#### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. THEREAS it has been represented to His Majefty at this Board, that in confequence of the Progress of the French Arms in the Territories of the Grand Duke of Tuscany, the Payment of Bills of Exchange, drawn or negociated in the Town of Leghorn, may be deemed unlawful, by virtue of the Provisions contained in an Act paffed in the Thirty-fourth Year of His Majefty's Reign, intituled, " An Act for preventing Money # or Effects in the Hands of His Majefty's Subjects, \* belonging to or difpofeable by Perfons refident in " France, being applied to the Ufe of the Perfons " exercifing the Powers of Government in France ; " and for preferving the Property thereof for the " Benefit of the individual Owners thereof;" and in an Act passed in the fame Seffion, intituled, "An " Act for more effectually preferving Money or " Effects in the Hands of His Majetty's Subjects, ... belonging to or difpofeable by Perfons refident in " France, for the Benefit of the individual Owners " thereof;" unlefs His Majefty shall licence the Payment of fuch Bills, in purfuance of the Powers given by the faid feveral Acts; His Majefty, taking

the fame into His Royal Confideration, is pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, That it shall be lawful for any Perfon refiding or being in Great Britain to pay any Bill drawn or indorfed in the faid Town of Leghorn, and Tent from thence on or before the Day on which the Armies of France entered the faid Town of Leghorn ; provided fuch Bill shall have been made payable at no greater Diftance of Time than Ufance of Three Months from the Date thereof, or Three Months from Sight thereof; provided alfo that all and every Perfon and Perfons, who shall take the Benefit of fuch Licence hereby granted, shall fo take the fame, upon Condition, that in cafe of any Proceeding, Criminal or Civil, under the Provisions of the faid Acts of Parliament, or either of them, for any Thing alledged to have been done costrary thereto, any Question shall arife, whether the Thing fo done was authorized by the Licence hereby given, the Proof that fuch Thing was done, under the particular Circumstances, and according to the fpecial Terms and Conditions required by this Order, shall lie on the Persons claiming the Benefit of fuch Licence. T is this Day ordered by His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, That an Embargo be forthwith laid upon all Ships and Vessels, now within which the Ports of this Kingdom, or which fhall hereafter come into any of the full Ports, laden with any Goods or Merchandize taken on Board in this Kingdom, which are or may be bound to any of the Ports in the Territorics of the Grand Duke of Tufcany, or in the Dominions of the Ecclefiaftical State, and that the full Embargo do continue upon all fuch Ships and Vefiels until the further Order of this Board. And the Right Honorable the Loids Commiffioners of the Admiralty, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the neceffary Directions herein as to them may refpectively appertain.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

7 HEREAS His Majefty was gracioufly pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Twenty-fixth Day of December, 1792, to promife and declare, that the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majefty's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed to every fuch Able and Oldinary Scaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the Twenty-eighth Day of February then following, enter themfelves to ferve in His Majefty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majefly's Ships or Veffels, or Officers employed on Shore for railing Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majefty was alfo gracioufly pleafed, by his faid Proclamation, to declare, that all Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should fo enter themselves as aforefaid, should receive the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, as His Majefty's Royal Bounty: And whereas His Majefty was also graciously pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of the faid Month of February, 1793, to promife and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman, fit to ferve on board His Majesty's Ships, should be paid to any Person who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who might conceal him or themfelves, fo that fuch Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's Service, on or before the Thirtieth Day of April then next, by any of His Majefty's 1

Sea Officeis appointed to raife Men on Shore, o by the Captains or Commanders of any of His Majefty's Ships or Veffels in the Ports or on the Coaits of this Kingdom : And whereas the Time limited by the faid Proclamations for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward, hath been prolonged and extended to the Thirty-first Day of August next, and it being judged expedient for His Majefty's Service that the faid Bounties and Reward should be continued to be paid for fome Time longer; His Majefty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward be prolonged and extended, from the faid Thirty-first Day of August next to the Thirty-first Day of October following Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council, HEREAS the Time limited by His Malefty's Order in Council of the Thirteenth of January last, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Mafts, Yaids, Bowfprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Twenty-fifth Day of this inftant July: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer, His Majefty doth therefore, with the Advice of H1s Privy Council, hereby order, require, piohibit and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whofoever do at any Time, for the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid Twenty fifth Day of this instant July, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Mafts, Yaids, Bowfprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, or hip or lade any of the Articles above mentioned on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the fame into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permifion being firft had and obtained from His Majefty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act, passed in the Thirty-third Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to ena-۶۰ ble

