PRESENT

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. T is this Day ordered by His Majesty, by and I with the Advice of his Privy Council, that an Order, made at this Board on the Third Day of September last, granting Licence, notwithstanding certain Acts passed in the Thirty-third and Thirtyfourth Years of His Majesty's Reign, and therein Amentioned, to pay, fend, fupply, or deliver, or caufe to be paid, fent, supplied, or delivered, either by Payment or Remittance, of any Bill of Exchange, Note, Draught, Obligation, or Order for Money, or in any other Manner whatfoever, any Money, to or for the Use of any Person or Persons residing or being in any Part or Place of the United Provinces, the Austrian Netherlands, or Italy, or in any Town or Place in Germany, and to do divers other Acts, in the faid Order particularly mentioned: And the Licence thereby given, and every Part thereof, be revoked and discharged; and the said Order, and the Licence thereby given, and every Part thereof, are hereby revoked and discharged. And all Persons are to take Notice of His Majesty's Pleasure hereby fignified, and govern themselves accordingly.

H IS Majefty doth hereby direct and require, that all the OUT-PENSIONERS of CHELSEA-HOSPITAL, refiding in South Britain, who were discharged from their respective Corps as

Corporals or Private Men (those resident in London, or within Twenty-sive Miles theteof, who are to attend at Chelsea on such Days as the Commissioners of the said Hospital shall appoint; the Out-Pensioners from the Cavalry; those Men also who by the Hospital Books are now more than Fifty-sive Years of Age, or had served Twenty-sive Years in the Army previously to their Discharges; and those who have lost an Eye or a Limb, excepted) do personally appear at the Places, and on the Days, hereinaster mentioned; that such of them, as on Examination shall be found sit, may be sent to Garrison Duty only, viz.

Kent and Surrey, (more than 25 Miles from London)
—Maidstone, 24th and 25th October; or Winchester 4th and 5th November.

Suffex-Lewes; 29th and 31st October; or Winchester, 4th and 5th November,

Hampshire—Winchester, 4th and 5th November, Berkshire and Oxfordshire—Oxford, 8th and 9th November.

Somersetshire—Bridgwater, 24th and 25th October; or Bristol, 28th and 29th October.

Wiltshire-Devizes, 1st and 2d November,

Dorsetsbire-Blandford, 5th and 7th November.

Devonsbire—Excter or Launceston, 24th and 25th October; or Barnstaple, 29th and 31st October.

Cornwall—Launceston, 24th and 25th October; or Truro, 29th and 31st October.

Gloucestersbire and Worcestersbire—Gloucester, 24th and 25th October; or Bristol, 28th and 29th October; or Birmingham, 29th and 31st October, and 1st November.
