A PROCLAMATION,

For Pardoning such Deserters from His Majesty's Marine Forces as shall return into His Majesty's Service on or before the Thirty-first Day of December next.

GEORGE R.

WHEREAS it hath been represented unto Us, that there are at this Time several Deserters from Our Marine Forces, who might be induced to return to their Duty by an Offer of Pardon, and that such an Instance of Our Clemency might have a due Influence upon their future Behaviour, We have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to publish this Our Royal Proclamation, and do hereby promise Our most Gracious Pardon to all Deserters from Our Marine Forces, who shall surrender themselves on or before the Thirty-first Day of December next, to the Commanding Officers of the Chatham, Portsmouth or Plymouth Divisions of Marines; and We do hereby declare, that such Marines, so surrendering themselves as aforesaid, shall not be liable to be claimed by any other Corps to which they may have formerly belonged: And We do further declare, That Our said Pardon shall extend to such Deserters as have been apprehended, and are now in Gaol or Regimental Custody, upon their Arrival under Escort at Head Quarters. But We do hereby further declare, that any Marine Soldier who shall desert after these Our Intentions shall have been made publick, shall not be included in the Pardon above offered, but

shall, if found guilty by a Court Martial, be deemed unfit Objects of Our Royal Mercy.

Given at Our Court at St. James's, the Second Day of November, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-six, in the Thirty-seventh Year of Our Reign.

His Majesty is graciously pleased to declare, that every Man found fit for Duty shall be entitled, on his Arrival at the Garrison to which he shall be sent, to receive a Bounty of One Pound Five Shillings, or so much thereof as shall remain after supplying him with proper Necessaries; and those who, on Examination, are found unfit for Duty, shall be dismissed, with proportionate Subsistence to carry them back to their Homes.

And it is hereby further notified, that all Out-Pensioners in South Britain (except as aforesaid) who shall not appear at the Times and Places herein appointed, will be considered as otherwise provided off by Government, or as Dead; and they will accordingly be struck off the Books of the Out-Pension of the said Hospital, without any Prospect of being restored thereto.

PROCLAMATION for pardoning DESERTERS
War-Office, September 22, 1796.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the King, That there are at this Time several Deserters from the different Regular Corps in His Majesty's Land Service, who might be induced to return to their Duty by an Offer of His Majesty's gracious Pardon, and that such an Instance of his Royal Clemency would have a due Influence upon their future Behaviour;

His Majesty has been graciously pleased, by his Order in Council, to grant his free Pardon to all Deserters from his Regular Land Forces, who shall surrender themselves, on or before the 10th Day of November next, to any of the Superintending Field Officers of the Recruiting Service, whose Stations are mentioned in the Margin hereof, or to the Inspector-General of the Recruiting Service at Chatham Barracks.

Such Deserters, if able-bodied Men and fit for Service, shall be appointed to such Regiments as His Majesty may be pleased to command; and shall not be liable to be claimed by any other Corps to which they may formerly have belonged.

And

And whereas many of the said Deserters may have enlisted in other Regular Corps, and are now serving therein, His Majesty is graciously pleased to extend to such Deserters the Benefit of this Pardon; and to direct that they shall continue to serve in the Corps wherein they now are, without being under the Necessity of declaring themselves Deserters, in order to entitle them to the Benefit of this Pardon; and they shall not be liable, at any future Time, to be claimed by the Regiments in which they formerly served: But this Clause is not to extend to Deserters enlisted by the Corps raising Recruits for general Service; which Deserters are only to be entitled to their Pardon on declaring themselves at Chatham Barracks to be such, and being there transferred to some established Regiment.

And whereas several of the said Deserters have been apprehended, and are now in Gaol, or in Regimental Custody, His Majesty is likewise pleased to grant them his free Pardon, of which they are to have the Benefit upon their Arrival under Escort at Chatham Barracks, where they will be disposed of in the Manner above-mentioned.

Any Soldier who may desert after these His Majesty's gracious Intentions are made public, shall not be included in the above Pardon, but be proceeded against with the utmost Severity.

Copy of a Letter from Vice-Admiral Kinsmill, Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels at Cork, to Evan Nepean, Esq; dated on Board His Majesty's Ship Polyphemus the 29th of October. 1796.

S I R,

I Have the Satisfaction to acquaint you, for the Information of my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that the Purpose for which I ordered His Majesty's Ship Santa Margarita out on a Cruise, as stated in my Letter of the 19th Instant, has been most fortunately accomplished, by her capturing Two French Ship Privateers, and retaking One of their Prizes; Particulars of which will be seen in the accompanying Letters from Captain Martin.

Extract of a Letter from Captain Martin, of His Majesty's Ship Santa Margarita, to Vice-Admiral Kingsmill, dated at Sea the 24th of October, 1796.

I Have the Honor to inform you, that His Majesty's Ship under my Command has this Day captured a very fast sailing Ship Privateer, called Le Buoharparte, of 16 Guns and 137 Men: She has been Ten Days from Brest, and taken Three Vessels, as named in the Margin *.

Extract of another Letter from Captain Martin, of the Santa Margarita, to Vice-Admiral Kingsmill, dated the 27th of October, 1796.

ON the 25th Instant in the Morning we discovered Two Ships, that immediately made towards us, and approached nearly within hail before they observed the Santa Margarita to be a Frigate. They endeavoured to render the Retreat of one or the other secure, by standing on different Tacks, and I followed the largest, with little Prospect of taking the other; but Mr. Birchall, the First Lieutenant, him

with a Degree of Zeal and Intrepidity that does him the highest Honour, voluntarily offered to attack her in a Boat: At this Time our Shot had reduced her Sail, so as to enable the Boat to get alongside, and I had the Satisfaction to see her taken Possession of in a most gallant and Officer-like Manner. The Ship we followed struck her Colours, after having received a few Shot, and proved to be Le Vengeur, of 18 Guns and 110 Men, Twelve Days from Brest, and had only captured the Ship Potomah, from Poole, bound to Newfoundland, with Provisions and Merchandize, retaken by the Boat commanded by Lieutenant Birchall.

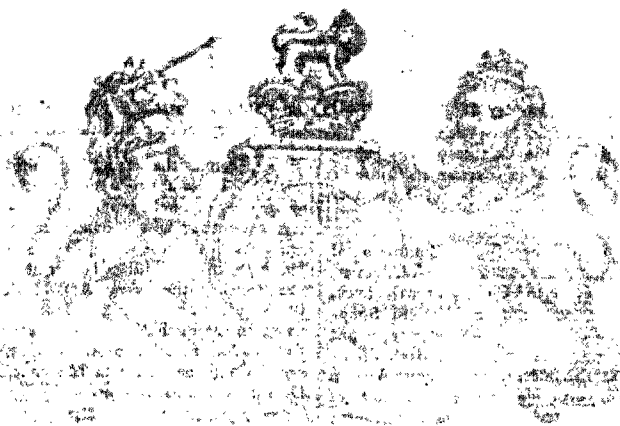
