A^T the Court at St. James's, the 1st of June, 1796,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majerty in Council. 7 HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefly's Order in Council of the 2d of December lait, for prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coaftwife, Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the 7th Day of this inflant June: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefly's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be centinued for some Time longer; His Majefty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whatfoever (except the Mafter-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service) do, at any Time during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid 7th Day of this inftant June, prefume to transport, into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwife, any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or fhip or lade any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the fame into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coaftwife, without Leave or Permifiion in that Behalf first obtained from His Majefty, or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the refpective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act paffed in

the Twenty-ninth Year of His late Majefty's Reign intituled, " An Act to impower His Majefty to pro-" hibit the Exportation of Salt-Petre, and to enforce " the Law for impowering His Majefty to prohibit " the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of " Arms or Ammunition ; and alfo to empower His " Majefty to reftrain the carrying Coaftwife of Salt-" Petre, Gunpowd r, or any Sort of Arms or Am-" munition :" - And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treasury, the Commiffioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Mafter-General of the Ordnance, and His Majelly's Secretary at War, are to give the neceffary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.
