PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. TKEREAS by an Act passed in the Thirtythird Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for establishing Regulations re-" fpecting Aliens arriving in this Kingdom, or " refident therein, in certain Cases," and which Act hath been continued, by subsequent Acts of Parliament, it is, amongst other Things, enacted, That when and fo often as His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, shall think it necessary for the Safety and Tranquillity of the Kingdom, by His or Their Proclamation or Order in Council, to direct that Aliens of any Description in the faid Proclamation or Order contained (not being Alien Merchants, within the true Intent and Meaning of the faid Act) shall not be landed in this Kingdom, except at fuch Places, and under fuch Regulations, as shall be in such Proclamation or Order expressed; then, and in every fuch Cafe, the Master or Commander of every Ship or Vessel or Boat, having any fuch Alien or Aliens on Board, shall not fuffer any fuch Alien or Aliens to land within any Part of this Kingdom, contrary to fuch Proclamation or Order in Council, unless by the express Permission

f His Majesty, signified under the Hand of One of His Majesty's Principal Secretariss of State; and every such Master or Commander, wilfully neglecting to conform to any of the Directions or Regu- wich, Dover and Southampton, and at Gravesend,

lations contained in fuch Proclamation or Orders shall forfeit FIFTY POUNDS for every Alien fo landed, to be recovered as therein mentioned; and fuch Ship or Vessel from on Board of which any fuch Alien or Aliens shall so land, and every other Veffel or Boat used in landing such Allen or Aliens, shall and may be seized by any Officer or Officers of the Customs or Excise, and the fame shall respectively be forfeited, together with all Tackle, Apparel, Ammunition and Furniture thereunto respectively belonging: His Majesty, for the Safety and Tranquillity of this Kingdom, hath thought fit, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is by His Majesty, by and with fuch Advice, and under the Authority of the faid Acts of Parliament, hereby accordingly ordered, That from and after the Publication of this Order in the London Gazette, no Alien or Aliens on Board of any Ship or Vessel or Boat, coming or arriving directly or immediately from any Port or Place in France, or any Port or Place under the Dominion of the Persons exercising the Powers of Government in France, or from any Port or Place of or in, or belonging to any Country or Territory at War with Great Britain, shall (until His Majesty's Royal Pleasure concerning such Aliens shall be further expressed) be landed, or be suffered by the Master or Commander of any such Ship, Vesfel or Boat to land, at any Port or Place within this Kingdom, except at the Ports of Yarmouth, Har-

unless by the express Permission of His Majesty, fignified under the Hand of One of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State: -And His Majesty is hereby further pleafed to order, by and with the Advice aforesaid, that Notice of this Order shall be printed in different Languages, and shall be affixed in public Places in the different Ports of this Kingdom, and shall also be delivered by the Custom-House Officers to the Master of every such Ship, Vessel or Boat arriving at any Port or Place in this Kingdom, execept as aforefaid, and to all Foreigners arriving in any fuch Ship, Veffel or Boat : Provided always, That this Order shall not extend to any Foreign Ambassador, or other Public Minister duly authorized, or the Servants actually attendant upon any fuch Ambassador or Public Minister, or any Alien Merchant, being fuch within the true Intent and Meaning of the faid Act of the Thirty-third Year of His Majesty's Reign, or any domestic Servant of any natural-born Subject of His Majesty, or of any Subject to whom Letters of Denization have been or shall be hereafter granted, or any domestic Servant of any of His Majesty's Subjects who now are or shall hereafter be naturalized by Act of Parliament, fuch Servants respectively being actually and bona fide employed in the Service of their respective Masters, and actually at the Time attendant upon their respective Masters; nor to any Mariner, actually engaged and employed in the Navigation of any Ship or Veffel, during the Time that fuch Mariner shall remain so actually engaged and employed, and certified, in the Manner in the faid Act mentioned, to be fuch Mariner, by the Mafter or Commander of fuch Ship or Veffel upon his Arrival in any fuch Port or Place as aforefaid. And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treasury, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

The King has been pleased to grant to Thomas Fenwick, of Newcastle upon Tyne, Esq; His Royal Licence and Authority to take and use the Surname and bear the Arms of Clennell only, pursuant to the last Will and Testament of his late Great Uncle Percival Clennell, of Harbottle Castle in the County of Northumberland, Esq; deceased; such Arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms and recorded in the Heralds Office: And also to order that this His Majesty's Concession and Declaration be registered in his College of Arms.

