SENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. TKEREAS by an Act passed in the Thirtythird Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for establishing Regulations re-" specting Aliens arriving in this Kingdom, or " resident therein, in certain Cases," and which Act hath been continued, by fubfequent Acts of Parliament, it is, amongst other Things, enacted, That when and so often as His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, shall think it necessary for the Safety and Tranquillity of the Kingdom, by His or Their Proclamation or Order in Council, to direct that Aliens of any Description in the faid Proclamation or Order contained (not being Alien Merchants, within the true Intent and Meaning of the faid Act) shall not be landed in this Kingdom, except at fuch Places, and under fuch Regulations, as shall be in such Proclamation or Order expressed; then, and in every fuch Case, the Master or Commander of every Ship or Vessel or Boat, having any fuch Alien or Aliens on Board, shall not suffer any fuch Alien or Aliens to land within any Part of this Kingdom, contrary to fuch Proclamation or Order in Council, unless by the express Permission of His Majetty, fignified under the Hand of One of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State; and every fuch Mafter or Commander, wilfully neglect-

lations contained in fuch Proclamation or Order shall forfeit FIFTY POUNDS for every Alien so landed, to be recovered as therein mentioned; and fuch Ship or Vessel from on Board of which any such Alien or Aliens shall so land, and every other Vessel or Boat used in landing such Alien or Aliens, shall and may be seized by any Officer or Officers of the Cuttoms or Excise, and the fame shall respectively be forfeited, together with all Tackle, Apparel, Ammunition and Furniture thereunto respectively belonging: His Majesty, for the Safety and Tranquillity of this Kingdom, hat's thought fit, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is by His Majesty, by and with fuch Advice, and under the Authority of the faid Acts of Parliament, hereby accordingly ordered, That from and after the Publication of this Order in the London Gazette, no Alien of Aliens on Board of any Ship or Veffel or Boat. coming or arriving directly or immediately from any Port or Place in France, or any Port or Place under the Dominion of the Perions exercifing the Powers of Government in France, or from any Port or Place of or in, or belonging to any Country or Territory at War with Great Britain, shall funtil His Majesty's Royal Pleasure concerning such Aliens shall be further expressed) be landed, or be suffered by the Master or Commander of any such Ship, Vesfel or Boat to land, at any Port or Place within this Kingdom, except at the Ports of Yarmouth, Haring to conform to any of the Directions or Regu- | wich, Daver and Southampton, and at Gravefend,

unless by the express Permission of His Majesty, fignified under the Hand of One of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State :- And His Majefly is hereby further pleafed to order, by and with the Advice aforefaid, that Notice of this Order shall be printed in different Languages, and shall be affixed in rublic Places in the different Ports of this Kingdom, and shall also be delivered by the Custom-House Officers to the Master of every such Ship; Vessel or Boat arriving at any Port or Place in this Kingdom, execept as aforefaid, and to all Foreigners acriving in any fuch Ship, Veffel or Boat : Provided always, That this Order shall not extend to any Fereign Ambassador, or other Public Minister duly authorized, or the Servants actually attendant upon any fuch Ambassador or Public Minister, or any Alien Merchant, being fuch within the true Intent and Meaning of the faid Act of the Thirty-third Year of His Majesty's Reign, or any domestic Servant of any natural-born Subject of His Majesty, or of any Subject to whom Letters of Denization have been or shall be hereafter granted, or any domestic Servant of any of His Majelty's Subjects who now are or shall hereafter be naturalized by Act of Parliament, fuch Servants respectively being actually and bonâ fide employed in the Service of their respective Masters, and actually at the Time attendant upon their respective Masters; nor to any Mariner, actually engaged and employed in the Navigation of any Ship or Veffel, during the Time that such Mariner shall remain so actually engaged and employed, and certified, in the Manner in the faid A& mentioned, to be fuch Mariner, by the Mafter or Commander of fuch Ship or Vessel upon his Arrival in any fuch Port or Place as aforefaid. And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.
