P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

W KEREAS by an Act passed in the Thirty-third Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for establishing Regulations respecting Aliens arriving in this Kingdom, or resident therein, in certain Cases," and which Act hath been continued, by subsequent Acts of Parliament, it is, amongst other Things, enacted, That when and so often as His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, shall think it necessary for the Safety and Tranquillity of the Kingdom, by His or Their Proclamation or Order in Council, to direct that Aliens of any Description in the said Proclamation or Order contained (not being Alien Merchants, within the true Intent and Meaning of the said Act) shall not be landed in this Kingdom, except at such Places, and under such Regulations, as shall be in such Proclamation or Order expressed; then, and in every such Case, the Master or Commander of every Ship or Vessel or Boat, having any such Alien or Aliens on Board, shall not suffer any such Alien or Aliens to land within any Part of this Kingdom, contrary to such Proclamation or Order in Council, unless by the express Permission

of His Majesty, signified under the Hand of One of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State; and every such Master or Commander, wilfully neglecting to conform to any of the Directions or Regu-

lations contained in such Proclamation or Order, shall forfeit FIFTY POUNDS for every Alien so landed, to be recovered as therein mentioned; and such Ship or Vessel from on Board of which any such Alien or Aliens shall so land, and every other Vessel or Boat used in landing such Alien or Aliens, shall and may be seized by any Officer or Officers of the Customs or Excise, and the same shall respectively be forfeited, together with all Tackle, Apparel, Ammunition and Furniture thereunto respectively belonging: His Majesty, for the Safety and Tranquillity of this Kingdom, hath thought fit, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is by His Majesty, by and with such Advice, and under the Authority of the said Acts of Parliament, hereby accordingly ordered, That from and after the Publication of this Order in the London Gazette, no Alien or Aliens on Board of any Ship or Vessel or Boat, coming or arriving directly or immediately from any Port or Place in France, or any Port or Place under the Dominion of the Persons exercising the Powers of Government in France, or from any Port or Place of or in, or belonging to any Country or Territory at War with Great Britain, shall (until His Majesty's Royal Pleasure concerning such Aliens shall be further expressed) be landed, or be suffered by the Master or Commander of any such Ship, Vessel or Boat to land, at any Port or Place within this Kingdom, except at the Ports of Yarmouth, Harwich, Dover and Southampton, and at Gravesend,

unless by the express Permission of His Majesty, signified under the Hand of One of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State:—And His Majesty is hereby further pleased to order, by and with the Advice aforesaid, that Notice of this Order shall be printed in different Languages, and shall be affixed in public Places in the different Ports of this Kingdom, and shall also be delivered by the Custom-House Officers to the Master of every such Ship, Vessel or Boat arriving at any Port or Place in this Kingdom, except as aforesaid, and to all Foreigners arriving in any such Ship, Vessel or Boat: Provided always, That this Order shall not extend to any Foreign Ambassador, or other Public Minister duly authorized, or the Servants actually attendant upon any such Ambassador or Public Minister, or any Alien Merchant, being such within the true Intent and Meaning of the said Act of the Thirty-third Year of His Majesty's Reign, or any domestic Servant of any natural-born Subject of His Majesty, or of any Subject to whom Letters of Denization have been or shall be hereafter granted, or any domestic Servant of any of His Majesty's Subjects who now are or shall hereafter be naturalized by Act of Parliament, such Servants respectively being actually and bonâ fide employed in the Service of their respective Masters, and actually at the Time attendant upon their respective Masters; nor to any Mariner, actually engaged and employed in the Navigation of any Ship or Vessel, during the Time that such Mariner shall remain so actually engaged and employed, and certified, in the Manner in the said Act mentioned, to be such Mariner, by the Master or Commander of such Ship or Vessel upon his Arrival in any such Port or Place as aforesaid. And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

**D**ISPATCHEs from Major-General Stuart, commanding His Majesty's and the East India Company's Troops in the Island of Ceylon, dated Trincomalé, October 10, 1795, have been received by the Right Honorable Henry Dundas, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State; by which it appears that the Fort of Batticaloe, in that Island, surrendered on the 18th of September to a Detachment under the Command of Major Frazer of the 72d Regiment. That on the 24th of the same Month General Stuart embarked from Trincomalé with a considerable Detachment of Troops and Artillery on Board of the Centurion Man of War, the Bombay Frigate, the Bombay Store-Ship, and the Swallow and John Packets, and on the 27th disembarked the Troops at Point Pedro, about Twenty-four Miles from Jaffnapatam, of which important Place he took Possession on the following Day. That on the 1st of October Captain Page, of His Majesty's Ship Hobart, with a Part of the 52d Regiment, under the Command of the Honorable Captain Monson, (on their Return from Point Pedro to Trincomalé) took Possession of the Factory and Military Post of Molletivoë; and that on the 5th of the same Month the Fort and Island of Manar surrendered to Captain Barbut, whom General Stuart had detached on that Service, with the Flank Companies of the 72d Regiment and Two Companies of Sepoys, immediately on his having obtained Possession of Jaffnapatam.

