of the Line, and an Account of the Killed and Wounded in His Majesty's Ships, as well as in
those taken from the Enemy. The Moment the
latter (almost totally dismasted) and His Majesty's
Ships the Captain and Culloden are in a State to
put to Sea I shall avail myself of the first favourable
Wind to proceed off Cape St. Vincent in my Way
to Lifbon.

Captain Calder, whose able Assistance has greatly contributed to the Publick Service during my Command, is the Bearer of this, and will more particularly describe to the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty the Movements of the Squadron on the 14th, and the present State of it.
