HEREAS His Majetty was gracioufly pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Twenty-fixth Day of December, 1792, to promife and declare, that the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for 11is Majefty's Service, fhould be paid in the Manner thereby directed to every fuch Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who fhould, on or before the Twenty-eighth Day of February then following, enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majefty's Ships or Veffels, or Otheers employed on Shore for railing Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His ivlajeity was also graciouity pleased, by his faid Proclamation, to declare, that all Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty five nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who flould fo enter themselves as aforefaid, thould receive the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, as His Majeity's Royal Bounty: And whereas His Majefty was allo gracioully pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of the faid Month of February, 1793, to promife and de-clare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Scaman, fit to ferve on board His Majefty's Ships, fnould be paid to any Perfon who fliould difcover any Seaman or Seamen who might conceal him or themfelves, fo that such Seaman or Seamen should be taken for ! His Majelly's Service, on or before the Thirtieth

that this Our Proclamation feen, ye forthwith pass to Sea Officers appointed to raise Men on Shore, or by the Captains or Commanders of any of His Majelty's Ships or Veffels in the Ports or on the Coafts of this Kingdom : And whereas the Time limited by the faid Proclamations for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward, hath been prolonged and extended to the Twenty-eighth Day of this instant February; and it being judged expedien: for His Majesty's Service that the faid Bounties and Reward should be continued to be paid for some Time longer; His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward be prolonged and extended, from the faid Twenty eighth Day of this inftant February to the Thirtieth Day of April next inclusive :- Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Twentyeighth Year of the Reign of His present Majefty, intituled, "An Act for regulating the Trade " between the Subjects of His Majelly's Colonies and Plantations in North America and in the-" West India Islands, and the Countries belonging " to the United States of America, and between " His Majefty's faid Subjects and the Foreign Iflands " in the Welt Indies," it is, amongst other Things, enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty in Council, by Order or Orders to be iffued and published from Time to Time, to authorize, or by Warrant or Warrants, under His Sign Manual, to impower the Governor of Newfoundland for the Time being to authorize, in cafe of Necessity, the Importation into Newfoundland of Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, from any of the Territories belonging to the faid United States, for the Supply of the Inhabitants 'and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the then enfuing Seafon only; provided always, that fuch Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, to authorized to be imported into the Island of Newfoundland, shall not be imported except in conformity to fuch Rules, Regulations and Reftric-tions as thall be fpecified in fuch Order or Orders, Warrant or Warrants, respectively, and except by British Subjects and in British-built Ships owned by His Majelty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law. And whereas it is expedient and necessary that Provision be made for fully supplying the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the enfuing Seafon, with Bread, Flour, In-dian Corn and Live Stock; His Majefty doth thereupon, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order and declare, That, for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the enfuing Seafon only; Bread, Flour, Indian Corn and Live Stock be imported into the faid Island from any of the Territories belonging to the faid United States, by British Subjects, and in British-built Ships owned by His Majelly's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, and which shall, within the Space of Day of April then next, by any of His Majetty's Seven Months previous to the Time of fuch Importation;

portation, have cleared out from fome Port in Great Britain, or fome other Port of His Majesty's Dominions in Europe, for which Purpose a Licence shall have been granted by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Cultoms in England or Scotland, or the Commissioners of His Majetty's Revenue in Ireland, or any other Perfon or Perfons who may be duly authorized in that Kingdom respectively, in the Manner and Form herein after mentioned ; which Licences shall continue and be in Force for Seven Calendar Months from the Day of the Date upon which they are respectively granted, and no longer; provided that no fuch Licence as aforefaid, granted after the Thirtieth Day of September, One Thoufand Seven Hundred and Ninety-feven, shall be of any Force or Effect : And His Majesty is hereby fur-ther pleased to order, That the Master, or Person having the Charge or Command of any Ship or Vessel to whom such Licence shall be granted, shall, upon the Arrival of the faid Ship or Veffel at the Port, Harbour or Place in the Island of Newfoundland where he shall discharge such Bread, Flour, Indian Corn and Live Stock, deliver up the faid Licence to the Collector or other proper Officer of the Customs there, having first indorsed on the Back of fuch Licence the Marks, Numbers and Contents of each Package of Bread, Flour, or In-dian Corn, and the Number of Live Stock, under the Penalty of the Forfeiture in the faid Act mentioned. And the Collector or other proper Officer of the Cuftoms at Newfoundland is hereby enjoined and required to give a Certificate to the Maller, or Perfon having the Charge or Command of fuch Ship or Vellel, of his having received the faid Licence, fo indorfed as before directed, and to transmit the fame to the Commonstead of H.s Majesty's Cultoms in England or Scotland, or to the Commillioners of His Majefty's Revenue in Ireland, respectively, by whom such Licence was granted.

