

AT the Court at Weymouth, the 3d of September, 1796, P R Ε S Ε N Т, The KING's Moft Excellent Majefty in Council. 7 HEREAS an Act passed in the Thirty-third Year of His Majefty's Reign, intituled, " An Act more effectually to prevent, during the prefent War between Great Britain and France, * all traitorous Correspondence with, or Aid or " Affiltance being given to, His Majesty's Enemies." And another Act, paffed in the Thirty-fourth Year

of His Majefty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for "preventing Money or Effects, in the Hands of "His Majefty's Subjects, belonging to or difpofeable by Perfons refident in France, being applied to the Ufe of the Perfons exercifing the Powers of Government in France; and for preferving the Property thereof for the Benefit of the individual "Owners thereof."

And whereas another Act, paffed in the Thirtyfourth Year aforefaid, intituled, "An Act for more "effectually preterving Money and Effects, in the "Hands of His Majefty's Subjects, belonging to or "difpofeable by Perfons refident in France, for the "Benefit of the individual Owners thereof."

And whereas it is expedient that fuch Licence and Authority fhould be granted as is herein after given and granted; His Majefty, taking the fame into His Royal Confidention, is pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, by this Order, to grant, and accordingly, with fuch Advice, by this

Order, doth grant Licence, according to the Authority given by the faid Acts refpectively, or fome of them, to all Perfons refiding or being in Great Britain, either on their own Account or Credit, or on the Account or Credit or by the Direction of any other Perfon or Perfons whomfoever, or wherefoever refident or being, to fell, fupply, deliver or fend, for the Purpole of being fold, fupplied or delivered, and to agree to fell, supply, deliver or fend for such Purpofe, and either on their own Account or Credit, or on the Account or Credit or by the Direction of any other Perfon or Perfons whomfoever and wherefoever refident or being, to caufe or procure to be fold, fupplied, delivered or feat for fuch Purpofe'as aforefaid, or to authorize or direct any other Perfon or Perfons whomfoever, or wherefoever refident or being, to fell, fupply, deliver or fend as aforefaid; or to aid or affift in fo felling, fupplying, delivering, fending, or authorizing or directing to be fo fold, fupplied, delivered or fent; and also to buy or procure, or contract or agree to buy or procure, or caufe to be bought or procured, or authorize or direct any other Perfon or Perfons whomfoever, or wherefoever refident or being, to buy or procure, or to contract or agree to buy or procure, or aid or affilt in buying or procuring, or authorizing or directing to be bought or procured, any Goods, Wares, Merchandizes or Effects mentioned in the faid Acts, or any other Goods, Wares, Merchandizes or Effects, (except fuch as are herein after mentioned) whether of the Growth, Production or Manufacture of this

Kingdom, or of any Foreign Country, to or for the Use of any Persons residing in the Territories of the United Provinces, or in the Auftrian Netherland, or in any Part of Italy, or for the Purpole of being fent into any Part or Place within the fame refpectively.

Provided, neverthelefs; that all fuch Goods, Wares, Merchandizes and Effects be exported from this Kingdom, and in Ships or Veflels belonging to Perfons of fome State or Country in Amity with His Majefty, and that fuch Exportation be made under the usual Conditions and Regulations ; and that fuch Security be given by Bond, in fuch Penalty, by fuch Perfons, and in fuch Manner, as shall be directed by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, that the faid Goods, Wares, Merchandizes and Effects shall be exported to the Places proposed, and to none other; and that a Certificate shall be produced, within Six Months from the Date of the Bond, under the Hand of the British Conful or Vice-Conful refiding at the Port or Place at which fuch Goods or Commodities shall be landed; and if no Vice-Conful fhall be there refident, then under the Hands of Two known British Merchants refiding there; and if no British Merchants shall refide there, then under the Hand of the Chief Magistrate of the Place, testifying that the faid Goods have been all duly landed at that Port or Place:

Provided alfo, that nothing herein before contained shall be construed to licence the Exportation, Sale, fending, fupplying or delivering of, or in any Manner to relate to any Arms, Ordnance, Ordnance Stores, Gunpowder, Bullets, Pitch, Tar, Hemp, Mafts, Timber, Sailcloth, Cordage, Saltpetre, or any Naval or Military Stores whatfoever; nor to re-- late to any Store or Article whatfoever, intended for the Use of the Armies, Troops, Fleets, Ships or Veffels of the Enemies of His Majefty; or any Articles which are fpecially prohibited by any other Act or Acts of Parliament, other than the Acts before mentioned, to be exported, fold, fupplied or delivered as aforefaid; or in any Manner to affect the Provisions of any other Act or Acts of Parliament; or to licence or authorize the feveral Acts, Matters and Things aforefaid, further or otherwife than as the fame might be affected by the feveral before mentioned Acts of Parliament.