A Letter from Colonel Brathwaite, dated Madras, October 17, 1795, announces the Surrender of Malacca, and its Dependencies, on the 17th of August, to the Troops sent on that Service, under the Command of Major Brown.

By Dispatches from Bengal it also appears, that Chinsurah and its Dependencies have been taken, and that the Dutch Forces at those Settlements are Prisoners of War.

**T**HIS Day his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant went in State to the House of Peers, with the usual Solemnity, and the Commons being sent for, gave the Royal Assent to

An Act for granting for One Year the several Duties therein mentioned in lieu of all other Duties payable upon the Articles therein specified during the said Term, and for regulating the Trade between this Kingdom and His Majesty's Colonies, and for other Purposes therein mentioned.

An Act for punishing Mutiny and Desertion, and for the better Payment of the Army and their Quarters within this Kingdom.

An Act more effectually to suppress Insurrections, and to prevent the Disturbance of the Public Peace.

An Act further to explain and amend an Act, passed in the Twenty-third and Twenty-fourth Years of His present Majesty's Reign, entitled, An Act for establishing a Post-Office within this Kingdom; and to explain and amend an Act passed in the Twenty-eighth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, entitled, An Act to explain and amend an Act passed in the Twenty-third and Twenty-fourth Years of His Majesty's Reign, entitled, An Act for establishing a Post-Office within this Kingdom.

An Act to amend an Act passed in the Fifteenth and Sixteenth Years of His present Majesty's Reign, for continuing, amending and making more effectual an Act passed in the Thirteenth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty George the Second, for repairing the Road leading from Timoho in the Queen's County, through Ballynakill, Durrow, Beggar's Inn, and from thence through the City of Cahel to the Town of Tipperary, in the County of Tipperary.

An Act for indemnifying such Persons as have acted since the First Day of January, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-five, for the Preservation of the Public Peace and Suppression of Insurrections prevailing in some Parts of this Kingdom.

An Act for the further Regulation of Public Infirmaries or Hospitals.

An Act to amend an Act passed in the Thirteenth and Fourteenth Years of King George the Third,

entitled, An Act for the better regulating the Office of County Treasurers, and the Duty of Clerks of the Crown, in respect of Presentments, and to enable the Grand Jury of the County of Wicklow to raise Money by Presentment for purchasing of Ground or Houses adjoining to the Court-House of the said County, for the Purpose of building Additions to the said Court-House.

An Act for repairing the Road, commonly called and known by the Name of the Military Road, beginning at the County and City Court-Houses in the City of Waterford, and leading from thence to the Town of Tallow, in the County of Waterford, through the Town of KilmacThomas, Cappoquin, and Lismore, and from Tallow aforesaid to the Bounds of the County of Cork.

*As several Artificers and Manufacturers, Subjects of Great Britain, have, from Time to Time, gone into Foreign Countries to exercise their several Callings, contrary to the Laws of these Kingdoms, the following Abstracts of Acts of Parliament of Their late Majesties King George the First and Second and of His present Majesty, for preventing such Practices, are published, for the Information of all Persons who may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by Disobedience to them: And it will be observed, that such Penalties likewise extend to those who are any ways concerned or instrumental in the Sending or Enticing Artificers or Manufacturers out of these Kingdoms, or in the Exportation of the Tools and Instruments used by them, as well as to the Artificers or Manufacturers themselves.*

Statute 5 George I. Chap. 27.

**I**F any Person shall contract with, entice, or solicit, any Artificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brass, or other Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreign Countries out of the King's Dominions, and shall be convicted thereof, upon Indictment or Information in any of the Courts at Westminster, or at the Assizes or Quarter-Sessions, he shall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for the first Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Person having been once convicted shall offend again he shall be fined at the Discretion of the Court, and imprisoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid.

If any of the King's Subjects, being such Artificers, shall go into any Country out of His Majesty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the said Trades to Foreigners; and if any of the King's Subjects in any such Foreign Country, exercising any of the said Trades, shall not return into this Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambassador, Minister or Consul of Great Britain, in the Country where such Artificers shall be, or by any Person authorised by such Ambassador, &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from henceforth inhabit within this Realm; such Persons shall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being an

an Executor or Administrator, or of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Descent, Devise or Purchase, and shall forfeit all Lands, Goods, &c. within this Kingdom, to His Majesty's Use, and shall be deemed Alien, and out of His Majesty's Protection.

Upon Complaint made, upon Oath, before any Justice of Peace, that any Person is endeavouring to seduce any such Artificer, or that any such Artificer hath contracted or is preparing to go out of His Majesty's Dominions, for the Purposes aforesaid, such Justice may send his Warrant to bring the Person complained of before him, or before some other Justice; and if it shall appear by the Oath of one Witness, or by Confession, that he was guilty of any of the said Offences, such Justice may bind him to appear at the next Assizes or Quarter Sessions: And, if such Person shall refuse to give Security, the Justice may commit him to Goal till the next Assizes or Quarter Sessions, and until he shall be delivered by due Course of Law. And if any such Artificer shall be convicted, upon Indictment, of any such Promise, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas, for the Purpose aforesaid, he shall give such Security to the King not to depart out of His Majesty's Dominions, as such Court shall think reasonable, and shall be imprisoned till Security given.

