WHEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Thursday the Fifteenth Day of September next: We, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare Our Royal Will and Pleasure, That the said Parliament shall, on the said Fifteenth Day of September next, be held and sit for the Dispatch of divers weighty and important Affairs. And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens and Burgeses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required to give their Attendance accordingly at Westminster on the said Fifteenth Day of September next.

IT is this Day ordered by His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, That an Embargo be forthwith laid upon all Ships and Vessels, now within the Ports of this Kingdom, or which shall hereafter come into any of the said Ports, laden with any Goods or Merchandize taken on Board in this Kingdom, which are or may be bound to any of the Ports in the Territories of the Grand Duke of Tuscany, or in the Dominions of the Ecclesiastical State; and that the said Embargo do continue upon all such Ships and Vessels until the further Order of this Board. And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and the Lord War-
