

Branch, Rail-Way, or Stone-Road, from the said intended Canal to a certain Colliery or Coal Works in the Parish of Burslem and Township or Hamlet of Sneyd, called the Sneyd Collieries; and also for making and maintaining one other collateral Branch or Cut, Rail-Way or Stone-Road, from the said intended Canal at or near Oakhull, between Draycott in the Moors and Tean, through Litley, and along the West Side of Cheadle Park, near to the Town of Cheadle, to Godley Brook, in the Parishes of Cheadle and Dillorn, in the County of Stafford; and also for extending the present Navigation of the River Trent near to and from the Town of Burton upon Trent, in the County of Stafford, to join and communicate with the Coventry Canal at Fradley Heath, in the Parish of Alrewas, in the said County of Stafford; and which Extension is intended to be effected partly by a Canal and partly by improving a Branch of the River Trent; and also for making a Reservoir for supplying the said Canal and collateral Cuts or Branches with Water, and which is intended to be made at or near Creswell Ford, in the Parish of Dillorn, in the County of Stafford, with a Cut-Feeder or Channel from the same to the said Canal or collateral Cuts or Branches, some or one of them; and also for making a Reservoir for Water in Drayton Park, in the Parishes of Tamworth and Drayton Bassett, in the County of Stafford, with a Cut-Feeder or Channel from the same, in order that the Whole of the said Water therein contained may flow into the said Coventry Canal at or near the Place where the said Coventry Canal unites with the Birmingham and Fazeley Canal, or into the said Birmingham and Fazeley Canal, on the same Pound with the said Coventry Canal, in order to supply the said Coventry Canal with as much or a larger Quantity of Water than what shall or may be taken out of the said Coventry Canal for the Use of the Branch or Cut from the River Trent at Burton upon Trent to the Coventry Canal at Fradley Heath; which said Canal, Branches, collateral Cuts, Rail-Ways or Stone-Roads, and Extension, Cuts, Feeders or Channels, are intended to pass into or through the several Parishes, Townships, Liberties, Hamlets, Precincts or Places of Ashby de la Zouch, in the County of Leicester, Church Gresley, Castle Gresley, Stanton, Stapenhill, Doveridge or Dubridge, in the County of Derby, Burton upon Trent, Burton Extra otherwise Bond End, Branston, Tatenhill, Newbold, Barton under Needwood, Wicknor, Alrewas, Fradley, Tamworth, Fazeley, Horninglow, Stretton, Rolleston, Tutbury, Fauld, Coton, Hanbury, Draycott in Hanbury Parish, Moorton, Marchington, Uttoxeter, Bramshall Leigh, Checkley, Lower Tean, Upper Tean, Totmonslow, Draycott in the Moors, Litley, Cheadle, Dillorn, Fosbrooke, Caverswall, Stoke upon Trent, Bucknall, Botteslow, Little Fenton, Great Fenton, Longton, Meir Lane End, Hanley, Shelton, Penkhull, Burslem, Sneyd, Woolstanton, Knutton, Tunstall, Newcastle under Lyme, Audley, Apedale, Halmar End and Madeley, in the County of Stafford; Wybunbury, Checkley, Doddington, Walgherton, Hough, Atherton, Acton, Austeron, Baddington, Edleston and Henhull, in the County Palatine of Chester; and also for making and maintaining all such other collateral Cuts, Branches, Rail-Ways or Stone Roads, from the said intended Canal,

as may be judged expedient, in or through the several Parishes, Townships, Liberties, Hamlets, Precincts, or Places above named, or any or either of them.
