Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that Mr. Paul Newman, of Melkham, in the County of Wilts, received, through the Post-Office of Westbury, an anonymous threatening Letter, of which the following is a Copy:

“ W. T. N. B. C. M. C. B.

“ Sir,

“ We have just gave you a Caution how we do intend act as soon as we can make it convenient, which we believe that it will be soon, so you may go on with it as fast as Possible, the faster you go on the better it will be for you, for we are determined to go forward with it as well as you and yours, shall be in Flames you House and Machinery before you are two Months longer We are determined to do it and the rest of your Neighbours shall share the same fate if ever we catch them out a Town we will waite upon them and make them rue the Day that ever they was borned for they nor you shall never tell ho hurted them.

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in writing and sending the said incendiary Letter above mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the Person who actually wrote the said Letter) who shall discover his, her or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
