A^T the Court at St. James's, the 30th of November, 1796,

P R E S E N T, The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

7HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the 1fl of June laft, for prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwife, Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the 7th Day of December next: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer; His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whatfoever (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majefty's Service) do, at any Time during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid 7th Day of December next, prefume to transport, into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwife, any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the fame into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coaftwife, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty, or His Privy Council. upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act passed in the Twenty-ninth Year of His late Majefty's Reign,

intituled, " An Act to impower His Majefty to pro-" hibit the Exportation of Salt-Petre, and to enforce 5 the Law for impowering His Majefly to prohibit " the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of " Arms or Ammunition; and also to empower His " Majefty to reftrain the carrying Coaffwife of Salt-" Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Am-" munition :" - And the Right Hnourable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports; the Master-General of the Ordnance, and His Majefty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.
