

Whitehall, April 14, 1796.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that, about the Hour of Three in the Morning of the 10th Instant, being the Time of High Water in the River Thames, a Set of desperate Villains, supposed to be Four in Number, broke into the Dwelling-House of Mr. William Sawyer, Bargemaster to His Majesty, in Bishop's Walk, Lambeth, and, after rifling the House, most inhumanly murdered Mrs. Ann Sawyer, the Wife of the said William Sawyer, an aged and infirm Woman, by stabbing her in several Places, and beating out one of her Eyes:

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the above-mentioned inhuman Murder, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, who shall discover his Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
