

Whitehall, April 23, 1796.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that on Wednesday last John Sheffield, a Corporal of the Worcestershire Regiment of Militia, was assaulted and beaten, whilst on Duty, by a riotous Body of Miners, about Three Miles from Truro, on the Turnpike Road leading from thence to Redruth:

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in so assaulting and beating the said Corporal, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the Person who first assaulted and beat the said John Sheffield) who shall discover his, her or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

And, as a further Encouragement, a Reward of FIFTY GUINEAS is hereby offered to any Person or Persons who shall discover his or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, (except as before excepted) to be paid by the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury upon the Conviction of any one or more of the Offenders.
