The KING's Most Excellent Majetty in Council. THEREAS the Time limited by His Majefly's Order in Council of the 1fl of June last, for prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coaftwife, Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the 7th Day of December next: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition fhould be continued for fome Time longer; His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whatfoever (except the Mafter-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service) do, at any Time during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid 7th Day of December next, prefume to transport, into any Parts out of this Kingdom, of carry Coastwife, any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coastwife. without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty, or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act paffed in the Twenty-ninth Year of His late Majefty's Reign,

7 HEREAS the Time limited by His Majetty's Order in Council of the 1st of June laft, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts cur of this Kingdom any of the Wood called Lignum Vitæ, will expire upon the 10th Day of December next : And whereas it is judged expedient for His jesty's Service, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for fome Time longer ; His Majefty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council. hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whofoever do, at any Time. for the Space of Six Months, to commence from the

faid 10th Day of December next, export, or attempt to export, transport, carry or convey, or lade or lay on Board of any Ship, Veffel or Boat, in order to be exported, transported, carried or conveyed out of this Kingdom, any of the Wood called Lignum Vitæ, without Leave or Permiffion being first had and obtained from His Majetty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act paffed in the Thirty-fourth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Act for indemnifying " all Perfons who have been concerned in advising " or carrying into Execution an Order of the Lords " Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury respect-" ing the Exportation of Pot-Afhes or Pearl-Afhes; " for preventing Suits in confequence of the fame; " for authorizing His Majesty to prohibit the Ex-* portation or carrying Coaftwife of Pot-Afhes or " Pearl-Afhes, and for making further Provisions " relative thereto." But it is neverthelefs His Majefty's Pleafure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be confirued to extend, to prevent any Ship or Veffel from taking or having on Board any of the faid Wood called Lignum Vitæ, which may be necessary for the Ufe of the faid Ship or Veffel during the Courfe of her intended Voyage, nor to prevent the Exportation of the faid Wood called Lignum Vitæ to Ireland, or to His Majefty's Islands of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark or Man, or to His Majefty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies; provided that, upon the Exportation of the faid Wood called Lignum Vitæ to Ireland, or to His Majefty's Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark or Man, or to His Majefty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the Weft Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of the faid Wood called Lignum Vitæ do first make Oath of the true Defination of the fame to the Places for which it shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the fame shall be made, and do give full and fufcient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majefty's Customs, to carry the faid Wood called Lignum Vitæ to the Places for which it is fo entered Outwards, and none other ; and fuch Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made, to the Satisfaction of the faid Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time

to be fixed by the faid Commiffioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in fuch Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid Commiffioners, shewing that the faid Wood called Lignum Vitæ has been duly landed at the Places for which it was entered Outwards .- And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the neceffary Directions herein, as to them may refpectively appertain. As feveral Artificers and Manufacturers, Subjects of Great Britain, bave, from Time to Time, gone into Foreign Countries to exercise their several Callings, contrary to the Laws of thefe Kingdoms, the following Abstracts of Acts of Parliament of Their late Majestics King George the First and Second and of His prefent Majefly, for preventing Juch Practices, are published, for the Information of all Persons rubo may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by Disobedience to them : And it will be observed, that fuch Penalties likewife extend to those who are any ways conserned or instrumental in the Sending or Enticing Artificers or Manufacturers out of these Kingdoms, or in the Exportation of the Tools and Instruments used by them, as well as to the Artificers or Manufacturers themselves.

Statute 5 George I. Chap. 27.

TF any Perfon fhall contract with, entice, or folicit, any Artificer in Wool Iron Steel Brok or 1 any Artificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Atificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreign Countries out of the King's Dominions, and shall be convicted thereof, upon Indictment or Informa-tion in any of the Courts at Weftminfter, or at the Affizes or Quarter-Seffions, he shall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for the first Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Perfon having been once convicted shall offend again he shall be fined at the Difcretion of the Court, and imprisoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid.

If any of the King's Subjects, being fuch Artificers, shall go into any Country out of His Majesty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the faid Trades to Foreigners; and if any of the King's Subjects in any such Foreign Country, exercising any of the faid Trades, shall not return into this

Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambassador, Minister or Conful of Great Britain, in the Country where fuch Artificers shall be. or by any Perion authorifed by fuch Ainbaflador, &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from henceforth inhabit within this Realm ; fuch Perfons shall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being an Executor or Administrator, or of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Defcent, Devile or Purchafe, and shall forfeit all Lands, Goods, &c. within this Kingdom, to His Majesty's Ule, and shall be deemed Alien, and out of His Majesty's Protection.

