E, taking into Our most ferious Confidera-tion the jult and neceffary War in which We are engaged, and putting Our Truit in Almighty God, that He will gracioufly blefs Our Arms, both by Sea and Land, have relolved, and do, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, hereby command, That a Publick Faft and Humiliation be observed throughout that Part of Our Kingdom of Great Britain called England, Our Dominion of Wales, and Town of Berwick upon Tweed, on Wednefday the Eighth Day of March next; that fo -both We and Our People may humble Ourfelves be-fore Almighty God, in order to obtain Pardon of Our Sins, and may, in the most devout and folemn Manner, fend up Our Prayers and Supplications to the Divine Majesty, for averting those heavy Judgments which Our manifold Sins and Provocations have most justly deferved; and imploring His Bleffing and Afliftance on Our Arms, and for reftoring and perpetuating Peace, Safety and Profperity to Us and Our Kingdoms: And We do frictly charge and command, That the faid Publick Fait be reverently and devoutly obferved by all Our loving Subjects in England, Our Dominion of Wales, and Town of Perwick upon Tweed, as they tender the Favour of Almighty God, and would avoid 'His Wrath and Indignation, and upon Pain of fuch Punifhment as We may juilly inflict on all fuch as contemn and neglect the Performance of fo religious and negefory a Dury. And for the better and more and neceffary a Duty. And for the better and more orderly folemnizing the fame, We have given Direc tions to the Moft Reverend the Archbishops, and the Right Reverend the Bishops of England, to compose a Form of Prayer fuitable to this Occasion, to be

A7E, taking into Our most ferious Consideration the just and neceffary War in which We are engaged, and putting Our Truft in Almighty God that He will gracioully blefs Our Arms both by Sea and Land, have refolved, and do, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, hereby command, That a Publick Fast and Humiliation be observed throughout that Part of Our Kingdom of Great Britain called Scotland, on Thursday the Ninth Day of March next; that so both We and Our People may humble Ourielves before Almighty God, in order to ob ain Pardon of Our Sins, and may, in the molt devout and fo'emn Manner, fend up Our Prayers and Supplications to the Divine Majetly, for averting those heavy Judgments which Our manifold Sins and Provocations have most justify deferved, and im-ploring His Blefling and Affiftance on Our Arms, and for reforing and perpetuating Peace, Safety and Profperity to Us and Our Kingdoms: And We do strictly charge and command, that the faid Publick Faft be reverently and devoutly observed by all Our loving Subjects in Scotland, as they tender the Favour of Almighty God, and would avoid His Wrath and Indignation, and upon Pain of fuch Punifhmene 186
