PROCLAMATION for pardoning DESERTE RS War-Office, September 22, 1796.

WHEREAS it has been reprefented to the King, That there are at this Time feveral Deferters from the different Regular Corps in His Majeftyss Land Service, who might be induced to return to their Duty by an Offer of His Majefty's gracious Pardon, and that fuch an Inftance of his Royal Clemency would have a due Influence upon their future Behaviour;

His Majefty has been gracioufly pleafed, by his Order in Council, to grant his free Pardon to all Deferters from his Regular Land Forces, who fhall furrender themfelves, on or before the 10th Day of November next, to any of the Superintending Field Officers of the Recruiting Service, whole Stations are mentioned in the Margin hereof, or to the Infpector-General of the Recruiting Service at Chatham Barracks.

Such Deferters, if able-bodied Men and fit for Service, fhall be appointed to fuch Regiments as His Majefly may be pleafed to command; and fhall not be liable to be claimed by any other Corps to which they may formerly have belonged.

And whereas many of the faid Deferters may have enlifted in other Regular Corps, and are now ferving therein, His Majesty is graciously pleased to extend to fuch Deferters the Benefit of this Pardon; and to direct that they shall continue to ferve in the Corps wherein they now are, without being under the Neceffity of declaring themfelves Deferters, in order to entitle them to the Benefit of this Pardon; and they shall not be liable, at any future Time, to be claimed by the Regiments in which they formerly ferved : But this Claufe is not to extend to Deferters enlifted by the Corps raising Recruits for general Service; which Deferters are only to be entitled to their Pardon on declaring themselves at Chatham Barracks to be fuch, and being there transferred to fome established Regiment.

And whereas feveral of the faid Deferters have, been apprehended, and are now in Gaol, or in Regimental gimental Cuftody, His Majefty is likewife pleafed to grant them his free Pardon, of which they are to have the Benefit upon their Arrival under Efcort at Chatham Barracks, where they will be difposed of in the Manner above-mentioned.

Any Soldier who may defert after these His Majefty's gracious Intentions are made public, shall not be included in the above Pardon, but be proceeded against with the utmost Severity.

Admiralty-Office, Offober 13, 1796. Extract of a Letter from Sir Edward Fellew, Bart. Captain of His Majefty's Ship Indefatigable, to Evan Nepean, Elq; dated the 2d of October, 1796, off Cape Penas. HAving, by the Recapture of the Brig Queen of Naples from Lifton to Cork received later

I Naples from Lifbon to Cork, received Informa-tion of Two Schooner Privateers which infeft the Seas in the Neighbourhood of Corunna, and that One of them had, Two Days before, taken a valuable Brig from Brittol, laden with Bale Goods, which fhe fuppofed could not be arrived at her Deftination, which was Corunna, I immediately pulhed for that Port, and was happy enough this Day to capture One of the Schooners, the Ariel, of Bofton, from Bordeaux Fourteen Days, mounting Twelve Guns and 75 Men; the other Schooner, called Le Vengeur, of the fame Force, I am in great Hopes we inall meet with. The Briftol Brig, however, is, I hear, arrived at Ferrol, into which Port I have driven Two Frigates.

Extract of a Letter from Captain Mowat, of His Majefty's Ship Affiftance, dated Halifax, September 14, 1796, to Mr. Nepean.

I Have to acquaint you, for the Information of my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that on the 28th of last Month, about Four Leagues East South East from Cape Henry, the Thifbe, who had been fent to look out in the East North East Quarter, a little after Five in the Morning made the Signal for Three ftrange Ships being in the East South East. The Bermuda, who had been in Chace of a Brig the Evening before in that Quarter, and who was Seven or Eight Miles nearer the strange Ships than any of the Squadron, the Thifbe excepted, re-peated or made the Signal, that the Ships feen were Enemy's Ships; upon which the Admiral immediately made the Signal for a general Chace. The Squadron was then composed of the Flag-Ship, the Affistance, Thetis, Thilbe, Topaze, and Bermuda. So very light was the Breeze, and withal partial, that the Ships did not steer for some Time. The Topaze was the first that had the Breeze, the Thetis, being at some Distance from her, was the next, and the Flag-Ship foon after; the Affiftance, being to Leeward and aftern, did not obey her Helm before the Topaze was Eight or Nine Miles advanced, the Thetis and Refolution about Half that Diftance. The Squadron continued in Pursuit, and about Half past Five in the Evening the Topaze brought the nearest Ship to Action, upon which fhe returned a Broad-fide, and hauled down her Colours. The Bermuda being near, bore down to the Prize, and the Affiftance's Signal was made to take Possefilion of her. The Flag-Ship and the Frigates, without a Mo-ment's Loss of Time, continued in Chace of the other Two Frigates. The Admiral's verbal Message to me, by Captain Maxtone, was to proceed to Halifax with the Prize. Upon my taking Possefion of her, I found her to be L'Elifabeth, mounting Thirtyfix Guns, 24 Twelve-Pounders on her Main Deck, and 12 Nines on her Quarter Deck and Forecastle, a large Ship, faid to be about a Thoufand Tons.
