### May it please your Majesty,

WE, your Majefty's moit loyal, dutiful and affectionate Subjects, the Ministers and Elders of the Church of Scotland, met in the General Affembly of this National Church, beg Leave to take this earlieft Opportunity which our annual Meeting affords us of prefenting our most fincere and heartfelt Congratulations upon your Majesty's late providential Deliverance from the Attack made by wicked and daring Affaffins; an Attack the more peculiarly difgraceful to the Times in which we live, in having been made upon your facred Perfon, when in the Difcharge of one of the moft important Duties entrusted to your Majesty by the Constitution. Imprefied as we have ever been with the ftrongeft and most unalterable Sentiments of Respect and Attachment to your Majelty's Perfon and Government, we have feen, with the deepest Concern and Astonishment, the Views of the feditious and difaffected, manifeftly difplayed in an Act of fuch daring Atrocity.

We have however obferved, with the highest Satisfaction, that the feveral Branches of the Legiflature, theConftitutional Guardians of the public Interest, have concurred in the Adoption of fuch Laws as we truft will, under the Influence of Divine Providence, have the Effect of enfuring the Safety of your Majerty's Perfon, repressing the Machinations of feditious and difaffected Men, and of fecuring the true Liberty, Happinefs and Tranquillity of thefe Kingdoms.

That the manifold Advantages which we and our Forefathers have long enjoyed under that Form of Government, administered by your Majefty and the other Princes of your Illustrious House, may be transmitted entire to the lateft Posterity ; and that your Majefty may long continue to reign over a free,