Now be it known that the faid [Perfon's Name] hath Licence to lade on board the faid Ship [Sbip's Name], at and from any Port or Place belonging to the United States of America, Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, the Produce of the faid United States, and no other Article whatfoever, and to carry the faid Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock to fome Port or Place in the Ifland of Newfoundiand; and on the Arrival of the faid Ship at any Port, Harbour, or Place of Difcharge in Newfoundland, the Mafter, or Perfon having the Charge or Command of the faid Ship is required and enjoined to deliver up the faid Licence to the Collector or other proper Officer of His Majefly's Cultoms there, and to indorfe on the Back thereof the Marks, Numbers, and Contents of each Package of Biead, Flour, or Indian Corn, and the Number of Live Stock, and fhall thereupon receive a Certificate thereof from the faid Collector or other proper Officer of the Cuftoms.

Licence to import Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, the Produce of the United States of America, into Newfoundland. W. F.

Whitehall, February 25.

As feveral Artificers and Manufacturers, Subjects of Great Britain, bave, from Time to Time, gone into Foreign Countries to exercise their feveral Callings, contrary to the Laws of thefe Kingdoms, the following Abstracts of Acts of Parliament of Their late Majesties King George the First and Second and of His prefent Mujesty, for preventing such Practices, are published, for the Information of all Persons who may be ignorant of the Penalities they may incur by Disobedience to them: And it will be observed, that such Penalities likewise extend to those who are any ways concerned or instrumental in the Sending or Enticing Artificers or Manufacturers out of these Kingdoms, or in the Exportation of the Tools and Instruments used by them, as well as to the Artificers or Manufacturers themselves.

Statute 5 George I. Chap. 27.

IF any Perfon shall contract with, entice, or folicit, any Artificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Atificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreign Countries out of the King's Dominions, and shall be convicted thereof, upon Indictment or Information in any of the Courts at Westminster, or at the Assister or Quarter-Sessions, he shall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for the first Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Perfon having been once convicted shall offend again he shall be fined at the Difcretion of the Court, and imprisoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid.

If any of the King's Subjects, being fuch Artificers, fhall go into any Country out of His Majefty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the faid Trades to Foreigners; and if any of the King's Subjects in any fuch Foreign Country, exercifing any of the faid Trades, fhall not return into this Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambassador, Minister or Conful of Great Britain, in the Country where fuch Artificers shall be, or by any Person authorised by fuch Ambassador, &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from henceforth herceforth inhabit within this Realm; fuch Perfons shall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being an Executor or Administrator, or of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Descent, Devise or Purchase, and shall forfeit all Lands, Goods, &c. within this Kingdom, to His Majesty's Use, and shall be deemed Alien, and out of His Majesty's Prosection.

Upon Complaint made, upon Oath, before any Justice of Peace, that any Person is endeavouring to feduce any fuch Artificer, or that any fuch Artifice hath contracted or is preparing to go out ofsteis Majefly's Dominions, for the Purpoles aforefaid, such juitice may fend his Warrant to bring the Perfon complained of before him, or before fome other Justice; and if it shall appear by the Oath of one Witnefs, or by Confession, that he was guilty of any of the faid Offences, fuch Justice may bind him to appear at the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions : And, if fuch Perfon fhall refuse to give Security, the Justice may commit him to Goal till the next Aflizes or Quarter Seffions, and until he shall he delivered by due Courfe of Law. And if any fuch Artificer shall be convicted, upon Indictment, of any fuch Promile, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas, for the Purpole aforefaid, he shall give fuch Security to the King not to depart out of His Majelly's Dominions, as fuch Court shall think reasonable, and shall be imprisoned till Security given.