ISPATCHES from Major-General Stuart, commanding His Majesty's and the East India Company's Troops in the Island of Ceylon, dated Trincomalé, October 10, 1795, have been received by the Right Honorable Henry Dundas, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State; by which it appears that the Fort of Batticaloe, in that Island, furrendered on the 18th of September to a Detachment under the Command of Major Fraser of the 72d Regiment. That on the 24th of the same Month General Stuart embarked from Trincomalé with a confiderable Detachment of Troops and Artillery on Board of the Centurion Man of War, the Bombay Frigate, the Bombay Store-Ship, and the Swallow and John Packets, and on the 27th difembarked the Troops at Point Pedro, about Twentyfour Miles from Jaffnapatam, of which important Place he took Possession on the following Day. That on the 1st of October Captain Page, of His Majesty's Ship Hobart, with a Part of the 52d Regiment, under the Command of the Honorable Captain Monson, (on their Return from Point Pedro to Trincomale) took Possession of the Factory and Military Post of Molletivoe; and that on the 5th of the fame Month the Fort and Island of Manar furrendered to Captain Barbutt, whom General Stuart had detached on that Service, with the Flank Companies of the 72d Regiment and Two Companies of Sepoys, immediately on his having obtained Possession of Jaffnapatam.

A Letter from Colonel Brathwaite, dated Madras, October 17, 1795, announces the Surrender of Malacca, and its Dependencies, on the 17th of August, to the Troops sent on that Service, under

the Command of Major Brown.

By Dispatches from Bengal it also appears, that Chinsurah and its Dependencies have been taken, and that the Dutch Forces at those Settlements are Prisoners of War.

An Aft for punithing Mutiny and Defertion, and for the better Payment of the Army and their Quar-

ters within this Kingdom.

An Act more effectually to suppress Insurrections, and to prevent the Disturbance of the Public Peace.

entitled, An Act for the better regulating the O fice of County Treasurers, and the Duty of Clerks of the Crown, in respect of Presentments, and to enable the Grand Jury of the County of Wicklow to raife Money by Prefentment for purchasing of Ground or Houses adjoining to the Court-House of the faid County, for the Purpose of building Additions to the faid Court-House.

As several Artificers and Manufacturers, Subjects of Great Britain, bave, from Time to Time, gone inte Foreign Countries to exercise their several Callings, contrary to the Laws of these Kingdoms, the following Abstracts of Acts of Parliament of Their late Majesties King George the First and Second and of His present Mojesty, for preventing Such Practices, are published, for the Information of all Persons who may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by Disobedience to them: And it will be observed, that Such Penalties likewise extend to those who are any ways concerned or instrumental in the Sending or Enticing Artificers or Manufacturers out of thefe Kingdoms, or in the Exportation of the Tools and Instruments used by them, as well as to the Artisicers or Manufacturers themselves.

Statute & George I. Chap. 27.

IF any Perion shall contract with, entice, or solicit, any Artificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, Clock-maker. Watch-maker, or any other Atificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreign Countries out of the King's Dominions, and shall be convicted thereof, upon Indictment or Informathe Affizes or Quarter-Seffions, he shall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for the first Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Perfon having been once convicted shall offend again he shall be fined at the Discretion of the Court, and imprisoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid.

If any of the King's Subjects, being such Artificers, shall go into any Country out of His Majesty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the said Trades to Foreigners; and if any of the King's Subjects in any such Foreign Country, exercising any of the faid Trades, shall not return into this Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambassador, Minister or Consul of Great Britain, in the Country where fuch Artificers shall be, or by any Person authorised by such Ambassador, &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from henceforth inhabit within this Realm; fuch Persons shall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being

Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Descent, Devise or Purchase, and shall torseit all Lands, Goods, &c. wathin this Kingdom, to His Majesty's Use, and shall be deemed Alien, and out of His

Majetty's Protection.

Upon Complaint made, upon Oath, before any Justice of Peace, that any Person is endeavouring to feduce any fuch Artificer, or that any fuch Artificer hath contracted or is preparing to go out of His Majetty's Dominions, for the Purpoles aforefaid, such Justice may fend his Warrant to bring the Person complained of before him, or before fome other Juftice; and if it shall appear by the Oath of one Witness, or by Confession, that he was guilty of any of the said Offences, such Justice may oind him to appear at the next Affizes or Quarter Seftions: And, if fuch Person shall refuse to give Security, the Justice may commit him to Goal till the next Affizes or Quarter Sessions, and until he shall be delivered by due Course of Law. And if any fuch Artificer shall be convicted, upon Indictment, of any fuch Promife, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas, for the Purpole aforefaid, he shall give such Security to the King not to depart out of His Majesty's Dominions, as such Court shall think reasonable, and shall be imprisoned till Security given:

If any of the above Offences shall be committed in Scotland, the same shall be prosecuted in the

Court of Jufficiary, or the Circuits there.