ble His Majefty to reftrain the Exportation of Na-" val Stores, and more effectually to prevent the Ex-" portation of Salt-Petre, Arms and Ammunition, "when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in " Council." But it is, nevertheles, His Majesty's Pleafure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Majefty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Veffels or Boats, in the Service of His Majefty, or employed or freighted by His Majesty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commissioners of His Majefty's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Veffel from taking or having on Board fuch Quantities of Naval Stores as may be necessary for the Use of fuch Ship or Veffel during the Course of her intended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being ; nor to the Exportation of the faid feveral Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrisons, or to His Majelty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the Weft Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the Britifh Settlements or Factories in the East Indics ; provided that, upon the Exportation of any of the faid Articles, for the Purpofes of Trade, to Ireland, or to His Majefty's Yards or Garrifons, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of fuch Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the fame to the Places for which they fhall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the fame shall be made, and do give full and fufficient Security by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majefty's Cuftoms, to carry the faid Articles to the Places for which they are fo entered Outwards, and for the Purpofes specified, and none other; and fuch Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up, until Proof be made, to the Satisfaction of the faid Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commiffioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in fuch Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid Commissioners, shewing that the faid Articles have been duly landed at the Places for which they were entered Outwards. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treafury, the Commissioners for

#### Whitehall, August 2.

As several Artificers and Manufacturers, Subjects of Great Britain, bave, from Time to Time, gone into Foreign Countries to exercise their several Callings, contrary to the Laws of these Kingdoms, the following Abstracts of Acts of Parliament of Their late Majestus King George the First and Second and of His prefent Mujesty, for preventing fuch Practices, are published, for the Information of all Persons who may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by Disobedience to them : And it will be observed, that fuch Penalties likewife extend to those who are any ways concerned or influmental in the Sending or Enticing Artificers or Manufacturers out of thefe Kingdoms,

Infiruments used by theth, as well as to the Artificers or Munufacturers themfelves.

#### Statute 5 George I. Chap. 27.

IF any Perfon shall contract with, entice, or folicit, any Artificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Braß, or other Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Atificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreign Countries out of the King's Dominions, and Ihall be convicted thereof, upon Indictment or Informa-tion in any of the Courts at Weitminster, or at the Affizes or Quarter-Seffions, he fhall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for the first Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Person having been once convicted shall offend again he shall be fined at the Discretion of the Court, and imprifoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid.

If any of the King's Subjects, being fuch Artificers, shall go into any Country out of His Majelty 's Dominions, to exercise or teach the faid Trades to Poleigners; and if any of the King's Eubjects in any luch Foreign Country, exerciling any of the faid Trades, shall not return into this Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambafiador, Minister or Conful of Great Bristain, in the Country where fuch Artificers shall be, or by any Perfon authorifed by fuch Ambaffador, &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from henceforth inhabit within this Realm ; fuch Perions shall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being as Executor or Administrator, or of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Descent, Devife or Purchafe, and shall forfeit all Lands, Goods, &c. within this Kingdom, to His Majefly's Ule, and shall be deemed Allen, and out of His Majefty's Protection.

Upon Complaint made, upon Oath, before any Juffice of Peace, that any Person is endeavour ing to feduce any fuch Artificer, or that any fuch Artificer hath contracted or is preparing to go out of His Majelly's Dominions, for the Purpoles aforefaid, luch juffice may fend his Warrant to bring the Perlon complained of before him, or before some other Justice; and if it shall appear by the Oath of one Withers, or by Confernion, that he was guilty of any of the faid Offences, fuch Justice may bind him to appear at the next Affizes or Quarter Sef-fions : And, if fuch Perfon shall refuse to give Security, the Juffice may commit him to Goal till the next Affizes of Quarter Seffions, and until he shall be delivered by due Course of Law. And if any fuch Artificer Inall be convicted, upon Indictment, of any fich Promile, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas, for the Purpole aforefaid, he fitall give fuch Security to the King not to depart out of His Majefly's Dominions, as fuch Court shall think reasonable, and shall be imprisoned till Security given.

If any of the above Offences shall be committed an Scotland, the fame shall be profecuted in the Court of Jufficiary, or the Circuits there.

