

Barnsley Canal.

NOTICE is hereby given, that Application is intended to be made to Parliament the ensuing Sessions for An Act to authorize the making a Reservoir or Reservoirs upon Gadding Moor and Lands in the several Townships of Hoylandswain, Gunthwaite, Cawthorne or Silkstone, in the Parishes of Silkstone and Penistone, in the West Riding of the County of York, or some of them, for the Purpose of better supplying the Barnsley Canal Navigation with Water; and also for altering, varying and amending an Act passed in the Thirty-third Year of his present Majesty's Reign, entitled, "An Act for making and maintaining a navigable Canal from the River Calder, in the Township of Warmfield cum Heath; to or near the Town of Barnsley, and from thence to Barnby Bridge, in the Township of Cawthorne, in the West Riding of the County of York, and certain Railways and other Roads to communicate therewith.

Chelsea Hospital, October 7, 1796.

THESE are, by Order of the Right Honourable the Lords and others, Commissioners for managing the Affairs of the Royal Hospital at Chelsea, to give Notice, that His Majesty has been pleased to command, that all Out-Pensioners belonging to the said Hospital, and residing in London, or within the Distance of Twenty-five Miles thereof, (except the Letter-Men and Cavalry, and those Men who, by the Hospital Books, appear to be more than Fifty-five Years of Age, or to have served Twenty-five Years in the Army previous to their Discharges, and those also who have lost an Eye or a Limb) do personally and regimentally appear at the said Hospital, on the Days under-mentioned and appointed for them respectively; when and where Attendance will be given, from Nine o'Clock in the Morning till Three in the Afternoon, and proper Officers will attend to examine them accordingly.

His Majesty has on this Occasion thought fit to declare his gracious Intention, that none of the Out-Pensioners, who on Examination may be found fit for the Duty, shall be required to serve any where but in the Invalid Corps; that every Man found fit for that Duty shall be entitled; on his Arrival at the Garrison to which he shall be sent, to receive a Bounty of One Pound Five Shillings, or so much thereof as shall remain after supplying him with proper Necessaries; and those, who on Examination are found unfit for Duty, shall be dismissed, with proportionate Subsistence to carry them back to their Homes, viz.

Monday, the 17th of October,
The Pensioners from the 1st and 2d Regiments of Foot Guards.

Tuesday, the 18th of October,
Those from the 3d Regiment of Foot Guards to the 10th Regiment of Foot, inclusive.

Wednesday, the 19th of October,
Those from the 11th Regiment, to the 35th Regiment of Foot, inclusive.

Thursday the 20th of October,
Those from the 36th Regiment of Foot to the 65th Regiment of Foot, inclusive.

Friday the 21st of October,
Those from the 66th Regiment of Foot to the 134th Regiment of Foot inclusive; as also the Pensioners from

Lord Strathaven's, Major Waller's, Major Elford's, and Major Fish's Corps; the Royal Garrison Battalion, Loyal Irish, Queen's Rangers, Fencibles in North Britain, Cinque Port and Lancashire Volunteers, with all the American and other Corps; likewise those from the reduced Regiments of Marines, those from the Independent Companies, those from the Militia, and those who have been In-Pensioners of Chelsea Hospital.

Lastly, it is further noticed, that all such of the said Out-Pensioners, (except such as are above excepted) who shall not appear at the said Hospital, in obedience to His Majesty's Commands, will be considered as otherwise provided for by Government, or dead, and will accordingly be struck off the Books of the said Hospital.