Provided alfo, that every Perfon who shall take the Benefit of this Licence and Authority, shall take the fame upon Condition, that if in cafe of any Proceeding, Civil or Criminal, under the Provisions of any of the Acts herein before mentioned, for any Thing alledged to have been done contrary thereto, any Queftion shall arife whether the Thing

done was authorized by the Licence hereby given. the Proof that such Thing was done under the Circumftances, and according to the Terms and Conditions of this Order, shall lie on the Perfons claiming the Benefit hereof.

And His Majefty, with the Advice aforefaid, is hereby further pleafed to order, that this Licence and Order shall remain and be in Force and Effect until the 25th Day of December next enfuing, unlefs the fame shall be fooner revoked.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

other Manner whatfoever, any Money to or for the Use of any Person or Persons refiding or being in any Part or Place of the United Provinces, the Auftrian Netherlands or Italy, or in any Town or Place in Germany; and alfo to accept, indorfe or undertake to be answerable for the Payment in the Whole, or in Part of any Bill of Exchange, Promiffory Note, Draft, Obligation, or Order for Payment of Money drawn, indorfed or negotiated, by or on Account or for the Use of, or on the Credit of, or on the Credit of the Effects of, any fuch Perion or Perions as aforefaid; and alfo to pay, or in any Manner fatisfy, any Bill of Exchange, Note, Draft, Obligation or Order for Money, in Part or in the Whole drawn, accepted or indorfed, or in any Manner negotiated in, or in any Manner fent from fuch Ports, Places or Towns as aforefaid, or any of them; or drawn, or accepted, or indorfed, or in any Manner negotiated, by or for the Ufe of, or upon the Credit of, or upon the Credit of the Effects of, such Person or Persons as aforesaid; and also to pay or fatisfy any Money of or belonging to any fuch Person or Persons as aforefaid, or to deliver or otherwife part with any Bills of Exchange, Promissory Notes, Drafts, Obligations, Orders for Money, Goods, Wares, Merchandizes or Effects of or belonging to any fuch Perfon or Perfons as aforefaid, although fuch Bills of Exchange, Promiffory Notes, Drafts, Obligations, Orders for Money or Securities for Money shall not be delivered, or parted with, for the Purpofes only of receiving and retaining the Money due thereon; and fuch Goods, Wares and Merchandizes shall not be delivered for the Purpofe only of felling the fame and converting the fame into Money, to be received and retained by the Perfon or Perfons fo felling the fame.

Provided that nothing herein contained shall be deemed or taken to authorize or licence any fuch Act, Matter or Thing, or Acts, Matters or Things as aforefaid, which shall be done or intended, directly or indirectly, for the Use or Service of the Government of France, or of the Perfons exercifing the Powers of Government in France; or to authorize or licence the feveral Acts, Matters or Things aforefaid, further or otherwife than as the fame might be affected by the feveral before mentioned Acts of Parliament.

Provided alfo, that every Perfon, who shall take the Benefit of this Licence and Authority, shall take the fame upon Condition, that if, in cafe of any Proceeding, civil or criminal, under the Provisions of any of the Acts herein before mentioned, for any Thing ailedged to have been done contrary thereto, any Queffion shall arife, whether the Thing done

was authorized by the Licence hereby given, the Proof that fuch Thing was done under the Circumstances and according to the Terms and Conditions of this Order shall lie on the Perfons claiming.

And His Majefty is further pleafed, with the Advice aforefaid, to order, and it is hereby ordered accordingly, that this Licence and Order fhall remain and be in Force until the Twenty-fifth Day of December next enfuing, unless His Majefty shall be pleafed fooner to revoke the fame.
