PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. THEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the 4th of November laft, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pot-Ath or Pearl Ath, (except as in the faid Order is mentioned) will expire upon the 7th Day of this inftant May : And whereas it is judged expedient that the faid Prohibi tion (hould be continued for fome Time longer; His Majefty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whofoever do, at any Time, during the Space of Six Months from the faid 7th Day of this inftant May, export, or attempt to export, transport, carry or convey, or lade or lay on Board of any Ship, Veffel or Boat, in order to be exported, transported, carried or conveyed out of this Kingdom, any Pot-Afh or Pearl-Afh, without Leave or Permission being first had and obtained from His Majefly or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act paffed in the Thirty-fourth Year of His Majefly's Reign, intituled, " An Act for indemnifying " all Perfons who have been concerned in advifing " or carrying into Execution an Order of the Lords " Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury refpect-" ing the Exportation of Pot-Afhes or Pearl-Afhes ; " for preventing Suits in confequence of the fame ;

" for authorizing His Majefty to prohibit the Ex-" portation or carrying Coaftwife of Pot-Afhes or " Pearl-Afhes, and for making further Provisions " relative thereto." But it is neverthelefs His Majefty's Pleafure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be confirued to extend, to prevent the Exportation of the faid Articles to Ireland, or to His Majefty's Hlands of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark or Man, or to His Majefty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the Weft Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies ; provided that, upon the Exportation of the faid Articles to Ireland, or to His Majefty's Iflands of Guernfey; Jerfey, Alderney, Sark or Man, or to His Majefty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the Weft Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of the faid Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the fame to the Places for which they shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the fame shall be made, and do give full and sufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commit fioners of His Majelty's Cultoms, to carry the faid Articles to the Places for which they are fo entered Outwards, and none other; and fuch Bond fhall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made,

to the Satisfaction of the faid Commiffioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commiffioners, and fpecified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in fuch Form and Manner as fhall be directed by the faid Commiffioners, fhewing that the faid Articles have been duly landed at the Places for which they were entered Outwards.—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury, the Commiffioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the neceffary Directions herein, as to them may refpectively appertain.

An Act for raifing the Sum of Seven Millions Five Hundred Thoufand Pounds by way of Annuities.

An Act for further continuing, for a limited Time, an Act, made in the Twenty-feventh Year of the Reign of His prefent Majefty, initialed, An Act to enable the Lord High Treafurer or Commissioners of the Treafury, for the Time being, to lett to Farm the Duties granted by an Act, made in the Twentyfifth Year of His prefent Majefty's Reign, on Horles lett to Hire for travelling Post and by Time, to such Perfons as should be willing to contract for the fame.

An Act for charging the Duty on Mahogany imported by Weight.

An Act for repealing the Stamp Duties on Licences to fell Cloves and Mittens by Retail.

An Act for reducing the Duty payable on Black Lead imported into this Kingdom.

An Act more effectually to prevent the landing of Goods, Wares and Merchandizes without the Prefence of the proper Officer; to authorize Officers of the Cuftoms to convey Wines laying on the Quays to His Majefty's Warehoufe within a certain Time after the landing thereof; and to require the Owners of Ships, Veffels and Boats, licenfed by the Admiralty, to give Security to re-deliver their Licences, in cafe any fuch Ships, Veffels or Boats shall be lost, broken up, or otherwife difforded of.

An Act for allowing the Importation of Melaffes from any Country in British Ships or Vessels, and in

to the Satisfaction of the faid Commissioners, by the Ships or Vessels belonging to any State in Amity Production within a Time to be fixed by the faid with His Majesty, for a limited Time.

An Act for the better Regulation of Mills.

An Act to prevent Abufes and Frauds in the Packing, Weight and Sale of Butter; and to repeal certain Acts relating thereto.

An Act to indemnify all Perfons who have acted in confequence of Orders in Council, iffued fince the Twenty-fecond Day of November, One thoufand feven hundred and ninety-five, for the Admiffion of certain Articles of Merchandize in Neutral Snips; and to authorize the iffuing of Orders in Council for the like Purpoles for a limited Time.

