WTHEREAS it, has been reprefented to His Majefty at this Board, that in confequence of the Progrefs of the French Arms in the Territories of the Grand Duke of Tuscany, the Payment of Bills of Exchange, drawn or negociated in the Town of Leghorn, may be deemed unlawful, by virtue of the Provisions contained in an Act paffed in the Thirty-fourth Year of His Majefty's Reign, intituled, " An Act for preventing Money " or Effects in the Hands of His Majefty's Subjects, " belonging to or difpofeable by Perfons refident in " France, being applied to the Ufe of the Perfons " exercifing the Powers of Government in France; 11 and for preferving the Property thereof for the " Benefit of the individual Owners thereof;" and in an Act paffed in the fame Seffion, intituled, "An " Act for more effectually preferving Money or " Effects in the Hands of His Majetty's Subjects, " belonging to or difposeable by Perfons refident in " France, for'the Benefit of the individual Owners " thereof;" unless His Majesty shall licence the Payment of fuch Bills, in purfuance of the Powers given by the faid feveral Acts; His Majefty, taking the fame into His Royal Confideration, is pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, That it shall be lawful for any Perfon refiding or being in Great Britain to pay any Bill drawn or indorfed in the faid Town of Leghorn, and fent from thence on or before the Day on which the Armies of France entered the faid Town of Leghorn ; provided fuch Bill shall have been made payable at no greater Diftance of 'Time than Ufance of Three Months from the Date thereof, or Three Months from Sight thereof; provided also that all and every Perfon and Perfons, who fhall take the Benefit of fuch Licence hereby granted, "flight fo take the fame, upon Condition, that in cafe of any Proceeding, Criminal or Civil, under the 'Provisions of the faid Acts of Parliament, or either of them, for any Thing alledged to have been done con trary thereto, any Queffion shall arise, whether the Thing fo done was authorized by the Licence hereby given, the Proof that fuch Thing was done, "ander the particular Circumstances, and according 

to the fpecial Terms and Conditions required by this Order, fhall lie on the Perfons claiming the Benefit of fuch Licence.

The KING's Moft Excellent Majefty in Council.

HEREAS His Majefty was gracioufly pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Twenty-fixth Day of December, 1792, to promise and declare, that the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majesty's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed to every fuch Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who fhould, on or before the Twenty-eighth Day of February then following, enter themfelves to ferve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majefty's Ships or Veffels, or Officers employed on Shore for raifing Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majefty was also graciously pleased, by his faid Proclamation, to declare, that all Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should fo enter themfelves as aforefaid, should receive the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, as His Majefty's Royal Bounty: And whereas His Majefty was also graciously pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of the faid Month of February, 1793, to promife and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman, fit to ferve on board His Majefty's Ships, fhould be paid to any Perfon who fhould discover any Seaman or Scamen who might conceal him or themfelves, fo that fuch Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majefty's Service, on or before the Thirtieth Day of April then next, by any of His Majefty's Sca Officers appointed to raife Men on Shore, or by the Captains or Commanders of any of His Majefly's Ships or Veffels in the Ports or on the Coafts of this Kingdom : And whereas the Time limited by the faid Proclamations for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward, hath been prolonged and extended to the Thirty-first. Day of August next; and it being judged expedient for His Majefty's Service that the faid Bounties and Reward thould be continued to be paid for fome Time longer; His Majefty, with the Advice of 'His

His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward be prolonged and extended, from the faid Thirty-first Day of August next to the Thirty-first Day of October following: Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. 7 HEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Thirteenth of January laft, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, An--chors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, 'Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Twenty-fifth Day of this inftant July: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for fome Time longer; His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whofoever do at any Time, for the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid Twenty fifth Day of this instant July, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, any Pig Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors; Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, or thip or lade any of the Articles above mentioned on board any Ship or Veffel, in order .to transporting the fame into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permission being first had and obtained from His Majefty or His Privy "Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act, paffed in the Thirty-third Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to ena-\*\* ble His Majefty to reftrain the Exportation of Na-"\*\* val Stores, and more effectually to prevent the Ex-\* portation of Salt Petre, Arms and Ammunition, ." when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in " Council." But it is, neverthelefs, His Majefty's Pleafure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Majefty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Veffels or Boats, in the Service of His Majefty, or em-

ployed or freighted by His Majefly's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commissioners of His Majefty's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Veffel from taking or having on Board fuch Quantities of Naval Stores as may be necessary for the Use of fuch Ship or Veffel during the Courfe of her intended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being ; nor to the Exportation of the faid feveral Articles to Ireland; or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrisons, or to His Majelly's Colonies or Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the Britifh Settlements or Factories in the East Indies; provided that, upon the Exportation of any of the faid Articles, for the Purpofes of Trade, to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the Weft Indies, or to the Ifland of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of fuch Articlesdo first make Oath of the true Destination of the fame to the Places for which they shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the fame shall be made, and do give full and fufficient Security by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majefty's Cuftoms; to carry the faid Articles to the Places for which they are fo entered Outwards, and for the Purpofes fpecified, and none other; and fuch Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up, until Proof be made, to the Satisfac. tion of the faid Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commiffioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in fuch Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid Commissioners, shewing that the faid Articles have been duly landed at the Places for which they were entered Outwards. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majefly's Treafury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

THE Letter, of which the following is an Extract, was received from Colonel Graham, by the Right Honorable Lord Grenville, His Majefty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, dated Roveredo, July 4, 1296.

