SIR.

Am to acquaint you, for the Information of their Lordships, that La Victoire, French Schooner Privateer, carrying Six Carriage Guns and Four Swivels, with Sixty-five Men, arrived here this Morning, having been captured by His Majefty's Sloop Zebra (Captain Hurft) the 12th Inflant, be-tween Grenada and Tobago. This Privateer had been from Guadaloupe Eight Days, and had taken One Sloop laden with Provisions from Barbadoes to this Island, but she was recaptured by the Lapwing off Marigalante.
