The KING's Most Excellent Majefty in Council. TKEREAS by an Act paffed in the Thirtythird Year of His prefent Majefty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for establishing Regulations re-" fpecting Aliens arriving in this Kingdom, or " refident therein, in certain Cafes," and which Act hath been continued, by fubfequent Acts of Parliament, it is, amongst other Things, enacted, That when and fo often as His Majefty, His Heirs and Succeffors, thall think it neceffary for the Safety and Tranquillity of the Kingdom, by His or Their Proclamation or Order in Council, to direct that Aliens of any Defcription in the faid Proclamation or Order contained (not being Alien Merchants, within the true Intent and Meaning of the faid Act) shall not be landed in this Kingdom, except at fuch Places, and under fuch Regulations, as shall be in fuch Proclamation or Order expressed; then, and in every fuch Cafe, the Mafter or Commander of every Ship or Veffel or Boat, having any fuch Alien or Aliens ou Board, fhall not fuffer any fuch Alien or Aliens to land within any Part of this Kingdom, contrary to fuch Proclamation of Order in Council, unless by the express Permition of His Majefty, fignified under the Hand of One of His Majefty's Principal Secretaries of State; and every fuch Mafter or Commander, wilfully neglect-

shall forfeit FIFTY POUNDS for every Alien fo landed, to be recovered as therein mentioned; and fuch Ship or Veffel from on Board of which any fuch Alien or Aliens shall fo land, and every other Veffel or Boat used in landing fuch Alien or Aliens, shall and may be feized by any Officer or Officers of the Cuttoms or Excife, and the fame shall respectively be forfeited, together with all Tackle, Apparel, Ammunition and Furniture thereunto respectively belonging : His Majestv, for the Safety and Tranquillity of this Kingdom, hata thought fit, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is by His Majefty, by and with fuch Advice, and under the Authority of the faid Acts of Parliament, hereby accordingly ordered, That from and after the Publication of this Order in the London Gazette, no Alien of Aliens on Board of any Ship or Veffel or Boat, coming or arriving directly or immediately from any Port or Place in France, or any Port or Place under the Dominion of the Perions exercifing the Powers of Government in France, or from any Port or Place of or in, or belonging to any Country or Territory at War with Great Britain, shall (until His Majefty's Royal Pleafure concerning fuch Aliens fhall be further expressed) be landed, or be suffered by the Mafter or Commander of any fuch Ship, Veffel or Boat to land, at any Port or Place within this Kingdom, except at the Ports of Yarmouth, Haring to conform to any of the Directions or Regu- | wich, Daver and Southampton, and at Gravefend, unless
