Have the Honor to acquaint you, for the Information of my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty; that His Majesty's Sloop Scourge, under my Command, at Haif past Twelve P. M. on the 21st Instant, the Land bearing N. E. by E. distant Five or Six Leagues, captured, after a Chace of Three Hours, a French Privateer called Le Furet, pierced for Fourteen but only mounting Ten Guns, having the other Four in her Hold. She had on Board, when taken, Fifty Men, besides Twenty-two English Prisoners, Seven of whom were wounded; she is commanded by Benoish Giron, had been Twenty Days from L'Orient, is coppered, and a fast Sailer:
