

Whitehall, November 15, 1796.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that on Thursday Evening the 27th Ultime, between the Hours of Seven and Eight, William Horron, of the Parish of Dean, near the Town of Bolton, in the County of Lancaster, a young Man of about Eighteen Years of Age, being returning Home upon the King's Highway, from Bolton aforesaid, towards his Father's House near Dean Church, was most inhumanly murdered by some Person or Persons unknown, and afterwards thrown into a Ditch, near the said Highway, and that Four Guineas and a Half in Gold were taken from his Pockets.

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the inhuman Murder and Robbery above mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the Person who actually committed the Murder) who shall discover his or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