### Statute 23 George II. Chap. 13.

IF any Person shall contract with, or endeavour to feduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cotton or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer in any other of the Manufactures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland, into any Foreign Country not within the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, and shall be convicted, upon In-dictment or Information, in the King's Bench at Wetlminster, or by Indictment at the Assizes or General Gael Delivery for the County, &c. wherein such Offence shall be committed in England, or by Indictment in the Court of Jufticiary or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or by Indicament or Information in the King's Bench at Dublin, if fuch Offence be committed in Ireland; the Person so convicted shall, for every Ar-tificer contracted with, or seduced, forseit FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, and shall suffer Imprifonment in the Common Goal of the County or Stewartry wherein such Offender shall be convicted, for Twelve Calendar Months, and until Forfeiture be paid: And in Case of a subsequent Offence of the same Kind, the Persons so again offending thall forfeit, for every Person contracted with or seduced, ONE THOUSAND POUNDS, and shall suffer Imprisonment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted, for Two Years, and until such Forfeiture be paid.

If any Perfon in Great Britain or Ireland shall put on Board any Ship or Boat, not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to some other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, any fuch Tools or Utenfils as are commonly used in, or proper for the Preparing, Working up

an Executor or Administrator, or of taking any or Finishing of the Woollen or Silk Manufactures or any Part of fuch Tools, he shall, for every Offence, forfeit all fuch Tools, or Parts thereof, put on Board, and TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered by Action of Debt, &c. in any Court of Record at Westminster, or in the Court of Session in Scotland, or at any of the Four Courts in Dublin respectively, wherein no Essoin, &c. shall be allowed.

It shall be lawful for any Officer of the Customs in Great Britain, or for any Officer of the Revenue in Ireland, to seize and secure, in some of His Majesty's Warehouses, all such Tools or Utenfils prohibited to be exported, as fuch Officer shall find on Board any Vessel not bound directly to some Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to some other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain; and ail Tools fo seized shall, after Condemnation, be publickly fold to the best Bidder; and one Moiety of the Produce shall be to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Officer who shall seize and fecure the fame.

If the Captain of any Vessel in Great Britain or Ireland knowingly permit any of the faid Tools, prohibited to be exported, to be put on Board his Vessel, he shall, for every such Offence, forfeit ONEHUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as the Penalties inflicted upon Persons exporting the Tools; and, if the Vessel belongs to His Majesty, the Captain shall not only forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, but shall also forfeit his Employment, and be incapable of any Employment under His Majesty.

If any Officer of the Customs in Great Britain, or of the Revenue in Ireland, take, or knowingly fuffer to be taken, any Entry outward, or fign any Cocket or Sufferance for the Shipping or Exporting of any of the faid Tools, or knowingly suffer the fame to be done, he shall forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as aforefaid, and also forfeit his Office, and be incapable of any Office

under His Majetty.

One Moiety of the Forfeitures shall be applied to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Use of the Person who shall sue for the fame.

Statutes 14, 21, 25 and 26 of His present Majesty

BY thefe Statutes the like Penalties and For feitures as above mentioned are extended to Persons packing or putting on board any Vessel, not bound directly for some Port in Great Britain or Ireland, any Machine, Engine, Tool, Press, Paper, Utenfil or Implement whatsoever, used in or proper for the working or finishing of the Cotton, Steel or Iron Manufactures of this Kingdom, or any Part or Parts of fuch Machines or Implements, or any Models or Plans thereof; and all Captains of Ships and other Persons receiving or being in Possession of any fuch Articles, with an Intent to export the same to Foreign Parts, and all Custom-house Officers suffering an Entry to be made thereof, are respectively liable to the like Penalties as are above mentioned, in the Case of Tools and Utensils used in the Woollen and Silk Manusactures.

And, to prevent Mistakes, the Commissioners think it right to apprize the Public, that a Duty of ONE POUND AND ONE SHILLING only, is to be paid for each Certificate; which Sum will be expressed. by a Stam) on each Certificate; AND THAT NO MORE IS TO BE DEMANDED OF ANY PERSON upon taking out a Certificate for using or wearing of Hair Powder, upon any Pretence whatever, except where there are more than two unmarried Daughters in a Family, in subich Cafe a DOUBLE CERTIFICATE stamped with two Stamps, of One Pound One Shilling each, is required to be taken out.
