A PROCLAMATION,

For Pardoning such Deserters from His Majesty's Marine Forces as shall return into His Majesty's Service on or before the Thirty-first Day of December next.

GEORGE R.

WHEREAS it hath been represented unto Us, that there are at this Time several Deserters from Our Marine Forces, who might be induced to return to their Duty by an Offer of Pardon, and that such an Instance of Our Clemency might have a due Influence upon their future Behaviour, We have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to publish this Our Royal Proclamation, and do hereby promise Our most Gracious Pardon to all Deserters from Our Marine Forces, who shall surrender themselves on or before the Thirty-first Day of December next, to the Commanding Officers of the Chatham, Portsmouth or Plymouth Divisions of Marines; and We do hereby declare, that such Marines, so surrendering themselves as aforesaid, shall not be liable to be claimed by any other Corps to which they may have formerly belonged: And We do further declare, That Our said Pardon shall extend to such Deserters as have been apprehended, and are now in Gaol or Regimental Custody, upon their Arrival under Escort at Head Quarters. But We do hereby further declare, that any Marine Soldier who shall desert after these Our Intentions shall have been made publick, shall not be included in the Pardon above offered, but

shall, if found guilty by a Court Martial, be deemed unfit Objects of Our Royal Mercy.

Given at Our Court at St. James's, the Second Day of November, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-six, in the Thirty-seventh Year of Our Reign.

His Majesty is graciously pleased to declare, that every Man found fit for Duty shall be entitled, on his Arrival at the Garrison to which he shall be sent, to receive a Bounty of One Pound Five Shillings, or so much thereof as shall remain after supplying him with proper Necessaries; and those who, on Examination, are found unfit for Duty, shall be dismissed, with proportionate Subsistence to carry them back to their Homes.

And it is hereby further notified, that all Out-Pensioners in South Britain (except as aforesaid) who shall not appear at the Times and Places herein appointed, will be considered as otherwise provided off by Government, or as Dead; and they will accordingly be struck off the Books of the Out-Pension of the said Hospital, without any Prospect of being restored thereto.

PROCLAMATION for pardoning DESERTERS.

War-Office, September 22, 1796.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the King,

That there are at this Time several Deserters from the different Regular Corps in His Majesty's Land Service, who might be induced to return to their Duty by an Offer of His Majesty's gracious Pardon, and that such an Instance of his Royal Clemency would have a due Influence upon their future Behaviour;

His Majesty has been graciously pleased, by his Order in Council, to grant his free Pardon to all Deserters from his Regular Land Forces, who shall surrender themselves, on or before the 10th Day of November next, to any of the Superintending Field Officers of the Recruiting Service, whose Stations are mentioned in the Margin hereof, or to the Inspector-General of the Recruiting Service at Chatham Barracks.

Such Deserters, if able-bodied Men and fit for Service, shall be appointed to such Regiments as His Majesty may be pleased to command; and shall not be liable to be claimed by any other Corps to which they may formerly have belonged.

And

And whereas many of the said Deserters may have enlisted in other Regular Corps, and are now serving therein, His Majesty is graciously pleased to extend to such Deserters the Benefit of this Pardon; and to direct that they shall continue to serve in the Corps wherein they now are, without being under the Necessity of declaring themselves Deserters, in order to entitle them to the Benefit of this Pardon; and they shall not be liable, at any future Time, to be claimed by the Regiments in which they formerly served: But this Clause is not to extend to Deserters enlisted by the Corps raising Recruits for general Service; which Deserters are only to be entitled to their Pardon on declaring themselves at Chatham Barracks to be such, and being there transferred to some established Regiment.

And whereas several of the said Deserters have been apprehended, and are now in Gaol, or in Regimental Custody, His Majesty is likewise pleased to grant them his free Pardon, of which they are to have the Benefit upon their Arrival under Escort at Chatham Barracks, where they will be disposed of in the Manner above-mentioned.

Any Soldier who may desert after these His Majesty's gracious Intentions are made public, shall not be included in the above Pardon, but be proceeded against with the utmost Severity.

I Am to acquaint you, for the Information of their Lordships, that La Victoire, French Schooner Privateer, carrying Six Carriage Guns and Four Swivels, with Sixty-five Men, arrived here this Morning, having been captured by His Majesty's Sloop Zebra (Captain Hurst) the 12th Instant, between Grenada and Tobago. This Privateer had been from Guadaloupe Eight Days, and had taken One Sloop laden with Provisions from Barbadoes to this Island, but she was recaptured by the Lapwing off Marigalante.

We have just gave you a Caution how we do intend act as soon as we can make it convenient, which we believe that it will be soon, so you may go on with it as fast as Possible, the faster you go on the better it will be for you, for we are determined to go forward with it as well as you and yours shall be in Flames you House and Machinery before you are two Months longer We are determined to do it and the rest of your Neighbours shall share the same fate if ever we catch them out a Town we will waite upon them and make them rue the Day that ever they was borned for they nor you shall never tell ho hurted them.