ON the 30th Ult. I had the Honor of informing your Lordship that the Enemy made an unfuccelsful Attack on Monte Baldo on the 28th; fince that all has remained quiet. Marshal Wurmfer arrived here this Morning.

#### Downing-Street, July 30, 1796.

THE Letter, of which the following is an Extract, was received from Lieutenant-Colonel Craufurd, by the Right Honorable Lord Grenville, His Majefty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, dated Head Quarters of His Royal Highnefs the Archduke Charles of Auftria, Eifingen, near Pfortzheim, July 11, 1796.

I Have the Honor to inform your Lordship, that, on the 7th and 8th Instants, the Archduke remained in the Possessing of Ettlingen, in order to give Time for the Arrival at Pfortzheim of the Saxons, who were advancing from Graben to reinforce His Royal Highness' Army; and the Corps that had been detached into the Mountains, under the Command of General Keim, to cover the Left, was ordered to take it's principal Position at Frawen Alb.

The Saxons reached Pfortzheim in the Night of the 7th. On the 8th the Difposition was made to attack General Moreau on the Joth, in the Polition of the Murg, at Raftadt, Kupenheim and Gertzbach, and, on the 9th, whilst the preparatory Movements were executing, in order to bring the Troops forward to the different Points from whence they were to advance the next Morning, the Enemy forced back the Archduke's Advanced Posts with a Part of their Army, whilft their principal Force attacked General Keim. His Royal Highness immediately fupported his Advanced Polts, and was victorious on his Right, and along his whole Front; but General Keim, after having made a most obstinate Resistance, was obliged to yield to the Superiority of Numbers, and he retired to Pfortzheim. The Saxons, who were in March to cover that General's Left Flank, did the fame; and, as this unfortunate Circumstance gave the Enemy Posseffion of all the Passes in the Mountains, on the Archduke's Left, His Royal Highnefs found himfelf under the Necessity of marching with his Main Army to Pfortzhiem, on the 10th, where he is now encamped.

The Auftrians loft on this Occafion about Sixteen Hundred Men and Four Pieces of Cannon. The Lofs of the French cannot be exactly afcertained, but it muft have been very confiderable.

but it must have been very confiderable. The Prince of Conde's Corps, which has behaved with great Bravery, was at Villingen on the 8th, the Date of the last Accounts that were received from it. The Austrian General Frolich still remained in the Brifgaw.

The Enemy has passed the Lahn, and the Army, which was left for the Defence of that Part of the Country; has retired to the Position of Bergen, having thrown proper Garrisons into Mayence and Ehrenbreitstein.

#### Extrast of a Letter from Captain James Athol Wood, Commander of His Majefty's Sloop Favorite, to Evan Nejean, Efg; dated Fort Royal Bay, Martinique, June 2, 1796.

Inclosed are fome Letters which I had no Opportunity to forward to Sir John Laforey before he left this Country, therefore transmit them for your Perufal.

#### Favorite, St. George's Bay, Grenada, February 17, 1796.

#### SIR,

SINCE I did myfelf the Honour of writing you on the 5th Inftant His Majefty's Sloop under my Command has captured Two French Privateers, and run one on Shore within the Bocas on the Ifland of Trinidada; at the fame Time the Alarm and Zebra captured a Privateer to Leeward of us, and retook Two Schooners. The Name of the largeft Privateer captured by the Favorite is the General Rigaud, of Eight Guns and Forty-five Men, moftly Italiane and Spaniards, a most desperate Set, without any Commission; the fmall one was lately the Hind Packet, taken off St: Vincent's. The Men jumped overboard and got afhore before we could take Poffession of the Hind. The Name of the Privateer run afhore is the Banan. I have the Honor to be, &c.

#### Favorite, St. George's Bay, Grenade, March 12, 1796.

SIR,

THREE Days ago, about Seven in the Morning, in His Majefty's Sloop under my Command, we fell in with Three of the Enemy's Cruizers to Windward of this Ifland; Two Schooners, one of Ten and the other of Twelve, and a Ship of Fourteen Guns, They at first bore down on us, but perceiving we did not alter our Courfe, they foon after hauled their Wind to the Southward: Light and baffling Winds prevented our getting alongfide of the Ship until Eleven at Night, when she furrendered without Refistance.

This Ship was the Sufanna of Liverpool, that had been taken only a few Days before, and was fitted and manned by the Enemy to cruize against the Trade of His Majesty's Subjects. The Two Schooners escaped under the Favor of the Night.

Having had about Seventy French Prifoners on Board the Favorite, I have taken upon me to diffribute them, to the Number of Two or Three, on Board of each of the Transports and Merchant Shipe homeward bound. The Officers I have put on Board the Charlotte Sloop, Lieutenant Williams, the Remainder I have put on Board the Prifon Ship at this Place.
