Copy of a Letter from Rear-Admiral Rainier, dated on Board His Majefy's Ship Suffolk, in Madres Road, the 15th of October, 1795, to Evan Nepean, E/q; SIR, 22

YESTERDAY, on the Point of Sailing, I received the inclosed Leiter and Papers from Captain Newcome, giving an Accesant of his Proceedings, and particularly of the Stockis of the Expedition, under his own and Major Browne's Orders, of the Honorable Company's Infantry, against Malacca, this Place being now in the Poffession of the British Troops.

I feel a more than ordinary Satisfuction in announcing this Event for their Lordthips Information, as, on Account of the original Force defined for that Service being reduced, my Expectations were lefs fanguine; and alfo of its great Importance, from the Security thereby afforded to the Trade of His Majelty's Subjects in the Streights of Malacca and the Chinefe Seas.

Being doubtful of the Propriety of my Conduct in not having corresponded with the Right Honorable Henry Dundas on the Subject of the late Expeditions, in which I co-operated in Council and Execution, in Obedience to the King's Orders by him transmitted, and as therein prefcribed, (not having then even received their Lordships Directions fo to do, and which are also filent on that Head) I have to request you will please to intercede with their Lordships to use their Influence to remove any Culpability that may reflect upon my Conduct for this Omiflion ; in which if I have erred, it has been through Defect of Instructions and my Inexperience in the Receipt of fuch Kind of Orders

On the Succel's of His Majefty's Arms at Trinco-male and Fort Ooltenberg, and on receiving the Account of the fame from Malacca, I took upon me to order Salutes to be fired by His Majefty's Ships-

gestion of my Lord Hobart, I directed Captain Lambent, of His Majefty's Ship Suffolk, to fire Seventyeight Guns, Funeral-wife, on the melancholy Occafion of the Death of His Majefty's faithful Ally His Highnefs the Nabob Wallajah, late Nabob of the Carnatic, (the Fort of St. George, by his Lordfhip's Orders, paying the fame Honours) that particular Number of Guns being appointed as corresponding to those of the Years of His late Highnels's Age ; which I truft their Lordships will approve, and notify to the Board of Ordnance, to be allowed in the feveral Gunners monthly Expences.

Please to acquaint their Lordships, that the efidency here have just received Accounts of the Sur-render of Manar, in the Gulph of the fame Name.

Arrived here on the 15th Inftant with His Maŀ jefty's Ship under my Command, the Ewer and Carnatic Transports, and a Part of the Convoy, having parted Company with His Majefty's Ship Refiftance, in the Night of the 13th, between the Sandheads. Captain Pakenham joined Company again in Malacca Road on the 17th in the Morning.

By the inclosed Letters you will fee that we were obliged to commence Hottilities, which began by the Refiftance firing a few Guns at the Constantia (a Dutch Indiaman run into the Mud) which the returned by firing Two Guns and then firiking her Colours. From the great Affiftance afforded me by the Boats from the China Fleet, &c. I was enabled to land all the Troops, with Two Six-Pounders at the fame Time. They left the Ships at Seven P. M. on the 17th, and reached the Shore by Nine P. M. At Half patt Nine P. M. an Officer came on Board the Orpheus from the Governor to furrender the then in Port; and on the 13th Instant, at the Sug- I Place on our Terms; they then delivered over St. John's · . . . . . the seco

Tohn's Poft, a commanding Work well furnished with Cannon, about 1300 Yards from the Fort and 200 from the Place of Conference, to a Subaltern with a Party of our Grenadiers, and we entered the Fort with the Remainder of the British Detachment. The Garrison being thus completely in our Power, and unconditionally, further than the fecuring of Property, the Dutch Guards were permitted to remain armed at their Polts, until the Governor, whom we then accompanied to his Houfe, gave, in his own Hand-Writing to Major Browne, a Detail of the Guards, which were then relieved by the Britilh Troops. From the anxious Defire of complying with His Majefty's Orders, we have agreed to the inclosed Capitulation, and every Thing now appears perfectly quiet, and all Parties reconciled.

### PRELIMINARY ARTICLES.

THE Meafures adopted by the Dutch Government of Malacca fublequently to the amicable Propofals tendered by the Naval and Military Commanders of the British Forces, by the Agency of Mr. Forbes Rofs M. Donald, appointed by Commodore Peter Rainier, commanding the British Squadron in India, and Colonel John Brathwaite, commanding the Land Forces on the Coaft of Coromandel, having rendered it neceffary to debark the Troops, towards which the Poffellion of the Conftantia, a Dutch Armed Ship, which lay between the English Squadron and the Fort, becoming indifpensible, actual Hostilities commenced by His Majefty's Ship the Refiltance firing upon, and, after Exchange of fome Guns, taking Polleftion of her; and, having been followed up by the Dilcharge of feveral Guns from the Dutch Battery upon the British Troops after they had gained the Shore, are Circumstances which, together with the Invitation fubfequently given to the British Commanders to take Poffettion of the Fort, cannot be confidered in other Light than ultimately placing the Dutch Garrifon in the Predicament of having furrendered as Prifoners of War, and which has been fince acknowledged by the Dutch Government to have been their Expectation.

Neverthelefs, in Obedience to the Commands of His Britannic Majelly, requiring us to cultivate the Alliance, which has fo long and fo happily fublitted between the Two Nations, we difpenfe with the unparticipated Control, which the foregoing Circumftances would warrant our taking upon ourfelves, and hereby accede and confirm to the Dutch Government its Eftablifament and Authority in all Civil Matters, to the full Extent as heretofore ; referving however to ourfelves, and those who have been in immediate Connection with us upon the Service, a Claim to the Public Property in Malacca, and the Shipping in the Roads, to the Extent which His Britannic Majelty may be graciously pleased to determine; and for this Purpose the Value of the Public Property aftore and in the Roads, to be effimated and placed in Deposit, promising on our Part to give Protection to Public and Private Property under the above Refervation, and to defend the Interefts of the ancient Dutch Government against their | 12.2

This Article to be underflood as agreed to, fo far as the Refources of the Dutch Government of Malacca and its Dependencies extend.

N. B. This Paragraph by Mr. Couperus.

In Confideration of the extraordinary Expence incurred by the British Government, in fending their Troops for the Protection of their Allies the Dutch at Malacca, the Governor and Council of that Set-tlement will reprefent these Circamstances to the Governor-General and Council of Batavia, and in forwarding an Account of the monthly Expence of the British Troops, they will make Application to the Governor General that he may provide for it.

Agreed .- A. Conperus. The English and Dutch Flags to be displayed, when Occation requires, upon the Two Flag Staffs which are already crefted. Agreed.—A. Couperus. The Armed Vessels belonging to the Malacca Go-

vernment shall be put under the Orders of the British Naval Commander. Agreed.—A. Couperus.

Orders shall be fent by the Dutch Government to their Officers commanding at Rhio and Peru, to put themfelves and their Garrison under the Orders of the Officer commanding the British Forces.

Agreed .- A. Couperus.

The above Conditions being drawn up in general Terms, as the Bafis of Connection with the Protecting Power, the Illustration which any of them may require will be arranged and detailed in a fubscquent Paper, fubject, however, in Whole or in Part, to the future Regulation of the British Government in India.
