P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the 4th of November last, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pot-Ash or Pearl-Ash, (except as in the said Order is mentioned) will expire upon the 7th Day of this instant May: And whereas it is judged expedient that the said Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer; His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Person or Persons whosoever do, at any Time, during the Space of Six Months from the said 7th Day of this instant May, export, or attempt to export, transport, carry or convey, or lade or lay on Board of any Ship, Vessel or Boat, in order to be exported, transported, carried or conveyed out of this Kingdom, any Pot-Ash or Pearl-Ash, without Leave or Permission being first had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act passed in the Thirty-fourth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for indemnifying
" all Persons who have been concerned in advising
" or carrying into Execution an Order of the Lords
" Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury respecting the Exportation of Pot-Ashes or Pearl Ashes;
" for preventing Suits in consequence of the same;

" for authorizing His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation or carrying Coastwise of Pot-Ashes or Pearl-Ashes, and for making further Provisions relative thereto." But it is nevertheless His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to prevent the Exportation of the said Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark or Man, or to His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies; provided that, upon the Exportation of the said Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark or Man, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of the said Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the same to the Places for which they shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the same shall be made, and do give full and sufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the said Articles to the Places for which they are so entered Outwards, and none other; and such Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made,

to the Satisfaction of the said Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the said Commissioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in such Form and Manner as shall be directed by the said Commissioners, shewing that the said Articles have been duly landed at the Places for which they were entered Outwards.—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in this present Session of Parliament, intituled, "An Act
" for indemnifying all Persons who have been concerned in advising or carrying into Execution an
" Order of His Majesty in Council respecting the
" Exportation of Rock Salt; for preventing Suits
" in consequence of the same; for authorizing His
" Majesty to prohibit the Exportation or carrying
" Coastwise of Rock Salt; and for making further
" Provisions relative thereto;" it is enacted, That His Majesty may, by Proclamation or Order in Council, when he shall see Cause, and for such Time as shall be therein expressed, prohibit the exporting or carrying Coastwise, or the attempting to export or carry Coastwise, any Sort of Rock Salt whatsoever: And His Majesty, judging it necessary to prohibit the Exportation of Rock Salt, doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, under the Authority of the said Act, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Person or Persons whatsoever do at any Time, during the Space of Six Months from the Date of this Order in Council, export or attempt to export, transport, carry or convey, or load or lay on board of any Ship, Vessel or Boat, in order to be exported, transported, carried or conveyed out of any Port or Place in Great Britain, any Sort of Rock Salt whatsoever, without Leave or Permission first being had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by aforementioned Act: His Majesty, nevertheless, by the Advice aforesaid, hath thought fit to order, that nothing herein contained shall prevent Rock Salt being carried Coastwise under the usual Rules, Re-

gulations and Restrictions, nor the Exportation of the same to Ireland, or to any other of His Majesty's Dominions, under the usual Conditions and Regulations, and upon Security being given, by the Exporter and Two other Persons, (of whom the Master of the Vessel shall be one) by Bond, in such Penalty as shall be directed by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, that the said Rock Salt shall be exported to some Port or Place in His Majesty's Dominions, and none other; and that a Certificate shall be produced within Six Months from the Date of the Bond, if such Rock Salt shall be entered out for any Part of His Majesty's Dominions in Europe, and within Twelve Months if for any Part of His Majesty's Dominions in America or the West Indies, and within Eighteen Months if for any of the British Settlements or Factories in Asia or Africa, under the Hand of the Principal Officer of the Customs at the Port or Place where such Rock Salt shall be so landed; and if there shall be no Officer of the Customs, then under the Hand of the Chief Magistrate of the Place, testifying that the said Rock Salt has been duly landed at the Port or Place for which the same was entered out. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

Copy of a Letter from Vice-Admiral Kingsmill, Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels at Cork, to Evan Nepean, Esq; dated L'Engageante, Cork Harbour, May 5, 1796.

S I R,

I Have the Pleasure to acquaint you, for the Information of my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that a French National Cutter, (L'Abeille) of Fourteen Guns and Seventy Men, is just brought in here, captured by His Majesty's Ship Dryad, Captain Pulling, on Monday last, the Lizard bearing North Half East, Sixteen or Seventeen Leagues, Uthant S.S.W. Thirteen Leagues; the other Ships of the Squadron then in Chace of a Corvette, which there was every Probability of their coming up with.

The Dryad had before taken a large Smuggling Cutter, laden with Spirits, and sent her to Plymouth.

Mr. Fairweather, one of the Mates of the Dryad who has Command of the Cutter L'Abeille, informs me, that she had only been out Three Days from Brest, and had not taken any Thing. She is Three Years old, coppered, and appears well found; and shall be sent by the earliest Opportunity to Plymouth.

Copy of a Letter from Admiral Sir Peter Parker, Bart. Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels at Portsmouth and Spithead, to Evan Nepean, Esq; dated Royal William, at Spithead, May 7, 1796.

S I R,

PLEASE to acquaint their Lordships, that His Majesty's Sloop the Ratler returned to Spithead this Morning, with the Pichegru French Privateer, of Ten Guns and Thirty-four Men, belonging to Havre, which she captured Yesterday Noon off Cherbourg, after a Chace of Eight Hours.

Whitehall, May 3, 1796.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that on Friday the 8th of April last a Number of Persons came in a riotous and unlawful Manner to the House of John Carter, at Carneggy, in the Parish of Breage, in the County of Cornwall, Farmer, and violently assaulted Richard Harvey, Richard Williams, Joseph Thomas, and John Williams, the Servants of the said John Carter, by beating them with Sticks, and by fixing a Rope around their Necks, and dragging them about therewith, to the great Injury of their Persons and Danger of their Lives, and afterwards left the following Notice nailed up upon the Premises of the said John Carter's House:

"This is to give notice that if the Inhabitants of this House is not home tomorrow morning by ten o'clock in the forenoon they may expect to see it all broken open, and levelled to Ground."

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Person or Persons concerned in assaulting and beating, or attempting to fix the said Rope round the Necks of the said Richard Harvey, Joseph Thomas, Richard Williams, and John Williams, in Manner aforesaid, and for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Person or Persons concerned in

writing and nailing up the said Notice, is hereby pleased to promise his most gracious Pardon to any one of them (except the Person or Persons who actually fixed the said Rope around the Necks of the said Richard Harvey, Joseph Thomas, Richard Williams, and John Williams, or either of them, and the Person or Persons who actually wrote or nailed up the said Notice) who shall discover his or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

And, as a further Encouragement, a Reward of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS is hereby offered to any Person or Persons making such Discovery as aforesaid, (except as is before excepted) to be paid by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, upon the Conviction of any one or more of the Offenders.

And, as a further Encouragement, a Reward of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS is hereby offered to any Person or Persons making such Discovery as aforesaid, (except as is before excepted) to be paid by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury upon the Conviction of any one or more of the Offenders.