Upon Complaint made, upon Oath, before any Jultice of Peace, that any Person is endeavouring to feduce any fuch Artificer, or that any fuch Artificer hath contracted or is preparing to go out of His Majefty's Dominions, for the Purpofes aforefaid, fuch justice may fend his Warrant to bring the Person complained of before him, or before fome other Juffice; and if it shall appear by the Oath of one Witness, or by Confession, that he was guilty of any of the faid Offences, fuch Justice may bind him to appear at the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions : And, if fuch Perfon shall refuse to give Security, the Juffice may commit him to Goal till the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions, and until he shall be delivered by due Courle of Law. And if any fuch Artificer shall be convicted, upon Indictment, of any fuch Promife, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas, for the Purpole aforefaid, he shall give fuch Security to the King not to depart out of His Majesty's Dominions, as such Court shall think reasonable, and shall be imprisoned till Security given.

If any of the above Offences shall be committed in Scotland, the fame shall be profecuted in the Court of Jufficiary, or the Circuits there.

Statute 23 George II. Chap. 13.

IF any Perfon shall contract with, or endeavour to feduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Coty ton or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Brass, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer in any other of the Manufactures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland, into any Foreign Country not within the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, and shall be convicted, upon Indictment or Information, in the King's Bench at Westminster, or by Indicament at the Affizes or General Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein fuch Offence shall be committed in England, or by Indictment in the Court of Jufficiary or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or by Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Dublin, if fuch Offence be committed in Ireland; the Perfon fo convicted shall, for every Artificer contracted with, or feduced, forfeit FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, and shall suffer Imprifonment in the Common Goal of the County or Stewartry wherein such Offender shall be convicted, for Twelve Calendar Months, and until Forfeiture be paid : And in Cale of a subsequent Offence of the fame Kind, the Perfons fo again offending shall forfeit, for every Person contracted with or seduced, ONE THOUSAND POUNDS, and shall fuffer Imprisonment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender fhall

shall be convicted, for Two Years, and until fuch Forfeiture be paid.

If any Perfon in Great Britain or Ireland thall put on Board any Ship or Boat, not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to fome other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Bri tain, any fuch Tools or Utenfils as are commonly ufed in, or proper for the Preparing, Working up or Finifhing of the Woollen or Silk Manufactures or any Part of fuch Tools, he fhall, for every Offence, forfeit all fuch I ools, or Parts thereoi, put on Board, and TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered by Aclion of Debt, &c. in any Court of Record at Weftminfler, or in the Court of Seffion in Scotland, or at any of the Four Courts in Dublin refpectively, wherein no Effoin, &c fhall be allowed.

It fhall be lawful for any Officer of the Cuftoms in Great Britain, or for any Officer of the Revenue in Ireland, to feize and fecure, in fome of His Majetty's Warehoufes, all fuch Tools or Utenfils prohibited to be exported, as fuch Officer fhall find on Board any Veffel not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to fome other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain ; and all Tools fo feized fhall, after Condemnation, be publickly fold to the bett Bidder; and one Moiety of the Produce fhall be to the Ufe of His Majefty, and the other Moiety to the Officer who fhall feize and fecure the fame.

If the Captain of any Veffel in Great Britain or Ireland knowingly permit any of the faid Tools, prohibited to be exported, to be put on Board his Veffel, he thall, for every fuch Offence, forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as the Penalties inflicted upon Perfons exporting the Tools; and, if the Veffel belongs to His Majefty, the Captain thall not only forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, but thall alfo forfeit his Employment, and be incapable of any Employment under His Majefty.

If any Officer of the Cuftoms in Great Britain or of the Revenue in Ireland, take, or knowingly fuffer to be taken, any Entry outward, or fign any Cocket or Sufferance for the Shipping or Exporting of any of the faid Tools, or knowingly fuffer the fame to be done, he fhall forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as aforefaid, and alfo forfeit his Office, and be incapable of any Office under His Majefty.

One Moiety of the Forfeitures shall be applied to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Use of the Person who shall sue for the fame.

Statutes 14, 21, 25 and 26 of His prefent Majefly.

BY these Statutes the like Penalties and Forfeitures as above mentioned are extended to Perfons packing or putting on board any Veffel, not bound directly for fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, any Machine, Engine, Tool, Prefs, Paper, Utenfil or Implement whatfoever, used in or proper for the working or finifning of the Cotton, Steel or pron Manufactures of this Kingdom, or any Part or Parts of fuch Machines or Implements, or any Models or Plans thereof; and all Captains of Ships and other Perfons receiving or being in Possefion of any fuch Articles, with an Intent to export the fame to Foreign Parts, and all Cuftom house

Officers fuffering an Entry to be made thereof, are refpectively liable to the like Penalties as are above mentioned, in the Cife of Tools and Utenfils ufed in the Woollen and Silk Manufactures.
