7 HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefly's Order in Council of the 2d of December latt, for prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwise, Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the 7th Day of this inflant June: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer; His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Person or Persons whatsoever (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service) do, at any T'me during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid 7th Day of this instant June, prefume to transport, into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwife, any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder or Salt-Petie, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the same Coastwife, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty, or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act paffed in the Twenty ninth Year of His late Majefly's Reign, intituled, " An Act to impower His Majesty to pro-

- " hibit the Exportation of Salt-Petre, and to enforce
- " the Law for impowering His Majesty to prohibit
- " the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of
- " Arms or Ammunition; and also to empower His
- " Majesty to restrain the carrying Coastwise of Salt-
- " Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Am-" munition:" - And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General of the Ordnance, and His Majetly's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

THEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the 2d of December last, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom any of the Wood called Lignum Vitæ, will expire upon the 10th Day of this inflant June: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesly's Service that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer; His Majefly doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Courcil, hereby order, require, prehibit and command,

any Time, for the Space of Six Months from the faid 10th Day of this inftant June, export, or attempt to export, transport, carry or convey, or lade or lay on Board of any Ship, Vessel or Boat, in order to be exported, transported, carried or conveyed out of this Kingdom, any of the Wood called Lignum Vitæ, without Leave or Permission being first had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forseitures inflicted by an Act passed in the Thirty-fourth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Act for indemni-" fying all Perfons who have been concerned in " advising or carrying into Execution an Order of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Trea-" fury respecting the Exportation of Pot-Ashes or " Pearl-Ashes; for preventing Suits in consequence " of the same; for authorizing His Majesty to pro-" hibit the Exportation or carrying Coastwife of " Pot-Ashes or Pearl-Ashes, and for making further " Provisions relative thereto." But it is nevertheless His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to prevent any Ship or Vessel from taking or having on Board any of the faid Wood called Lignum Vitæ, which may be necessary for the Use of the said Ship or Vessel during the Course of her intended Voyage; nor to prevent the Exportation of the faid Wood called Lignum Vitæ to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark or Man, or to His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies; provided that, upon the Exportation of the faid Wood called Lignum Vitæ to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark or Man, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majetty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of the faid Wood called Lignum Vitæ do first make Oath of the true Destination of the same to the Places for which it shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the same shall be made, and do give full and sufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfac tion of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Cuftoms, to carry the faid Wood called Lignum Vitæ to the Places for which it is fo entered Outwards, and none other; an I fuch Bond shall not be canamora to a mar-

mand, that no Person or Persons whosoever do, at | celled or delivered up until Proof bemade, to the Satisfaction of the faid Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commissioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in such Form and Manner as shall be directed by the said Commissioners, shewing that the faid Wood called Lignum Vitæ has been duly landed at the Places for which it was entered Outwards .- And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majetty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

Extract of a Dispatch from Mr. Fraser to Lord Grenville, dated Hamburgh, May 27, 1796.

Nformation has been received here from Amfterdam, of the 24th Instant, that, in consequence of the late Disturbance in that City, the French General Bournonville had thought it adviseable to propose putting a considerable Number of French Troops in Garrison in that City; that that Measure had at first met with much Opposition on the Part of the Burghers of that City, who had claimed to themfelves the Right of fettling their own Difpute without the Interference of the French Military; that how-ever they had been obliged to yield; and that a confiderable Body of French Troops had actually marched nto Amsterdam.

Whitehall, June 11.

BY a Dispatch from Major-General Gordon Forbes D to the Right Hon. Henry Dandas, One of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, dated Mole St. Nicolas, S. Domingo, April 10, 1796, it appears, that a Divilion of British and Colonial Troops from the Garrison at Port au Prince were embarked, on the 17th and 18th of March, in order to proceed against the Town and Fortress of Leogane in the same Island. The Troops were landed on the 21th, and a Firing was opened on the following Day from a temporary Battery, which had been constructed. The Enemy having brought their heavy Artillery to flank this Battery, it was obliged to be abandoned, with the Lofs of One Six-Pounder difabled, and another fpiked and left behind. On this Occasion Lieutenant Bingham, of the Artillery, loft his Arm, and that Corps, which behaved remarkably well, fuffered fome trifling Lofs. A very heavy Fire had been maintained during the greatest Part of the 22d from the Ships of War against the Town and Forts; but no Impression whatever having been made by them, and the Placeappearing much stronger than it had been reprefented, the Forces were judged inadequate to the Enterprize, and the Troops, Stores, Guns, and Ammunition of every Kind, were therefore reimbarked, without further Loss or Accident.

Extract of a Letter from Rear-Admiral Parker, Commander in Chief of His Mayesty's Ships, &c. at Jamaica, to Mr. Nepean, dated Swiftfure, at Port au Prince, March 27, 1796.

FOR their Lordships Information I beg Leave to acquaint you, that, agreeably to my Letter of the 28th Ultimo, I proceeded to Port au Prince with General Forbes, where, upon our Arrival, a Meeting was called of the General Officers, and the Pro-

pofal for attacking Leogane discussed.

On the 21st the Army was landed, in Two Divisions, to the Eastward and Westward of the Fort and Town, covered to the Westward by the Cercs and Lark, and to the Eastward by the Iphigenia, and Cormorant and Serin Sloops, with the Africa and Leviathan placed against the Fort, and the Swiftsure to cannonade the Town. The Fire of the latter was interrupted in the Course of Half an Hour from the Situation of the Army on Shore; but the Two former kept up an unremitting Cannonade, for near

Four Hours, against the Fort, until Dark, and the Land Wind coming fresh, the Ships were moved off

to a proper Anchorage.

The Day following the Army were chiefly employed reconnoitering, and the next Day, from what they had observed and the Intelligence gained, the Enemy were found fo exceedingly numerous that it was refolved beit for His Majefty's Service to reimbark the Army, &c. and postpone the Operations

for the present.

In the Course of the Night, and by Noon the next Day, the Artillery, Army, &c. were reimbarked; but, I am forry to add, that the Army lost a few Men, and that the Africa had One Man killed and Seven wounded; and the Leviathan Five killed and Twelve wounded, Two fince dead, with Damage done to the Masts and Yards of both Ships, insomuch that they must go down to Jamaica to have them made good.