If any of the above Offences shall be committed in Scotland, the fame shall be profecuted in the Court of Justiciary, or the Circuits there.

Statute 23 George II. Chap. 13."

IF any Perfon shall contract with, or endeavour to feduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cot-ton or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer in any other of the Manufactures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland, into any Foreign Coun-try not within the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, and shall be convicted, upon Indictment or Information, in the King's Bench at Weftminster, or by Indictment at the Assizes or General Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein fuch Offence shall be committed in England, or by Indictment in the Court of Jufficiary or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or by Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Dublin, if fuch Offence be committed in Ireland; the Perfon fo convicted shall, for every Ar-tificer contracted with, or feduced, forfeit FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, and thall fuffer Imprifonment in the Common Goal of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted, for Twelve Calendar Months, and until Forfeiture be paid : And in Cale of a subsequent Offence of the same Kind, the Persons to again offending shall forfeit, for every Person contracted with or feduced, ONE THOUSAND POUNDS, and fhall fuffer Impriforment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted, for Two Years, and until such Forfeiture be paid.

If any Perfon in Great Britain or Ireland fhall put on Board any Ship or Boat, not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to fome other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, any fuch Tools or Utenfils as are commonly ufed in, or proper for the Preparing, Working up | Chancery.

or Finishing of the Woollen or Silk Manufactures or any Part of such Tools, he shall, for every Offence, forseit all such Tools, or Parts thereof, put on Board, and TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered by Action of Debt, &c. in any Court of Record at Westminster, or in the Court of Session in Scotland, or at any of the Four Courts in Dublin respectively, wherein no Ession, &c. shall be allowed.

It fhall be lawful for any Officer of the Cuftoms in Great Britain, or for any Officer of the Revenue in Ireland, to feize and fecure, in fome of His Majelly's Warehoufes, all fuch Tools or Utenfils prohibited to be exported, as fuch Officer fhall find on Board any Vefiel not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to fome other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain ; and all Tools fo feized fhall, after Condemnation, be publickly fold to the beft Bidder ; and one Moiety of the Produce fhall be to the Ufe of His Majefty, and the other Moiety to the Officer who fhall feize and fecure the fame.

If the Captain of any Veffel in Great Britain or Ireland knowingly permit any of the faid Tools, prohibited to be exported, to be put on Board his Veffel, he fhall, for every fuch Offence, forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as the Penalties inflicted upon Perfons exporting the Tools; and, if the Veffel belongs to His Majefty, the Captain fhall not only forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, but fhall alfo forfeit his Employment, and be incapable of any Employment under His Majefty.

If any Officer of the Cuftoms in Great Britain or of the Revenue in Ireland, take, or knowingly fuffer to be taken, any Entry outward, or fign any Cocket or Sufferance for the Shipping or Exporting of any of the faid Tools, or knowingly fuffer the fame to be done, he fhall forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as aforefaid, and alfo forfeit his Office, and be incapable of any Office under His Majefty.

One Moiety of the Forfeitures shall be applied to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Use of the Person who shall sue for the fame.

Statutes 14, 21, 25 and 26 of His prefent Majefty.

BY thefe Statutes the like Penalties and Forfeitures as above mentioned are extended to Perfons packing or putting on board any Veffel, not bound directly for fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, any Machine, Engine, Tool, Prefs, Paper, Utenfil or Implement whatfoever, ufed in or proper for the working or finifhing of the Cotton, Steel or pron Manufactures of this Kingdom, or any Part or Parts of fuch Machines or Implements, or any. Models or Plans thereof; and all Captains of Ships and other Perfons receiving or being in Poffeffion of any fuch Articles, with an Intent to export the fame to Foreign Parts, and all Cuftom houfe. Officers fuffering an Entry to be made thereof, are refpectively liable to the like Penalties as are above mentioned, in the Cafe of Tools and Utenfils ufed in the Woollen and Silk Manufactures.
