ARTICLES of CAPITULATION of the Ifland of St. Lucia.

I. THE Island of St. Lucia, the Morne Fortuné,

and it's Dependencies, together with all Effects belonging to the French Republic, shall be faithfully delivered to the Generals of the British Forces.

Anfwer .- Agreed to.

II. Property and Perfons of every Defcription fhall be placed under the Protection of the Laws; and Paffports shall be granted to fuch Perfons as may wifh to leave the Ifland,

Anfwer .- All Property and Inhabitants will be fubject to and under the Protection of the English Laws. Perfons withing to quit the Island must obtain the Permission of the Governor or Commander of the Island.

III. No Inhabitant fhall be disturbed, molested or banifhed, on Account of his Opinions, or for having held any Place under the French Republic.

Answer .- Agreed to, as answered in the Second Article.

IV. The Agent General, the Commander in Chief, and the Forces of the Republic, who have defended the Ifland, fhall march out with the Honors of War, and deliver their Arms; the Officers only being allowed to keep their Swords: They shall be treated as Prisoners of War, and fent back to France as foon as poffible.

Anfwer .- The first Part of this Article granted, but the Troops must remain Prisoners of War until exchanged.

V. The British Forces shall take Possession of the Morne Fortuné at the Hour which may be appointed for that Purpofe, and the French Garrifon shall march out with their Arms and Baggage, Drums beating and Colours flying.

Anfwer .- The Fort to be put into the Poffeffion of the British Troops To-morrow at Noon; the Garrifon to march out of the Fort in the Manner defired. The Garrison to occupy Houses in the Neighbourhood of the Fort, until Veffels can be provided for their Reception.

VI. The Garrifon shall pile their Arms at the Place which may be appointed for that Purpofe, and

Anfwer .- The Arms to be piled on the Glacis without the Fort. Anfwer has already been given as to the Difpofal of the Garrison. The Officers may dispose of their Wives and Children as they pleafe.

VII. The Agent General of the Executive Directory, his Aides de Camp, Secretary, and other Perfons attached to him, fhall be allowed to keep all Papers and Effects belonging to his Office, The fame Favor shall be granted to the Commander in Chief and all the Officers of the Garrifon.

Anfwer .- Agreed to; but all Papers relating to the State of the Island, Public Works, and all Plans and Maps, to be given up.

VIII. The Volunteers, ferving with the French Forces, shall be allowed to keep their Knapfacks.

Anfwer .- Agreed to, according to the Return given in by the Commander in Chief.

IX. No Perfon shall be plundered, or infulted on Account of the Opinions he has hitherto profeffed.

Anfwer .- Agreed to.

X. Two Veffels of the Republic lying in the Harbour, shall be granted to the Agent of the Executive Directory to ferve as covered Boats. The Crews of these Two Vessels shall however be confidered as Prifoners of War.

Anfwer .- Refused ; but every Accommodation that can be defired by the Agent General of the Executive Directory shall be granted,

XI. The Inhabitants of every Colour shall be allowed to return immediately to their refpective Homes, without Infult or Moleftation,

Anfwer .- Agreed to.

XII. The Sick and Wounded of the Garrison shall be taken Care of in the fame Manner as the English, and on their Recovery shall be entitled to the fame Terms as the other Prifoners.

Anfwer .- Agreed to.

XIII. All the Articles of this Capitulation fhall be faithfully and firictly obferved by both Parties.

Anfwer .- Agreed to.

ADDITIONAL ARTICLE.

Proper Officers to be named by the Agent General and Commander in Chief to take the neceffary Orders for the Surrender of Gros Iflet, Souffrière, and Vieux Fort, and other Pofts that may be occupied in the Island. The Means of Conveyance shall be found for the faid Officers. Stores and Provisions of all Kinds to be delivered by the French Commistaries