Statute 23 George II. Chap. 13. JF any Perfon thall contract with, or endeavour to feduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cot-ton or Silk, or in Iron, Steel; Brafs, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer in any other of the Manufac-

Kingdoms, or in the Experiation of the Tools and tutes of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland, into any Foreign Coun-try not within the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, and shall be convicted, upon Indictment or Information, in the King's Bench at Weltminster, or by Indictment at the Affizes or General Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein fuch Offence shall be committed in England, or by Indictment in the Court of Jufficiary or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or by Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Dublin, if fuch Offence be committed in Ireland ; the Person so convicted shall, for every Ar-tificer contracted with, or seduced, forfeit FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, and shall suffer Imprifonment in the Common Goal of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted, for Twelve Calendar Months, and until Forfeiture be paid : And in Cafe of a fublequent Offence of the fame Kind, the Perfons fo again offending shall forfeit, for every Person contracted with or feduced, ONE THOUSAND POUNDS, and shall suffer Imprisonment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted, for Two Years, and until fuch Forfeiture be paid.

If any Perfon in Great Britain or Ireland thall put on Board any Ship or Boat, not bound directly to some Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to some other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, any fuch Tools or Utenfils as are commonly used in, or proper for the Preparing, Working up or Finishing of the Woollen or Silk Manufactures or any Part of fuch Tools, he shall, for every Offence, forfeit all fuch Tools, or Parts thereof, put on Board, and TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered by Action of Debt, &c. in any Court of Record at Weltminiter, or in the Court of Seffion in Scotland, or at any of the Four Courts in Dublin respectively, wherein no Effoin, &c. fhall be allowed.

It shall be lawful for any Officer of the Customs in Great Britain, or for any Officer of the Revenue in Ireland, to feize and fecure, in fome of His Majeffy's Warehouses, all fuch Tools or Utenfils prohibited to be exported, as fuch Officer shall find on Board any Veffel not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to fome other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain ; and all Tools fo feized stall, after Condemnation, be publickly fold to the beft Bidder; and one Moiety of the Produce shall be to the Use of His Majefly, and the other Moiety to the Officer who shall feize and fecure the fame.

If the Captain of any Veffel in Great Britain or Ireland knowingly permit any of the faid Tools, prohibited to be exported, to be put on Board his Veffel, he shall, for every fuch Offence, forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as the Penalties inflicted upon Perfons exporting the Tools; and, if the Veffel belongs to His Majefty, the Captain shall not only forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, but shall also forfeit his Employment, and be incapable of any Employment under His Majefty.

If any Officer of the Cuftoms in Great Britain. or of the Revenue in Ireland, take, or knowingly fuffer to be taken, any Entry outward, or fign any Cocket or Sufferance for the Shipping or Exporting of any of the faid Tools, or knowingly fuffer the fame to be done, he shall forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS.

POUNDS, to be recovered as aforefaid, and alfo forfeit his Office, and be incapable of any Office under His Majelly.

One Moiety of the Forfeitures shall be applied to the Ufe of His Majelty, and the other Moiety to the Ufe of the Perfon who fhall fue for the ! fame.

## Statutes 14, 21, 25 and 26 of His prefent Majefty. BY thefe Statutes the like Penalties and For-

feitures as above mentioned are extended to Perfons packing or putting on board any Veffel, not bound directly for some Port in Great Britain or Ireland, any Machine, Engine, Tool, Prefs, Paper, Utenfil or Implement whatfoever, ufed in or proper for the working or finishing of the Cotton, Steel or pron Manufactures of this Kingdom, or any Part or Parts of fuch Machines or Implements, or any Models or Plans thereof; and all Captains of Ships and other Perfons receiving or being in Poffeffion of any fuch Articles, with an Intent to export the fame to Foreign Parts, and all Cuftom houfe Officers fuffering an Entry to be made thereof, are refpectively liable to the like Penalties as are above mentioned, in the Cafe of Tools and Utenfils ufed in the Woollen and Silk Manufactures.

W Hereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that in Friday Evening the Stb Inflant, the Drvelling House of Sydenham Teast, Ejz; situate at Lawrence Weston in the County of Gloncoster, was attempted to be entered by a Party of Men, who had secreted themselves in the Shrubbery next the Lane leading to Lawrence Westun; that on Wednejday Afternoon, about Four o'Clock, some Person or Persons entered the Garden, with a View to secrete themselves, but being discovered made a precipitate Retreat; that upon the fame Night, about Eleven o'Clock, an Attempt was made by feveral Perfons to burft into the Back Door, but finding that they were refified from within, they defifted; that on Thur/day Evening, about Two o'Clock, Une of the Family was fired at in the Garden; and that on Saturday Morning, about Two o'Clock, an Attempt was again made to break through the Parlour Window of the faid Houfe.
