For Diffelving this prefent Parliament, and declaring the Calling of another.

GEORGE R.

WHEREAS We have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to diffolve this prefent Parliament, which now ftands prorogued to Tuesday the Fifth Day of July next: We do, for that End, publish this Our Royal Proclamation; and do hereby diffolve the faid Parliament accordingly. And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens and Burgeffes, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs, of the House of Commons, are discharged from their Meeting and Attendance on Tuesday the faid Fifth Day of July next. And We being defirous and refolved, as foon as may be, to meet Our People, and to have their Advice in Parliament, do hereby make known to all Our loving Subjects Our Royal Will and Pleafure to call a New Parliament: And do hereby further declare, that, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, We have this Day given Order to Our Chancellor of Great Britain to isfue out Writs, in due Form, for calling a New Parliament ; which Writs are to bear Tefte on Saturday the Twenty-first Day of this

A PROCLAMATION, In order to the Electing and Summoning the Sixteen Peers of Scotland.

GEORGE R.

WHEREAS We have, in Our Council, thought fit to declare Our Pleafure, for Summoning and Holding a Parliament of Great Britain, on Tuefday the Twelfth Day of July next enfuing the Date hereof: In order, therefore, to the Electing and Summoning the Sixteen Peers of Scotland, who are to fit in the Houfe of Peers in the faid Parliament, We do, by the Advice of Our Privy Council, iffue forth this Our Royal Proclamation, flrictly charging and commanding all the Peers of Scotland to affemble and meet at Holy-Rood Houfe, in Edinburgh, on Thurfday the Thirtieth Day of June next enfuing, between the Hours of Twelve and Two in the Affernooa, to nominate and choofe the Sixteen Sixteen Peers, to fit and vote in the Houfe of Peers, 1 in the faid enfuing Parliament, by open Election and Plurality of Voices of the Peers which shall be then prefent, and of the Proxies of fuch as shall be abfent, (fuch Proxies being Peers, and producing a Mandate in Writing duly figned before Witneffes, and both the Conftituent and Proxy being qualified according to Law.) And the Lord Clerk Register, or fuch Two of the Principal Clerks of the Seffion, as thall be appointed by him to officiate in his Name, are hereby refpectively required to attend fuch Meeting, and to administer the Oaths required by Law to be taken there by the faid Peers, and to take their Votes; and, immediately after fuch Election made, and duly examined, to certify the Names of the Sixteen Peers fo elected, and fign and atteft the fame, in the Prefence of the faid Peers the Electors; and return fuch Certificate into Our High Court of Chancery of Great Britain. And We do, by this Our Proclamation, flrictly command and require the Provost of Edinburgh, and all other the Magistrates of the faid City, to take efpecial Care to preferve the Peace thereof during the Time of the faid Election; and to prevent all Manner of Riots, Tumults, Diforders and Violence whatfoever. And We strictly charge and command, that this Our Royal Proclamation be duly published at the Market Crofs at Edinburgh, and in all the County Towns of Scotland, Twenty-five Days at leaft before the Time hereby appointed for the Meeting of the faid Peers to proceed to fuch Election.