If any of the above Offences shall be committed in Scotland, the same shall be prosecuted in the Court of Justiciary, or the Circuits there.

*Statute 23 George II. Chap. 13.*

IF any Person shall contract with, or endeavour to seduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cotton or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Bras, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer in any other of the Manufactures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland, into any Foreign Country not within the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, and shall be convicted, upon Indictment or Information, in the King's Bench at Westminster, or by Indictment at the Assizes or General Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein such Offence shall be committed in England, or by Indictment in the Court of Justiciary or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or by Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Dublin, if such Offence be committed in Ireland; the Person so convicted shall, for every Artificer contracted with, or seduced, forfeit FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, and shall suffer Imprisonment in the Common Goal of the County or Stewartry wherein such Offender shall be convicted, for Twelve Calendar Months, and until Forfeiture be paid: And in Case of a subsequent Offence of the same Kind, the Persons so again offending shall forfeit, for every Person contracted with or seduced, ONE THOUSAND POUNDS, and shall suffer Imprisonment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein such Offender shall be convicted, for Two Years, and until such Forfeiture be paid.

If any Person in Great Britain or Ireland shall put on Board any Ship or Boat, not bound directly to some Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to some other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, any such Tools or Utensils as are commonly used in, or proper for the Preparing, Working up

or Finishing of the Woollen or Silk Manufactures or any Part of such Tools, he shall, for every Offence, forfeit all such Tools, or Parts thereof, put on Board, and TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered by Action of Debt, &c. in any Court of Record at Westminster, or in the Court of Session in Scotland, or at any of the Four Courts in Dublin respectively, wherein no Effoin, &c. shall be allowed.

It shall be lawful for any Officer of the Customs in Great Britain, or for any Officer of the Revenue in Ireland, to seize and secure, in some of His Majesty's Warehouses, all such Tools or Utensils prohibited to be exported, as such Officer shall find on Board any Vessel not bound directly to some Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to some other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain; and all Tools so seized shall, after Condemnation, be publicly sold to the best Bidder; and one Moiety of the Produce shall be to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Officer who shall seize and secure the same.

If the Captain of any Vessel in Great Britain or Ireland knowingly permit any of the said Tools, prohibited to be exported, to be put on Board his Vessel, he shall, for every such Offence, forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as the Penalties inflicted upon Persons exporting the Tools; and, if the Vessel belongs to His Majesty, the Captain shall not only forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, but shall also forfeit his Employment, and be incapable of any Employment under His Majesty.

If any Officer of the Customs in Great Britain, or of the Revenue in Ireland, take, or knowingly suffer to be taken, any Entry outward, or sign any Cocket or Sufferance for the Shipping or Exporting of any of the said Tools, or knowingly suffer the same to be done, he shall forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as aforesaid, and also forfeit his Office, and be incapable of any Office under His Majesty.

One Moiety of the Forfeitures shall be applied to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Use of the Person who shall sue for the same.

*Statutes 14, 21, 25 and 26 of His present Majesty.*

BY these Statutes the like Penalties and Forfeitures as above mentioned are extended to Persons packing or putting on board any Vessel, not bound directly for some Port in Great Britain or Ireland, any Machine, Engine, Tool, Press, Paper, Utensil or Implement whatsoever, used in or proper for the working or finishing of the Cotton, Steel or Iron Manufactures of this Kingdom, or any Part or Parts of such Machines or Implements, or any Models or Plans thereof; and all Captains of Ships and other Persons receiving or being in Possession of any such Articles, with an Intent to export the same to Foreign Parts, and all Custom-house Officers suffering an Entry to be made thereof, are respectively liable to the like Penalties as are above mentioned, in the Case of Tools and Utensils used in the Woollen and Silk Manufactures.

And the Commissioners do hereby give further Notice, that they have duly authorized the Head Distributors of Stamps in the different Counties of the Kingdom to execute this Business by themselves and their Deputies: The former of whom the Commissioners have directed to publicly advertise, as early as possible, an Account of the Offices and Places in their respective Districts, for the said Purpose, in the Newspapers usually circulated in the Neighbourhood thereof, with the Names of the Deputies the said Head Distributors have appointed to superintend the same.

And, to prevent Mistakes, the Commissioners think it right to apprise the Public, that a Duty of ONE POUND AND ONE SHILLING only, is to be paid for each Certificate; which Sum will be expressed by a Stamp on each Certificate; AND THAT NO MORE IS TO BE DEMANDED OF ANY PERSON upon taking out a Certificate for using or wearing of Hair Powder, upon any Pretence whatever, except where there are more than two unmarried Daughters in a Family, in which Case a DOUBLE CERTIFICATE stamped with two Stamps, of One Pound One Shilling each, is required to be taken out.
