five Hundred Thousand Pounds for the Uses and Purposes therein mentioned.

An Act for raising a certain Sum of Money by Loans or Exchequer Bills, for the Service of the Year One thousand seven hundred and ninety-six.

An Act for raising a further Sum of Money by Loans or Exchequer Bills, for the Service of the Year One thousand seven hundred and ninety-six.

An Act for the Regulation of His Majesty's Marine Forces while on Shore.

An Act for indemnifying Governors, Lieutenant-Governors, and Persons acting as such in the West India Islands, who have permitted the Importation

and Exportation of Goods and Commodities in Foreign Bottoms.

An Act for further continuing an Act made in the Thirty-third Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, An Act for establishing Courts of Judicature in the Island of Newfoundland and the Islands adjacent.

An Act for increasing the Rates of Subsistence to be paid to Innkeepers and others on Quartering Soldiers.

An Act to explain and enlarge the Powers contained in the Charter of the London Assurance of Houses and Goods from Fire.
