HIS Majesty in Council was this Day pleased to order the Right Honourable the Lord High Chancellor to issue Writs for proroguing the Parliament, which was appointed to meet on Tuesday the Twelfth Day of this instant July, to Tuesday the Sixteenth Day of August next; and also for proroguing the Convocations of Canterbury and York, which were appointed to meet on Wednesday the Thirteenth Day of this instant July, to Wednesday the Seventeenth Day of the said Month of August.

AT the Court at St. *James's*, the 29th of June, 1796,

P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS His Majesty was graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Twenty-sixth Day of December, 1792, to promise and declare, that the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majesty's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed to every such Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the Twenty-eighth Day of February

then following, enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majesty's Ships or Vessels, or Officers employed on Shore for raising Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majesty was also graciously pleased, by his said Proclamation, to declare, that all Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should so enter themselves as aforesaid, should receive the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, as His Majesty's Royal Bounty: And whereas His Majesty was also graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of the said Month of February, 1793, to promise and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman, fit to serve on board His Majesty's Ships, should be paid to any Person who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who might conceal him or themselves, so that such Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's Service, on or before the Thirtieth Day of April then next, by any of His Majesty's Sea Officers appointed to raise Men on Shore, or by the Captains or Commanders of any of His Majesty's Ships or Vessels in the Ports or on the Coasts of this Kingdom: And whereas the Time limited by the said Proclamations for Payment of the said Bounties and Reward, hath been prolonged and extended to the Thirtieth Day of this

this instant June; and it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service that the said Bounties and Reward should be continued to be paid for some Time longer; His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the said Bounties and Reward be prolonged and extended, from the said Thirtieth Day of this instant June to the Thirty-first Day of August next, inclusive: Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly.

Copy of a Letter from Vice-Admiral King'smill, Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels on the Coast of Ireland, to Mr. Nepean, dated L'Engageante, Cork Harbour, June 29, 1796.

S I R,

I Have the Satisfaction of acquainting you, for the Information of my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that the Whole of the Squadron which had sailed from Brest under the Orders of Comodore Moulton, is in our Possession; La Legère, a fine coppered Ship Corvette of 22 Guns, being now brought in here by His Majesty's Ship Apollo and Doris; further Particulars of which are contained in the accompanying Letter to me from Captain Manley. Separated as those French Ships were, the capturing of them all is a rare Instance of Success, and a Proof of the Activity of His Majesty's Cruizers on this Station. I have the Honor to be,

Copy of a Letter from Captain Manley, of His Majesty's Ship Apollo, to Vice-Admiral King'smill, dated Cork Harbour, June 29, 1796.

S I R,

A Greecably to your Order of the 21st Ultimo, I cruized in His Majesty's Ship under my Command, accompanied by His Majesty's Ship Doris, until the 22d Instant; and at Nine o'Clock in the Morning of that Day, in Latitude 48 deg. 30 min. North, and Longitude 8 deg. 28 min. West, discovered the French Nationale Corvette La Legère very close to us to Windward. We immediately gave Chace, with the Wind at W. N. W. blowing a double-reefed Topfail Gale, but, from her being a very fast Sailer, did not arrive within Gunshot until Seven o'Clock in the Evening, at which Time the Two Ships were a like Distance from her, and, after exchanging a few Shot, we had the Satisfaction to see her strike her Colours.

She is Copper-fastened and Copper-bottomed, and a remarkable fine Ship, possessing every good Quality for a Man of War. She is commanded by Mons. Carpentier, has 168 Men on Board, and is pierced for 22 Guns, Nine-Pounders.

She sailed from Brest on the 4th Instant, in Company with Three Frigates, and has taken Six Prizes,

I am very much pleased to find that the whole Division are taken by the Squadron under your Command.