## Horfe Guards, May 14, 1796.

\*HE following Extract of a Letter from Briga-dier-General Nicols, dated Port Royal, Grenada, March 28, 1796, to Lieutenant-General Sir Ralph Abercromby, K. B. has been transmitted by the latter to the Right Hon. Henry Dundas, One of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

Had the Honor of writing to your Excellency on 1 the 24th Initant; that Day I got on Shore the Detachments of the 8th and 63d Regiments, with a Part of the 3d or Buffs : I alfo got 'I'wo Six-Pounders and a Five and Half Inch Howitzer to a Ridge South of Port Royal, and diftant about 1000 Yards; a Battery was made in the Night, by the great Exertions of Brevet Major O'Mara, of the 38th Regiment, fo that by Day-Light it opened upon the Enemy's Redoubt. We faw the Howitzer difconcert them very much; but as it was our Object to clofe with them as foon as poffible, I had deter-mined to get on the fame Ridge with them, or, it I faw an Opening, to attempt the Redoubt by Affault: For this Purpole I thought it neceffary to try to diflodge fome ftrong Parties of the Enemy, which we l

faw posted on the Fleights on our Left, as if intending to turn or diffrefs that Flank ; I accordingly detached a firong Black Corps, with 50 of the 88th Regiment, the Whole under Major Houston; owing to the Difficulty of the Ground, it was near Two Hours before they could get near the Enemy, when a heavy but distant Fire commenced on both Sides. I had previoufly concerted with him, that in cafe of attaining a particular Point, which would have covered our Approach to Port Royal, he was to make a Signal, on which the Light Company of the Buffs, the Detachments of the 8th and 63d Regiments, under the Command of Lieutenant-Colonel Dawfon, were to advance, while the Part of the Battalion of the Buffs that had landed were to form a Referve, the Whole under Brigadier-General Campbell; but fo far from diflodging the Enemy, I faw with Regret our Black Corps and the 88th Regi-ment retiring, Major Houlton having tried, with-out Succefs, to accomplifh the Object he was fent on : This obliged me to detach the 8th Regiment to fupport them, which it did effectually. At this Moment an alarming Fire broke out in our Rear, near the Place where all the Stores we had landed were deposited ; but by the Exertions of our Peo-ple, under the Orders of Lieutenant-Colonel Dyott, they were all preferved. In the Midft of those untoward Circumstances we heard a Firing from our Ships of War that lay at Anchor, and were foon informed it was at Two French Schooners that were making into Marquis; the Truth of this was foon confirmed, for we faw them enter and anchor. I had one of the Six-Pounders turned on them, as they were well within Reach, but unluckily we never ftruck them. The Situation of Affairs was now fo critical that an Inftant was not to be loft. I accordingly directed Brigadier-General Campbell to proceed to the Aflault, and I brought up every Thing in my Power to fupport him: He therefore advanced with only the Buffs and 63d Regiment, the 8th having, as I before stated, been detached on another Service. I ordered up Half of the 29th Regiment to replace them, and Half of the 9th alfo to affift if necefiary ; but the 29th, that I had to bring from Grand Bacolet, though they came as foon as poffible, did not join him till after the Buffs had met with a Check, from the Advantage the Enemy had of the Ground, and from a very galling Fire to which they were exposed; they however foon formed again under the Cover of a Hedge, and being then joined by the 29th Regiment, under Captain Clavy, Brigadier-General Campbell ordered the Whole to advance to the Aflault, which they did in the most determined Manner, led by the Brigadier himself. They foon gained the Top of the Ridge, the Enemy then ran towards their Redoubt, and were followed by our People, who fcrambled in at the Embrafures, Captain Clavy, of the 29th Regiment, being the first that entered. The Enemy then slew in the utmost Terror in all Directions, fome throwing themfelves down Precipices, whilft others tried to escape down the Hill, through Brush and other Wood ; but there was fo heavy a Fire kept on them from the Top by our People, that they were forced to try to escape along a Bottom, where the Detachment of the Light Dragoons, under Captain Black, and the St. George's Troop of Light Cavalry, under Captain M. Burney, (that had previoufly been formed under the Hill to profit of any Occafion that offered) feeing the En my flying, rushed on them through a Fire of Grape from the French Schooner, and

and cut down every Man they faw, fo that very few, if any, escaped that had been in Port Royal. That Poil was chiefly garrifoned, as I hear, from the few Prifoners we have taken, by the Sans Culotte Com-panies from Guadaloupe. We have to regret the Loss of fome gallant Men, and of Two Officers, Major Edwards and Lieutenant Williams of the 3d, who fell, leading their Men on most spiritedly. Colonel Dawfon, at the Head of the 3d, was wounded through the Neck, before they got to the Bottom of Port Royal Hill. Major Bailhe, of the 63d Regiment, was then next in Command to Brigadier-General Campbell, whole Conduct the General reports to be fleady, collected and Officer-like. The Command of the 3d devolved on Captain Blunt, whofe Light Company, as leading the first Attack, fuffered feverely. Both he, as oldest Captain, and Lieutenant Gardner, I beg Leave to recommend to your Excellency's Notice and Favor. We have taken but Six Prifoners; among them are the Second and Third in Command to Mr. Joffey, who com-mands the People that came from Guadaloupe. Inclofed is a Return of our Killed and Wounded. Our Succefs at Port Royal has been followed by the Evacuation of Pilot Hill by the Enemy.
