ward Mands, dated off Port D'Espagne, in the Gulph of Paria, February 21, 1797, to Mr. Nean, Secretary of the Admiralty, of which the following is a Copy:

SIR,

I Have the Honor to acquaint you, for the Informa-I tion of their Lordfhips, that it having been de-termined an Attack fhould be made on the Ifland Trinidad, both with a View to that Colony, and to the Spanish Squadron which had been there for some Time paft, the Troops intended for this Expedition from Martinique were accordingly embarked in the Ships of War and Transports, and I failed from Fort Royal Bay the 12th Instant, with the Ships and Veffels of His Majefty's Squadron under my Command, as per Margin *. Lieutenant-General Sir Ralph Abercromby embarked with me in the Prince of Wales.

The Invincible had previoufly failed for Barbadoes, with Two Transports, to embark a Part of the 14th Regiment, and the Thorn and Zebra were ordered to receive the Detachment from Tobago. The Favorite was fent to St. Vincent to collect fome Troops from that Island, and the Whole were ordered to rendezvous at the Island of Cariacou, One of the Grenadines, on or before the 13th; and, on my Arrival at that Island, the 14th, I found all the Snips and Transports were affembled.

Ôn the 15th, in the Morning, I failed with the Squadron and Transports, passing between Cariacou and Grenada; and on the 16th arrived off Trinidad, and ftood toward the Gulph of Paria, when, having passed through the Great Bocas Channel, at Half past Three in the Afternoon, the Spanish Squadron were discovered at Anchor in Shagaransus Bay, confitting of Four Sail of the Line, under the Flag of a Rear Admiral, and One Frigate.

As the Day was well advanced before I approached the Bay, and the Enemy appeared in Strength on Gafparaux Island, which commanded the Anchorage, by Batteries erected for that Purpofe, I ordered the Arethufa, Thorn, and Zebra, to proceed a little farther up the Gulph, and anchor with all the Transports. The Alarm, Favorite, and Victorieuse were ordered to keep under Sail above the Transports during the Night, and prevent any Vef-fels failing from Port Espagne.

In the Evening, just before Datk, I anchored with the Ships of the Line in Order of Battle, oppofite the Enemy's Squadron, within Random-Shot of their Ships and Batteries, and in conftant Readinefs

| to prevent their Escape during the Night, which F fulpected they might attempt, as all their Sails were bent, and they appeared perfectly ready for failing.

At Two o'Clock in the Morning of the 17th we discovered One of their Ships on Fire, and foon after Three others, all of which burnt with great Fury until near Daylight, when they were entirely confumed. One of them having elcaped the Con-flagration, the Boats were fent from the Squadron, and the was brought out without having received any Damage.

I have great Satisfaction in acquainting their Lordships, that this Squadron of the Enemy, commanded by Rear-Admiral Don Sebaitian Ruiz de Apodaca, were deftroyed or captured according to the Lift I herewith enclose; and although this Service was effected without any other Act, on the Part of His Majesty's Squadron under my Command, than being placed in such a Situation as to prevent their Escape, I am fully convinced that, had, they remained at their Anchorage until the next Day, the Officers and Men whom I have the Honor to command would have completed, by their Exertion and Zeal, the Capture of the Whole, notwithflanding the Advantage of their Situation, under the Cover of about Twenty Pieces of Cannon and Three Mortars, which were mounted on Gasparaux Island, and had been placed there for the fole Pur-pole of defending the Ships in the Bay: That Island, which, like the Ships, had been abandoned. during the Night, was taken Posseffion of foon after. Day-light by a Party of the Queen's Regiment.

General Abercromby, early in the Morning, joined the Arethufa, and the Troops were all landed, in the Course of the Day, under the Direction of Captain Wolley, covered by the Favorite Sloop, about. Three Miles from the Town, without Oppolition: The General took Poffeffion of the Town the fame Evening, and the 18th the Governor defired to capitulate for the whole Island, and the Articles were agreed to, and figned the fame Day; a Copy of which I herewith transmit *.

Captain Harvey, of His Majefty's Ship Prince of Wales, will have the Honor to deliver this Difpatch, from whom I have always experienced the greatest Zeal and Attention to His Majesty's Service.
